Dear PCJH Family,

Addie, Nina and I just returned from Nicaragua with our PCJH service team. It was an INCREDIBLE trip!! I'd love to share some highlights with you...

Nicaragua Highlights

This was my fourth trip going to Central America with Agros since 2005. This was my second trip to Tierra Nueva, the village PCJH has partnered with. Last time I went was three years ago. Wow how things have changed!! The villagers have been working hard with Agros' direction and have accomplished some amazing things together. Here are a few things that have changed since three years ago... there is now a road into the village; there is potable water; there are beautiful homes and gardens and flowers; there are latrines at every house; there is a school; there are thriving crops; there are smiles on people's faces full of joy. I am so proud of PCJH and that we have partnered with an exceptional development organization such as Agros. The gospel is not only preached in words but in deeds as the cycle of generational poverty is being broken. Amen!!

I loved witnessing the relationships that have formed among the villagers and our PCJH congregation. They have pictures of people from PCJH in their homes. There are "Live Like Karen" stickers in almost every house. Many villagers asked me... "How are Bob and Debbie? How is Wes doing? Michael? Caryn? Kathy?" Our relationship with the people of Tierra Nueva is an extension of our PCJH family.

We brought our daughter Nina (5) and Vivian Barrett (6). These two girls were champs!! I was so impressed with how they engaged the other children of Tierra Nueva and didn't let language be a barrier. They spoke the language of love and laughter. I will forever remember images of Nina walking hand in hand with her new friends in the village. I hope this trip encourages other parents and children from PCJH to go on mission together as a family.

Our time in Nicaragua was incredibly healing for me as we remembered the anniversary of Karen Colclough's death. The villager's love, concern, and prayers for us were incredible. They gave us a tremendous gift that was waiting for us as we arrived at the village. They had a professional artist from Matagalpa paint a gigantic portrait of Karen. It is absolutely beautiful! Some women in the village put their limited resources together to pay for the portrait. What a gift of love!!

The trip renewed my passion and commitment for the work of God through Agros. I encourage you all to take a week and go to Nicaragua if you are able. It will impact your life in profound ways. 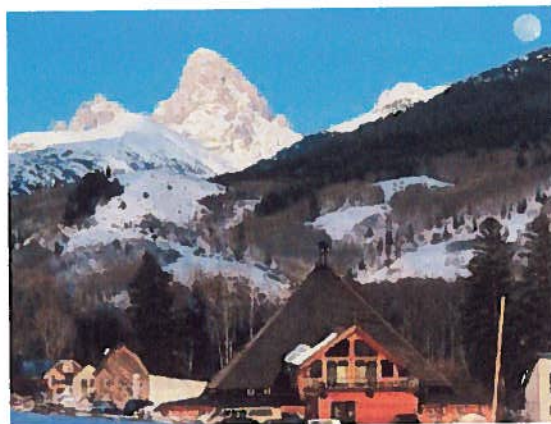

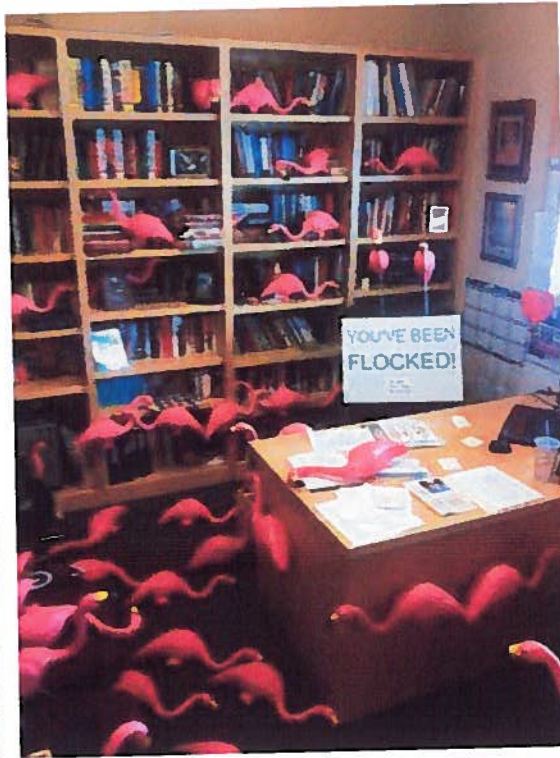

As we wrote in the September 2014 Pinnacle, we have been exploring the use of the land that the church owns.

