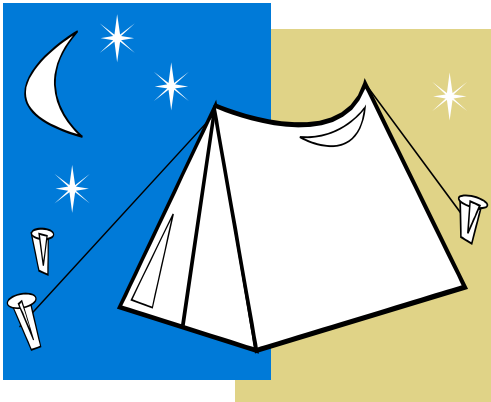

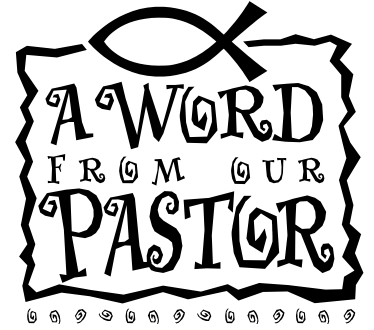
4th of July Float

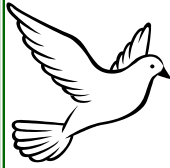
Host Family for Intern, Andrew Perkins

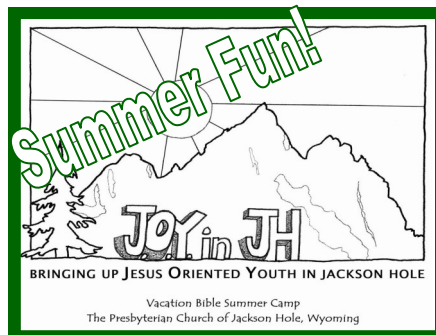

Please consider hosting our PCJH intern, Andrew Perkins

We are currently looking for a family to host a phenomenal young man who will be joining our PCJH staff as an intern for the 2012-2013 academic year. Andrew Perkins is from Bellevue, WA. He is a recent graduate of the University of Washington with a pre-med degree and a heart for ministry. He has served in leadership at University Presbyterian Church in Seattle and is the president of his Christian fraternity of 58 men. He is a strong and natural leader who follows Jesus Christ and strongly believes in relational ministry as the most effective way to build up the Kingdom of God. He comes highly recommended from his home church and has been personally mentored by both Skip Li (the founder of Agros) and David Carlson (the development director of Agros). I believe anyone who hosts Andrew at their home will be extremely blessed. We are looking for a host family (or families) to house him from August 25th, 2012 to June 30th, 2013. You might consider hosting Andrew for the full 10 months or for a three to six month portion of his internship. As you prayerfully consider this opportunity to serve the Lord and the mission of PCJH, please consider these commonly asked questions.

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Will the intern be a part of the family?**

Yes, you will be the intern's "surrogate family" while serving at PCJH.

- **Will the intern expect us to be home when he/she is there?**

No, the intern will, like you, be at work much of the time, sometimes at odd and variable hours.

- **Will the intern have a car?**

Yes

- **Will the intern be able to help out around the house, babysit, etc.?**

The intern will be a part of your family and as such will be expected to keep his room clean, and help with meals and dishes. The expected work load at PCJH will be significant and therefore the intern should not be expected to do extra work or special house projects beyond what is mentioned above. However, the intern could potentially be a great house sitter if you are away for a period of time.

- **What will the intern want or need to have provided?**

The intern will need a key to the house, a place close by to park his car, and his own room.

- **What about the lifestyle of the intern and his/her friends?**

Each intern is carefully selected to represent Jesus Christ to our young people, so you should expect the highest standard of behavior. You should also be the one who clarifies the standard in your home, as a witness to your children or grandchildren, if present, and to the neighborhood.

- **What if we have special vacation plans or a family hobby—will the intern need to be included or feel excluded?**

Mutual understanding is key here. Interns might have retreats and mission trips that form their holidays, or they might go home to visit family. Certainly, it would be wonderful for the intern to be included, when schedules allow, on whatever outings you might wish to invite them.

- **Will the intern be able to pay any rent or subsidize the food and utilities while living with me?**

No, you are giving them room and board as your ministry to the intern and to PCJH's intern program. However, any special foods or drugstore items the intern might prefer should be at his own expense. He should also be responsible for his own transportation.
