

Howdy Everyone.

Christmas is that time of year when we brighten the cold and darker days with bright and colorful lights, when we enliven dark evergreen branches with beautiful, shiny decorations, when we resurrect relationships we let slip or hearts that we have hurt with gifts of renewing love or notes of caring, when we lift our sagging winter souls by singing joyful songs of the coming of our Lord. Christmas is the season when we remember that God loved the world so much that God became one of us to shine the light of love and grace into a world filled with the darkness of hatred, fear, and aloneness.

This need for light being brought into the darkness is highlighted in the familiar Christmas text from Isaiah 9:2:

“The People walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.”

The time to which the prophet Isaiah wrote was filled with impending doom. He wrote to the 10 northern tribes in what had become known as Israel (the southern tribes were Judah). There had not been one good and godly king since the death of Solomon (over a century and a half before). God’s judgment was coming and it wasn’t going to be pretty. The Assyrian war machine was growing in power and scope and Israel was a pawn in their way, a convenient stepping stone to the southern powerhouse, Egypt. Darkness.

The days at the coming of Jesus were dark days as well. The Romans had created an “Occupy Israel” movement and had won. The new power had military forces to keep the natives under control and economic forces to collect the taxes that would keep their political power in place. The once proud people were wounded and they looked for a deliverer from their darkness. They looked for a “Great Light.”

How powerful it must have been to those of his time when Jesus declared: “I am the light of the world. Whoever fol-

lows me will never walk in darkness (even in the midst of military occupation) but will have the light of life.” (John 8:12) My guess is that most folks who heard those words thought their political deliverer had come, that Jesus was going to step up to the plate, organize the people, and drive the Romans from the homeland. Israel would once again be an independent, free, sovereign state.

As we come to the end of this year I observe that independent, free, and sovereign states provide no guarantee that we are or will walk in the light. In our freedom we can look around us and see many who are living with

Living in freedom where we can pursue “Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness” does not necessarily guarantee that we will be walking in the light. Jesus said, “If the son makes you free, you will be free indeed” John 8:36.

During times of darkness we need to walk with and in Jesus Christ who is the light. As we walk with him we need to always remember that he also told his disciples that “You are the light of the world.” We who walk in the light need to reflect that light through word and deed for there are many who still walk in darkness and need to see that great light.

Advent is here. It is a time of waiting and anticipation. We remember how desperately the world needs Jesus as we await the coming of the Christ. We are to prepare our hearts for this great event. But... how many of us actually do this? Would we describe the Christmas season as a time of waiting... of hoping... and of preparing our hearts? I think most of us would describe the Christmas season as a time of being busy... rushing around town... getting our shopping done... baking cookies... putting up decorations... preparing for family to visit... and the list goes on. While all those things may be good, have we taken the time to prepare our hearts for the great news that God is with us? Have we taken a moment to stop and reflect... to pray... to read Scripture... to meditate quietly... to focus ourselves on the true meaning of Christmas?

Don't let this Advent season pass you by... don't let Christmas day come and go without preparing your heart for the hope that

is found in Christmas. Be intentional. Ask Pastor Paul or Pastor Ben for some ideas.



Unfinished Business for 2011

Each year, about a third of our annual offerings budget is received in December. In 2010, a total of \$902,000 was collected for the Annual Fund -- \$300,000 (33%) in the last month of the year. We planned our 2011 Annual Fund Offerings Budget at \$900,000 in light of the continuing weak economy. At the middle of November this year, we were \$300,000 (33%) short of achieving our goal.

The good news is: If we do as well this year as we did last year, we will exceed budget. The challenge is obvious - we need to do well! We very much appreciate all your support.

We will provide weekly updates in the Sunday bulletins on our progress as we approach year end.

DECEMBER DEACONS



I'm Linda Walker, in January, 2006 I was ordained as a Deacon. Being a Deacon is so many things: an honor, a commitment, a joy, a leap of faith, growing in the Lord. being willing to serve Him and others... What a journey I have been on and encourage each of you, if asked to be a Deacon to prayerfully and strongly consider it in the future. Serving Communion in the Presbyterian Church is also a privilege extended to members ordained as Deacons, Elders and of course the Pastors; a humbling experience which has filled me to the core with gratitude.

A Deacon's term is 3 years with the opportunity to continue, as I have, for another 3 years. After that, a Deacon must step down. Deacons serve the members of the congregation by acting as a communication link between Flock members and the Church. Contacting Flock members frequently throughout the year via cards, emails, phone calls, keeps the Flock members informed about activities of the church. Just as important is the Flock Member staying in touch with his/her Deacon, especially when life throws a curve ball - a special need, prayer request, pending hospitalization, need for meals, transportation, monetary help. Deacons are here to serve and support the congregation. With the "old" Deacons stepping down and the "new" Deacons coming in, Flocks will be redistributed in 2012. It is our hope that your Deacon will be someone you know, but if not, embrace making a new friend at PCJH!

During my 6 years as a Deacon, I have stepped out in faith taking on leadership roles and participating in various volunteer activities at PCJH. I didn't always feel comfortable in those roles, but God never failed me and I truly learned how to rely on Him for wisdom and direction. As my term comes to an end, I will no longer be a Deacon, but I will be involved at PCJH. AGROS UPDATE

Since the PCJH commitment to Agros was approved by Session last month your Mission Vision Team has been diligently working to determine which Agros village would fit best with the mission calling of PCJH. As further evidence that there is often no straight path in determining the Lord's plans for us, we (along with Session) have decided that this calling is in Nicaragua rather than Guatemala.

There are a number of reasons why we have chosen the village of Tierra Nueva in Nicaragua. It is the newest Agros project and it encompasses 1302 acres which will be home for 150 families. Tierra Nueva is strategically located near three other Agros communities in the Matagalpa region to maximize marketing and training opportunities. A large river and several springs flow on the property, providing water for domestic use and up to 70 acres of irrigated land for growing nontraditional crops. Previous agricultural activities on the land included raising cattle and growing coffee, sugarcane and basic grains.

Projects planned for the 2011 - 2012 fiscal year include:

- *Forming personal growth groups to work on values such as tolerance, respect for diversity, human rights, and community living
- *Gender equality workshops for the whole community
- *Implementing soil conservation techniques for land stewardship
- *Construction of fifty new houses and installation of drinking water systems
- *Establishing two grocery stores and a bakery to provide basic needs for the families and develop a stronger local economy

The PCJH Vision Team, after careful investigation and prayerful consideration, feels that Tierra Nueva is the best fit for PCJH to establish a deep and meaningful long term mission relationship through Agros. Some of the advantages are:

- *PCJH would be a partner in this new village from the start and thus will be able to experience the full Agros development model.
- *The trip logistics are favorable.
 - *Tierra Nueva is located about 105 miles or 4 hours from Managua
 - *Private bus transportation will be provided avoiding the need for PCJH participants to drive
 - *We can fly into Managua from Jackson the same day as there is an acceptable hotel across the street from the airport. This will eliminate the need for the Houston overnight involved with Guatemala trips.
- *The culture is less indigenous with fewer dialects and Spanish as the primary language.

We are now moving forward with planning the first Service Trip in April. The exact dates have not yet been confirmed but it appears that it will occur during the 3rd or 4th week of April. If you are interested in participating in this trip please plan to attend an information session on **Sunday, December 11th at 11:30 AM** or **Wednesday, December 14th at 5:15 PM**. Participation in the trip is limited to 14 adults so please don't miss one of these sessions.
