Maybe. Questions for you to consider include: How long does it take to drive to PCJH on Sunday and midweek? Are you close to a bus line? Is it a reasonable distance for a person to commute at night or on a bicycle?

Will the intern be able to help out around the house, babysit, etc.?

The intern will be a part of your family and as such will be expected to keep his/her room clean, and help with meals and dishes. The expected work load at PCJH will be significant and therefore the interns should not be expected to do extra work or special house projects beyond what is mentioned above. However, interns could potentially be great house sitters if you are away for a period of time.

What will the intern want or need to have provided? ¥

Each intern will need a key to the house, a place close by to park the car or bike, and his/her own room.

What about the lifestyle of the intern and his/her friends? ¥


Each intern is carefully selected to represent Jesus Christ to our young people, so you should expect the highest standard of behavior. You should also be the one who clarifies the standard in your home, as a witness to your children or grandchildren, if present, and to the neighborhood.

What if we have special vacation plans or a family hobby—will the intern need to be included or feel excluded?

Again, mutual understanding is key here. Interns will have retreats and mission trips that will form [their holidays, if they do not go to their own family's house for the holidays. Certainly, it would be wonderful for the intern to be included, when schedules allow, on whatever outings you might wish to invite 🛽 them. Π

Will the intern be able to pay any rent or subsidize the food and utilities while living with me?

No, you are giving them room and board as your ministry to the intern and to PCJH's intern program. However, any special foods or drugstore items the intern might prefer should be at his/her own ex-Π pense. He/She should also be responsible for his/her own transportation.

All organizations, whether they are for profit or not-for-profit, need to establish an annual budget to help guide the organization through the fiscal year with proper financial management strategies. The goal of each organization is to develop a "balanced" budget which will hopefully have them spend only what the annual revenue will support.

The Presbyterian Church of Jackson Hole has the same processes for establishing a budget that will balance our expenses with the support revenues that we expect to receive. Establishing the Expense side of the budget is done by examining the actual expenses of the past several years and considering new ones that will be important to the life of our church. Our expense budgeting has been very accurate the past several years due to the quality of the data that goes into establishing the budget amounts.

The Revenue piece of the budget, which is primarily funded by your generous contributions, is a more difficult amount to predict. In order to be better stewards of the church budget, over the past several years we have conducted a fall Stewardship Campaign to give our congregation the opportunity to provide an indication of their financial support for the coming year through a "pledge". The results of the past three years are as follows:

As these numbers show, less than half of our 275-300 member families are currently participating in the annual pledge process. While each year the congregation responds with incredible generosity that allows our budget to ultimately be balanced in most years, the lack of an actual commitment from most members makes it very difficult to prepare an annual budget and manage that budget throughout the year.

Your Stewardship Team would like to ask all of our members who have not responded to this year's pledge campaign to prayerfully consider doing so. As always we thank you for your support that makes all the great work of this church possible. PRAISE GOD FROM WHOM ALL BLESSINGS FLOW FINANCIAL RESULTS

This was a tremendous year for the Presbyterian Church of Jackson Hole, highlighted by the hiring of our new Assistant Pastor, Ben Pascal. God has blessed all of our Ministry and Mission programs. For example, the Children, Youth and Family ministry chalked up continuing successes in Little Lambs, expanded participation in Upward Basketball, an excellent summer program, kids Sunday school, youth groups, etc. Adult education enjoyed a number of enlightening programs. Expenditures for Mission projects increased over 13%. And the list of God's blessings goes on and on.

These successes are also reflected in our financial results. Once again, God has also financially blessed PCJH. Thanks be to Him! Thanks also to our congregation and staff for your extraordinary support.

The financial results for this past year were outstanding! Everyone did their part - the congregation stepped up with offerings substantially exceeding budget (+\$102,000) and the staff contributed by holding expenses well below budget (-\$34,000). Together, we were able to turn a planned operating deficit into a significant positive result, adding to our General Fund operating reserves.



The accompanying graph illustrates the changes in our General Fund "Reserves" as of year end for the past 12 years. These reserves represent our "rainy day fund" and the cash set aside (beginning with \$50,000 in 2010) to fund our maintenance reserve, in order to accumulate cash in advance of its requirement for major repairs and maintenance projects such as a new roof or repaving the parking lot. Reserves went down during the years of construction to expand the Church facility, but have grown substantially these past two years.

One significant financial challenge remains - debt. We still have approximately \$1.5 million of debt remaining from the recent expansion of our Church facilities. Annual contributions to the Building Fund have been sufficient to cover the annual interest - now we must pay down principal. Your Stewardship Team quietly began a Debt Payoff Campaign last year, focusing first on participants in the initial Building Expansion Campaign.