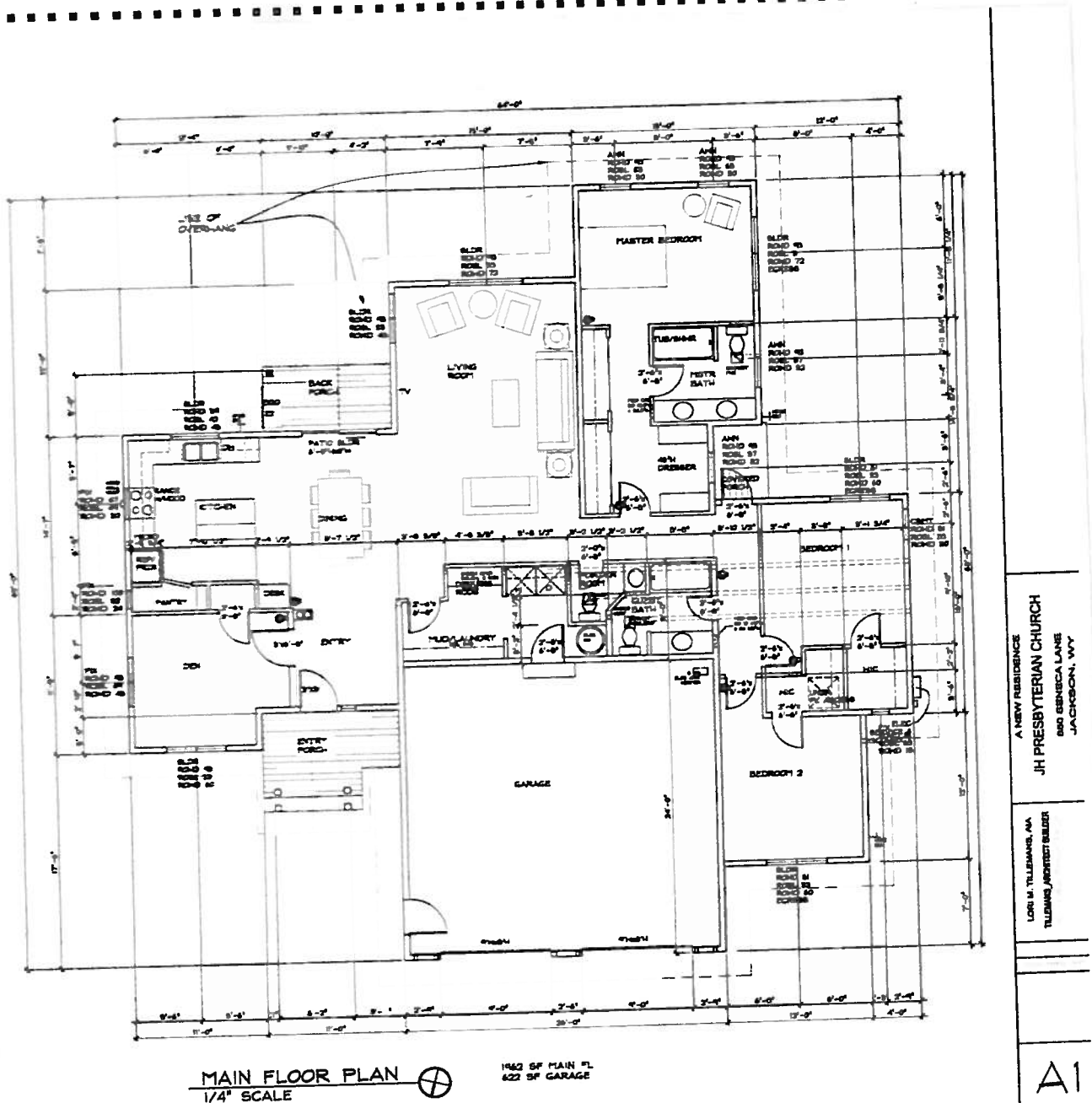

At its meeting on April 21, Council approved the building of a house on the lot behind the sanctuary in Indian Trails. This will be our second house or "manse", as Pastor Ben and his family live in a manse in Rafter J.

