

#### A Word from Pastor Paul Hayden

Howdy Everyone.

And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men. But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. 1 Corinthians 15:17-20 (NIV)

A friend of mine with a bit more of a liberal theological bent once told me, "The only miracle in the Bible that one must believe is that of the resurrection." We had debated water being turned into wine and the healing of the blind man. Did Jesus really feed 5,000 from 5 loaves and two fish? Walking on water? You've got to be kidding me. He had shared with me jokes about miracles and I had recounted proofs. He even had given me a copy of the Bible where Thomas Jefferson had cut out all the stories of Jesus' miracles and focused on his ethical teachings. Then one day, quite seriously, he made his comment about Jesus rising from the dead.

Questioning the veracity of the resurrection has been around since the first Easter day when the religious leaders said the disciples had stolen his body (Matt. 28:11-15). The longest chapter on the resurrection in the New Testament was written because some were teaching that it was not true (1 Cor. 15:12ff). Those with whom young Timothy was working were saying it had already taken place (2 Tim. 2:8). Yet the early disciples staked their lives, figuratively and literally, on the reality of Jesus' resurrection and in hope of their own. To those early persecuted Christians Peter wrote:

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,... 1 Peter 1:3 (NIV)

The resurrection was central to their belief and to ours as well. Our lives of faith depend on this fact. If it were not so "we are to be pitied more than all people."

Since the resurrection is so central to our lives, what impact does it have on how we see ourselves and our world? Here is what the Bible says:

- † Jesus is the Son of God (John 20:14-21; Romans 1:4)
- † Our sins are forgiven (Luke 24:46-7; Acts 13:30-39; Romans 4:25)
- † We have a new relationship with God (Ephesians 2:6; Romans 5:1-8)
- † We will have a new kind of life in our mortal bodies (Romans 8:11)
- † We too have hope of resurrection (Romans 6:5)
- 🖥 † We are a part of a team to conquer evil with Jesus as the Head (Ephesians 1:20-23)
  - † He will come again (Acts 1:9-11; 1 Thess. 1:10)
  - † We will join in eternity with our loved ones who have already 'fallen asleep' (1Thess. 4:14ff)
  - † He will be the ultimate judge of all humanity (Acts 17:30-31; Matthew 25:31-46).

When we gather on Easter Sunday, March 31, sunrise at the top of the Gondola and 10:15 in the Sanctuary, let us remember that this is not just a traditional holiday, it is the celebration of the defining event in Christian history and in our own Christian lives.

When we gather with many others to proclaim the good news that ... He is risen...He is risen indeed!!

May it reflect of our faith, be the image of our hope, and the motivation of our love.




#### A Special offering of the Presbyterian Church (USA)


