Howdy Everyone.

As some of you know, Terri and I will be going to Scotland for the months of June and July. In some ways love to get to know you and do some things with you. So, what will we be doing? Here is a list:

. Having fun. Our flight to Scotland takes us through Paris, France. We will have a 5 day stop-over and celebrate our 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary, a month and a half early, exploring this wonderful city and especially seeing some magnificent works of art.

We will then travel to Scotland, the home of my mother's side of the family. The first two weeks we will be traveling in the Highlands, especially Inverness and Skye, the center of the Mackintosh Clan.

. We will be spending some time with Rev. Dr. Steve Shive, Wyoming's General Presbytery, as he leads a tour on the Northwest side of Scotland and examines Celtic there may be a few of you who would like to take a trip spirituality. . We will then move to Dunbar, a town located 30 miles East of Edinburgh on the North Sea, and exchange pulpits with the Rev. Gordon Stevenson. During this exchange, Rev. Stevenson will be staying in the Hayden's home in Jackson and will preach June 30, July 7, 14, and 21. (You can read his introduction and see family photos elsewhere in the Pinnacle.) He will also be teaching the

I understand from Gordon that he and the family would would love to discover your heart for God and why you son through the eyes of those who love it. I have also shared with him that he has the freedom to say, "Thanks but no thanks, our family needs some time alone."

In like fashion, Terri and I will be spending time in the Dunbar Parish Church (Google it). I will be preaching June 30 through July 28, doing some pastoral visiting, and Bible teaching. We will also have time to explore the "Lowlands," golf, and maybe fish. We have discovered a couple Jackson families with Dunbar connections and will spend some time with those folks while there.

. I will be attending a conference of The International Society of Biblical Literature in St. Andrews. This is an group of scholars who do biblical research during the course of the year, write and submit papers, and then get together for presentations and discussions. I am excited to get new insights, listen to contemporary research and discoveries, and hangout with and make some new academic friends.

. Finally, Terri and I have in the back of our minds that to the United Kingdom to explore its history and its faith. Terri will be looking into some of those possibilities during our stay and seeing what resources might be available for such a trip. May or June 2014 is our projected date. Let us know if you might be interested.

We look forward to our return and sharing what we have learned and experienced.



## CYF Director of Discipleship



It is with great excitement that I would like to introduce the new CYF Director of Discipleship, Ricky Emlyn!! It was a unanimous decision among the search committee and the staff. We offered him the job after a full weekend of interviews, and he accepted. Ricky is married to his wife, Jodi, and they have two beautiful children, Brynn (4yrs) and Bear (2yrs).

Our search process began over seven months ago and we had over 30 applicants. After reviewing


many resumes, extensive written questions and conducting many phone interviews, we narrowed the search down to five top candidates who we then called on Skype. After several weeks of prayer and discernment, we decided to invite Ricky and Jodi out for an in-person interview. The rest is history.

Ricky is from a small town in the Northern Canadian Rockies. He grew up in a broken and unchurched home and gave his life to the Lord when he was in his early twenties. As a new Christian, he attended Trinity Western University in Vancouver, B.C. where he minored in biblical studies. He then moved to Los Angeles where he attended Fuller Theological Seminary's School of Intercultural Studies (where Pastor Paul & Ben attended seminary). He was a Youth Pastor for three years in San Dimas, CA. He then began a career with Youth with a Mission (YWAM), one of the largest mission agencies in the world. He has been working for YWAM for the last 12 years. During his time at YWAM he worked his way up the ladder and is currently the International Outreach and Staff Development Director and is in charge of discipleship training of emerging leaders within YWAM. During his last decade with YWAM, Ricky has traveled to over 50 countries working with children and youth and young adults. He is a strategic leader and dedicated to our Lord. As you will see when you meet him, he is full of energy and life and has the unique ability to empower and lead volunteers and interns in the job that is before him at PCJH.

Ricky and Jodi currently live in Colorado Springs and have always wanted to live in the mountains (they actually lived near Cody, WY for a brief period while leading a discipleship training school for YWAM). They have sensed God's call to move from international mission to local church-based ministry with the distinct vision to develop disciples in the home and family. Their vision for ministry aligns with PCJH's mission to partner home and congregation as we gather, grow and go.

Ricky is also an avid outdoors man and horse trainer. As a horse trainer, he has learned much about discipleship and is able to take his skill with horses and apply them to ministry. The Emlyns plan on moving to Jackson in June and start work at PCJH on July 1st.