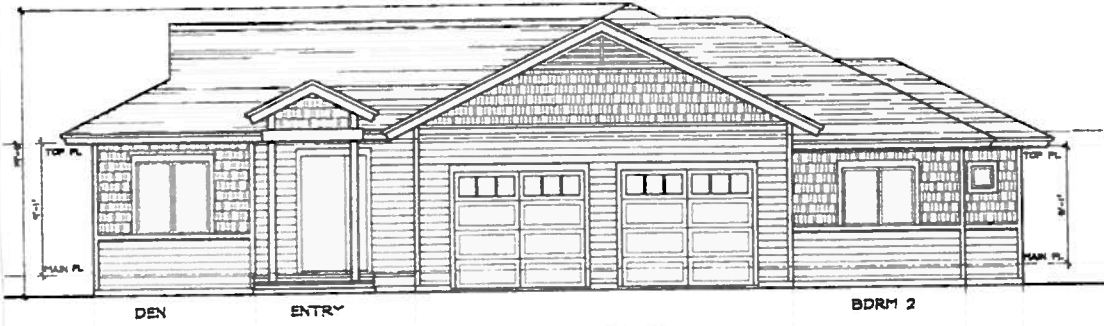
Please see the floor plans and the exterior elevations.

Due to the benevolence of the Sullivan family and the inclusion of PCJH in their estate plans, the house can be built for cash, without any long-term debt financing.

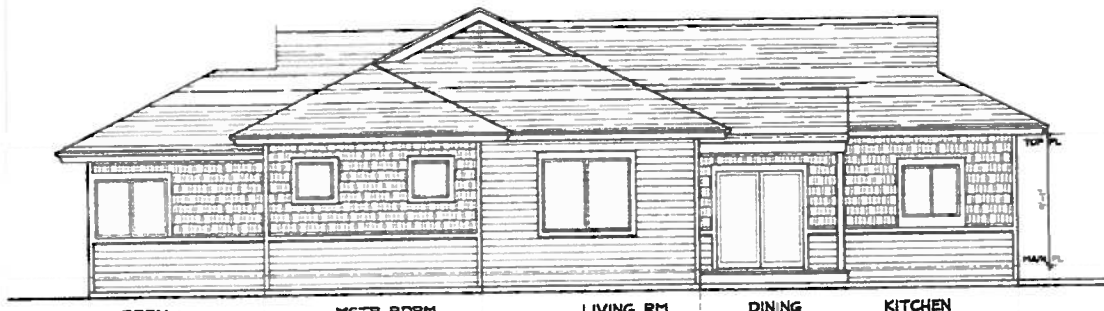
Previously, we were tasked with exploring the possible uses of the approximate four acres of land we own on the east side of the parking lot. That project has been put on hold to a later time.

