Howdy Everyone.

Pandora bracelets are a new trend on an old theme, charm bracelets. Worn on the wrist, they are visual reminders of special events that have taken place in the life of the person who is wearing it. The charm may represent a vacation or the special interest or skill of a child. It may be a reminder of a special day shared with a special friend. The charm may represent the hope of something yet to come, a place to visit, an experience to share.

Visual reminders are all around us and we incorporate them into our lives. This is wedding season in Jackson Hole and we are a destination wedding location. As I celebrate two people joining their lives together in holy marriage they exchange rings, visual reminders of the vows they have shared, the commitments they have made.

Traffic signs are another visual reminder of something important, directions. We who live in Jackson Hole become accustom to where we are going and how we need to get there. What seems obvious to us can at times be confusing to those who are unfamiliar. We look past the signs with which we have become so familiar and we need to be patient with those who are seeking direction.

The fourth of July is filled with wonderful reminders. The annual parades remind us that we are a community of people who proudly benefit from the freedom envisioned and won by our founding fathers. The flag reminds us of the growth we have made from 13 colonies to 50 states and I that the 50 states are one nation. The Music Festival performance puts to music the grandeur of the celebration. The fireworks create a visual image of those words from our national anthem from Francis Scott Key, "the rocket's red glare, the bombs bursting in air, gave proof through the night that our flag was still there..." Visual reminders are I only as good as the memory they reflect and the renewal of the commitment to the relationship they produce. If the relationship is broken or gone dormant then the charm is either put away or causes pain. If a marriage isn't healthy then the ring reminds one of bondage and not love and

commitment. If signs are ignored then our transportation system becomes confused and dangerous. If our freedom has become self-centered focusing on my pleasure, my opportunities, my rights, then we can easily forget that with freedom comes responsibility and that responsibility must work for the best of the whole or a nation will be divided.

Worship is a reminder placed in our lives by God. When we gather we are reminded that we are to have no other gods before the One, true, God. When we sing praises, we are reminded that in the midst of all that clamors for our attention there is only one that deserves our ultimate praise. When we confess our sins we agree with God that we fall short of God's direction and if it were not for God's grace we would be cut off from his life giving presence. When we pray for one another we are reminded that our family extends far beyond biology and that we are joined with many others by God in whom "we live and move and have our being."

When we listen to the Word of God read, sung, and spoken we are reminded that there is direction given by God to help us live each and every day. When we present our tithes and offerings we are reminded to give thanks to the One from whom all blessings flow. When we are commissioned to Go and serve we are reminded that our purpose in living is not simply bread on our table but the sharing of our God's blessing, through word and deed, with a world that continues in great need. Worship is a reminder of who and whose we are.

When we celebrate Independence Day and live to the fullest this summer in Jackson Hole, may the signs that fill our lives remind us that we are "...One nation, under GOD, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

The only rules were that we needed to stick together in small groups with an adult, and come back having eaten a full meal. I encourage you to ask our high school students about this experience, as there were some amazing stories! Each morning and evening was devoted to praising God and reflecting on Scripture and our daily experiences. It was a rich week of fellowship, spiritual growth. service, and witness to God's transforming power. We all came home exhausted (in a good way) and excited for how God is calling us to continue to serve those who are in need right here in Jackson Hole. Many thanks to our amazing adult volunteers.
