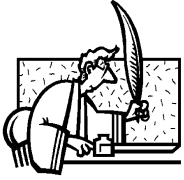

Howdy Everyone.

"He is not here. He is risen, just as He said." Matthew 28:6

This is the way the angel said it to the Mary's as they went to the tomb early that first Easter morning. How earth shattering that must have been for those early disciples. The assumption of the living is "When you're dead you're dead." The question that must have consumed them was "How can this be? The stone is rolled away. The tomb is empty. The angel proclaimed the news. What has happened? How can this be?" Overload.

The days after that first Easter were filled with questions, experiences, fear, sharing, learning, going back to fishing, worship, being called back to Jesus. Even at the ascension of our Lord at the end of Matthew 28:16, 17 we read:

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted.

Doubt...even after having seen Jesus off and on for 40 days there was still doubt. How incredible it is that not long after the ascension and the coming of Holy Spirit a common affirmation and greeting of the early church was "He is risen; He is risen indeed." Let's think about that phrase.

He...

Jesus. The one who lived in the presence of the glory of God (John 17:5), emptied himself of every right as co-equal with God (Phil. 2:5-9), was born into our world (Luke 2:1-20), grew in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and people (Luke 2:52), He lived his mission to preach, teach, heal, and deliver people (Luke 4:18-19), he became the Lamb of God to take away the sin of the world (John 1:29) as He died for our sins...was buried...and rose the third day (1 Corinthians 15:3-4.)

...Is...

Because of the resurrection He is alive now. He is our

"Living Lord." Because He is alive we can learn to follow him now through the direction of Holy Spirit (John 16:7). Because he lives we know we have a perfect high priest, a go-between us and God who understands us (Hebrews 4:14-16). Because He is risen we know He is preparing a place for us so we can be together for eternity (John 14:1-4). He is not just a memory from the past nor a dream for the future He is present with us now. Hallelujah.

...Risen.

'But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died...for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ' (1 Cor. 15:20, 22). Jesus said it best to the thief on the cross, 'Today you will be with me in paradise' (Luke 23:43).

He... Is....Risen!!! Hallelujah.

Easter is the day in our world when we join with 2+ billion humans on this planet to celebrate this great news. We will be celebrating with those in ravaged Japan, in small villages in Guatemala, and small minorities in the war torn Middle East. We must always keep these folks in our prayers. The implications of the resurrection will carry great significance for them.

Our Easter celebrations at PCJH this year will begin at 6 AM with a hike up High School Butte to celebrate the sunrise of Easter Morning. At 8 AM we will have the traditional worship service. At 10:15 our Choir and Orchestra will be presenting the good news in a wonderful Cantata. Brunch will be served at 9 and 11:30 in the Fellowship Hall. Easter is always a great time to invite a friend who may need the good news of resurrection in their life.

The Egg

With the advent of Christianity, eggs' symbolism changed from representing nature's rebirth to representing humanity's rebirth. Many Christians likened the egg to the tomb from which Christ rose. In fact, one Polish legend says that Mary wept as she gave eggs to some soldiers at the cross. As she asked them to be less cruel, her tears fell on the eggs, spotting them with dots of color. Another legend says that when Mary arrived at Jesus' tomb to anoint his body, the eggs she had brought for a snack became a rainbow of colors. But no matter what the legends say, and as pretty and festive as a well-dyed egg might be, you're right--Easter eggs say nothing about what type of person Jesus was or what his ministry meant for humanity. Maybe you can compromise: while you're dyeing eggs with your kids, you can tell them all what Jesus means to you and what he can mean to them.

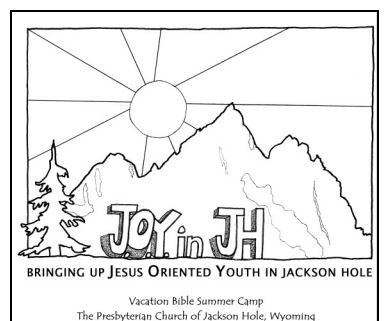

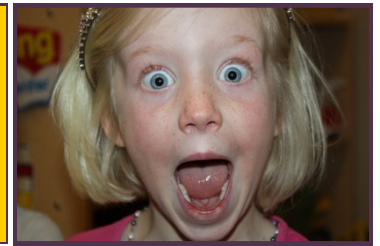

Stewardship of Time

How many of you consider that the work you do volunteering in the life of the church as your Christian Ministry?

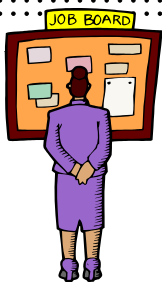
If you are not yet involved as actively in the life of PCJH as you would like to be, or feel called to be, contact the church office for lists of opportunities. You might also request a Spiritual Gifts Inventory to find out more about what God is calling you to do. Remember, for those who fully participated in the All Church study, fall 2010, we were given this assignment in week 6. If you still have not completed yours, pull it out of your files, dust it off, and work through it. Then talk to others about it. You might want to visit with one of our pastors, or seek out a Stephen Minister, someone from your bible study or small group, or talk to someone else on staff or in a leadership role. Ask for feedback and see if others see your gifts the same way you do.

Consider stewardship of time to counteract "busyness." Just as with financial stewardship, make giving time to the church a priority, not an afterthought. Encourage others to likewise make this "first fruits" commitment of time with you. We'll all enjoy more fun and greater spiritual growth that way!!

While your Christian service may not strictly involve the life of our church, you might already be engaged in doing God's work elsewhere in our community and in our world. If so, bravo!! And isn't that what being disciples of Christ is all about?