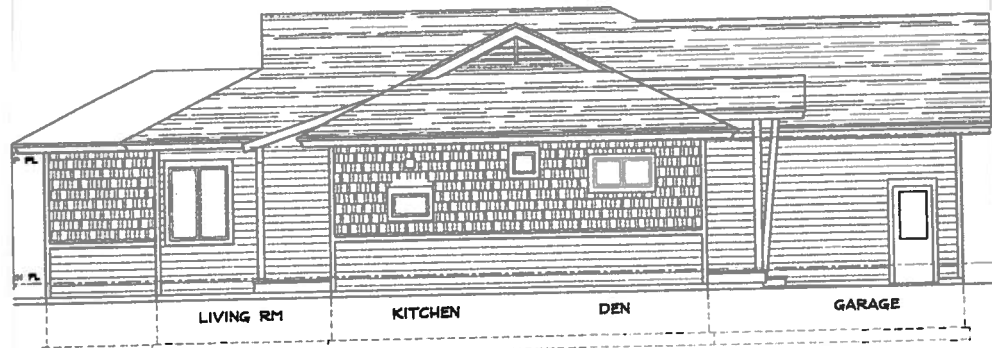




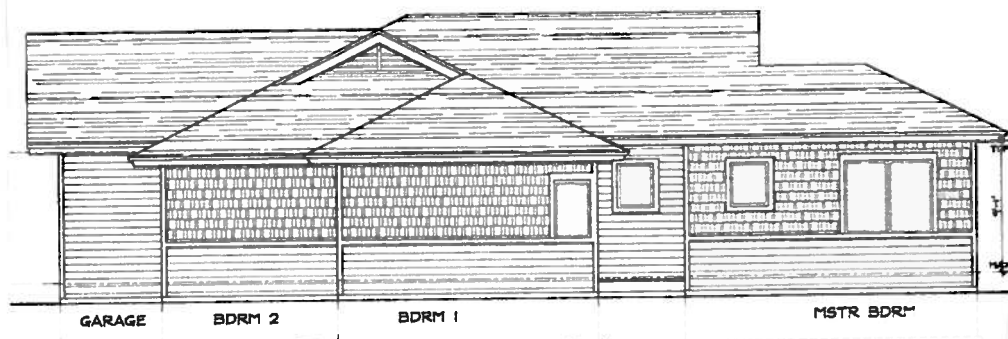
NORTH ELEVATION

Lessons from the Villagers

This was my third trip to the Agros village of Tierra Nueva, though it's been two and a half years since I was last there. While I'd heard of all the progress from each team that's returned, I was blown away to see it in person! Watching a village transform from dreams and determination into homes, roads, and a school is nothing short of awe-inspiring. While the physical structures now present in this beautiful village are amazing,



it's the less tangible things that are sticking in my heart today. The Holy Spirit was weaving themes throughout our time in Tierra Nueva, encouraging me to listen and learn, both from the villagers and from my teammates. This is my attempt to capture these themes in words!

Familia- Ask anyone who's been to Tierra Nueva, and they will tell you the villagers embrace us as family. This time I felt I was able to reciprocate this more fully because we had several families on our team, including two families with

children! For me, bringing my daughter, Nina, to Tierra Nueva was a transformative experience. I found great joy in watching her run hand in hand along the paths with the other little girls. While they didn't speak the

same verbal language, they all knew the languages of play, love, adventure, and joyful giggling. And these were more than enough for ample communication! Occasionally I'd catch the eye of another mom, and we'd smile at one another, knowing that what binds our children together also binds us together. I pray this experience will shape Nina's sense of family to include all of God's sons and daughters, no matter race, or social status. For it is when we view people as family that we begin to have compassion for them the way Jesus tells us to.



Satisfy- We enjoyed sharing a meal one day in the home of a man named Vladimir. While parts of Vladimir's story are indeed filled with heartache, he said something that really struck me. He said, "It has been my dream to own my own land. And that dream has come true." His dream is not for fancy cars or designer clothes or luxury vacations. It's for something that lasts far longer- a healthy life and a hope for the future. You see, for the rural poor in Latin America, land ownership is a chance to step out of poverty. Instead of living in a mode of immediate survival, they are able to find long-term stability and lasting satisfaction. The Agros model is a parallel in many ways to the story of Jesus. Jesus tells us he is the bread of life and that whoever comes to him will never be hungry; those who believe in him will never be thirsty. I don't know about you, but this is the satisfaction I want in my life. Fulfilling immediate desires is fleeting; satisfaction that comes from trusting and knowing the Lord lasts forever.

Engage- I have so enjoyed watching the Monday morning women's covenant group from PCJH engage the women of Tierra Nueva through sharing the same devotional, *Jesus Calling*, in their respective languages. Donna Barrett led a time with the women, sharing a letter from the PCJH group to the Tierra Nueva group. Toward the end, many of the women shared meaningful prayer requests as well as several return letters! It's a beautiful thing to witness this special connection between these two groups of women. Of note, this is the group that spearheaded the creation of the painting of Karen Colclough. They engaged by entering into the pain of the loss of Karen, and decided to do something to show how much they care for those of us still

suffering grief and loss. In what way do each of us need to engage in life more fully?