## 2013 Home Furnishings Sale — A Great Success

Through the extraordinary generosity of a number of families and the concerted efforts of 40 dedicated volunteers, the Church netted over \$18,000 at the fourth annual Home Furnishings Sale, held in the Fellowship Hall on Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup>.

Thanks to efforts of Pamela Stockton, we received all the furniture and antiques from a large estate. Janice Murphy helped us acquire sleeper sofas and upholstered chairs from The Snake River Lodge & Spa. Karen Terra was instrumental in arranging for furnishings donated by the seller of a home. We had numerous other furniture/furnishings donors, too. Thanks to them all!

Thanks to a suggestion from Suzanne Young, we held a "sale preview" for the first time on Friday night from 5:30 to 6:30pm. The event drew over 100 people, and resulted in many of them returning early on Saturday morning to buy the items they had identified.

On Saturday morning, the Church Fellowship Hall looked very full and drew a crowd of nearly 500 shoppers. Sales activity was fast and furious when the doors opened at 9am. Most all the items were sold within the first 2 hours—over half the items in the first 15 minutes.

John Shipman located an estate auctioneer who came on Saturday afternoon to take the remaining large items we had not sold. When the auction is held later this year, the Church will receive 50% of the proceeds.

A team of 40 volunteers moved the furniture and other sale items into the Fellowship Hall, arranged them for ease of sale, assisted in the sale process, collected the money, moved items into the buyers' vehicles, and cleaned up the Church after the event.

Overall, the event was a great success. Thanks to all who volunteered, donated goods for the sale, and purchased the items to make this fourth annual event so memorable.



The Rev. Gordon Stevenson was born 3<sup>rd</sup> of 5 brothers to Neil, a Motor (auto) Engineer who later ran his own garages and of May the devoted mother. He left school with Engineering in his blood, going into Electrical, Electronic Controls. After adding some qualifications he became a Project Engineer for one of the world's largest Paper manufacturers. After 18 years there he answered God's call to full time ministry.

At the age of 15 I gave my life to God after a weekend of evangelism and mission in my home Church and I have never looked back since. I then started giving back to the Church. Presi-

dent of the Youth Fellowship, Bible Class leader, Boy's Brigade (BB) Officer and Leader of many Church Missions. For many years. I was working full time in the secular world and part time for God. He gave me the choice, comfort or adventure; the rest is history.

Gail Stevenson is the capable woman (Proverbs 31) usually hiding behind him. Gail's father was an elder, carpenter and BB Leader working alongside Gordon, and Gail was often around Church, at Christian youth events and sometimes at BB events. She is a veterinary surgeon (animals), however, when Gordon began full time ministry she gave up her job to relocate with him and is full time housewife and volunteer worker in the local primary school as well as the Churches Toddler Group.

Our children are Eilidh 14, Anna, 13, Joshua 11 and Jared almost 8. The middle 2 play the violin and the other 2 piano. The older 3 play Badminton and they all do gymnastics and various other sporty things. Above all they enjoy the many Christian Groups which they are able to attend locally.

The girls became Christians a couple of years ago in a few months period where our church enjoyed 12 new converts. (Praise God)

Dunbar Parish Church has stood on the same prominent location for almost 1000 years. The current building is about 300 years old, but internally it is very modern. A fire decimated it 25 years ago and we have recently created a number of additional rooms which includes an elevator to 2 new floors.

When we arrived here the Church had seen 7 straight decades of decline, and the authorities were planning in reducing its ministry allocation by almost half.

God's hand has turned things around and the magnitude of improvements is palpable, **but** we still have a long way to go. We are however, no longer under threat of reduced allocation and are now probably the 3<sup>rd</sup> least likely to face that in our Presbytery.

We are hugely excited at the prospect of meeting brothers and sisters in Christ and being in fellowship with you all.

If you teach us some American, we will teach you some Scottish!

#### Host Family Testimony from Frank & Judy Scarborough



Did you ever wonder what the different liturgical colors of the church seasons mean? Most recently we have had a white drape around the cross. White is used for the special days in the redemptive work of Jesus Christ such as Christmas and Easter. The purple drape hung prior to Easter Sunday to mark the seasons of penitence and preparation, lent and advent. Most recently for one Sunday the **red** drape was used the color to mark Pentefor cost. Green is used at other times to represent spiritual growth.