Power of Presence- This is the essence of Agros' Journey With a Village program. This was PCJH's 7th trip to Tierra Nueva. Even though I understood the concept intellectually on the earlier trips, I felt like I experienced it to a fuller degree this time. This trip was less intensive in regards to work projects, and more intensive on sharing time and experiences together as a community. Many of you alumni know and love Fransisco, a delightful grandfatherly man whose eyes dance when he speaks and love and joy literally ooze out of his very being. With the excitement of a child on Christmas morning he proudly gave us a tour of

his land, pointing out coffee plants, seedlings, irrigation systems and more. His delight was not found in having our team complete work for him, but rather in showing us the work he was able to do, thanks to the support of PCJH and Agros. As Ben put it, it's kind of like when you have family or close friends come visit. You wouldn't say, "Thanks for coming. Please mend my fence, clean my house, and build me a garden shed." In the same way, we are welcomed into the village as dear ones, and our friends in Tierra Nueva want to use the precious few days to share their lives with us in fellowship. I have felt challenged to practice the power of presence in my life back at home. Putting the brakes on my focused and busy agenda to play that game with my daughter, visit that friend who's having a rough time, or allowing the course of my day to be altered by someone in need. These are the things that truly make a difference.

May we all learn to love each other as family, find lasting satisfaction through our hope in Christ, engage fully with those around us, and learn to practice the power of presence. Viva- por Cristo!

A WORD FROM ASSOCIATE PASTOR STEVE WEBER

That's Ecclesiology!

Pastors, I suppose, invest much of their consciousness in contemplation on the nature of the church. Judging by the vast volumes of books, articles, journals, blogs, conferences and conversations given over to what theologians like to call "ecclesiology" much of the Christian world is also consumed with understanding the inner workings of the Church. The word itself comes from a secular Greek term that simply defined is a public assembly – *ekklesia*. The New Testament writers picked the word up to fit what was happening with early gatherings of the followers of Jesus. The term is used both to designate the local church and the universal church such as in Ephesians: "*And He (God) has put all things under His (Christ) feet and has made Him the head over all things for the church (ecclesia), which is His body*" (1:22-23).

So we often talk about who we are as the body of Christ, the living expression of His mercy in the world today. That's us! The Church! Scholars and common believers have studied the nature of the church in hopes of understanding its unique place in the hearts and lives of believers. One author, in his search of the New Testament, found 96 images of the church. We are: the salt of the earth; a letter from Christ; branches of the vine; the bride of Christ; exiles; ambassadors; a chosen race; the holy temple; children of God; a new Creation; friends of God; and many more. We often voice our faith with the Apostles' Creed and conclude by saying we believe in the "holy, catholic church," meaning that the church is separated for service to God (holy), and we belong to the universal movement of followers of Jesus in the world (catholic). That's ecclesiology!

20th century theologian Karl Barth swamped the Christian world with his monumental work, a virtual library itself, called Church Dogmatics. Next time you are in Ben's office ask him to point out his complete set of Barth's major contribution to how we think about what it is we do and believe as the church. Barth's firm belief in an active, living, breathing community of faith is expressed well in this sentence: "*The Church is when it takes place that God lets certain people live as his servants, his friends, his children, the witnesses of the reconciliation of the world with Himself as it has taken place in Jesus Christ, the preachers of the victory which has been won in His over sin and suffering and death, the heralds of His future revelation in which the glory of the Creator will be declared to all creation as that of his love and faithfulness and mercy*" (Church Dogmatics IV.1. p. 650). Now, that's a sentence! Long, but I like it. We are- each of us – preachers of the victory. Heralds – one and all – of His future revelation. And – without exception – we are God's friends.

Everybody has an ecclesiology. Everybody has a vision of what the church is all about. Just yesterday, a couple came out of our worship service, shook my hand and said, "The love of God is so real here." That's ecclesiology. The church is an ambassador of God's pure heart for people. In the early church the one trait that stuck out was just this very attribute. "*This is how everyone will recognize that you are my disciples—when they see the love you have for each other*" (John 13:35, The Message).

This month we welcome back many of our "snowbird" friends in Christ. Like family returning home, it will be great to see them all again, even if we must listen to reports of how cold it was at night in Arizona. We still love you guys! This month we also have a class going called Love Does based on a book by the same name. I'm excited to be in conversation with many of you about how God's love in us shapes our actions. Further, the men of PCJH are retreating this month over a weekend just to connect more fully with one another and have a little fun together.

Being a church has changed my life. Our ecclesiology really matters. I hope you have a high view of the church and find great support and encouragement in who we are together here at PCJH.
