

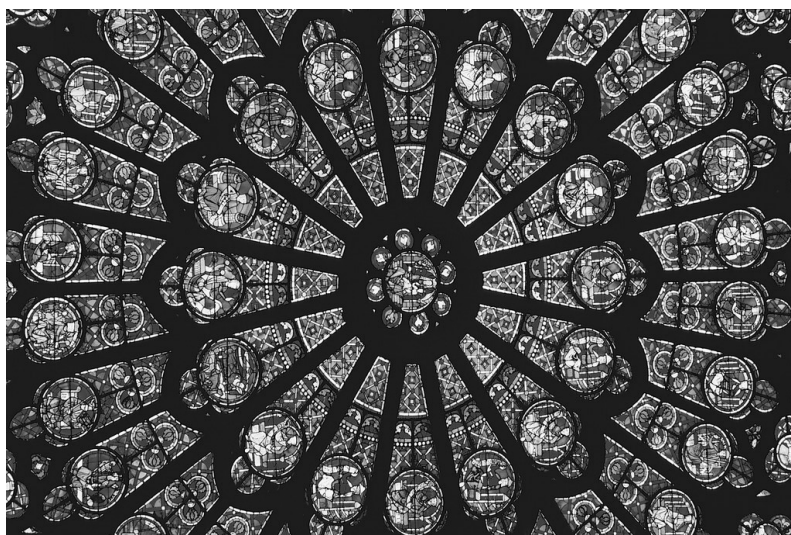

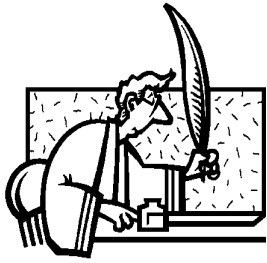

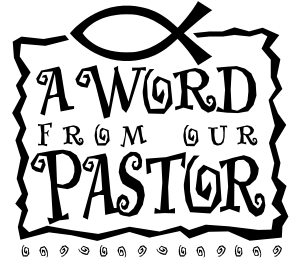

Howdy Everyone.

As you are reading this, Terri and I will be enjoying the warm, tropical climate of Maui. It has been years since either of us made it to The Islands and it has been our goal over the past few years, to have a winter getaway to warm up. It is also good to get away so that we can gain a different, if not new perspective, on the work we do and the ministry the Lord would have us do, in the midst of that work.

Jesus knew the importance of finding those times of separation from his work so that he could be renewed. In our Tuesday women's Bible study where we are studying the healing miracles of Jesus we read:

But he would withdraw to deserted places and pray.
Luke 5:16

Jesus made these alone times on a regular basis after times of intense ministry. He also did this with his disciples, pulling them away from the demands of the life they had found with him, so they might reflect on what was happening and have personal time with him. He seemed to know that times of separateness are important for renewal with those closest to us and with our Lord. When we return we are often energized for what is ahead.

One of Jesus' alone times that we remember during the Season of Lent (Lent is the period of time within the church year that leads us to Easter) was when Jesus went into the desert to be tempted. The first three Gospels tell us the story but I like Luke's account the best. Luke tells us:

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan (where he had been baptized) and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness where for 40 days he was tempted by the devil.

Matthew and Mark tell us that Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted. Luke tells us that Jesus was "led by the Spirit in the wilderness..." To me learning to be led by the Spirit is the ultimate goal of both our alone time as well as the seasons of temptation. Temptation is simply being presented with a choice to make. Often the choices are not between radically opposed directions. Temptation is often choosing between the right

way and the easy way to get to a goal. Luke implies that Jesus' deepest temptation was the choice between listening to and following the lead of the Holy Spirit versus the other voice(s) that were tugging at his heart.

During the Season of Lent people will often give up something as a spiritual discipline reminding them that Jesus fasted for 40 days and nights while in the wilderness. People will often give up chocolate or alcohol or something that is a vice for them. People also might give up a meal once a week to be reminded of Jesus' time of fasting. These sacrifices can be helpful as a connect point to what Jesus did for us.

What I like to encourage people to do during the Season of Lent is to take on a spiritual practice that will make them more sensitive to the leading of the Holy Spirit. Here are some ideas:

- † Make time to pray 3 times a day;
- † Make time to daily read the Bible;
- † Read a book on Christian Spirituality;
- † Commit to attending a Bible study;
- † Once a week, find a need within your circle of friends and meet it with an anonymous action;
- † Learn what it means to be led by the Spirit.

The outcome of Jesus' alone time in the wilderness was his growth from being "full of the Spirit" (4:1) to being "filled with the power of the Spirit" (4:14). I believe this is what God wants to do in our lives through our alone times and during Lent. God has given each of us areas of ministry and Christian influence: family, friends, business, church... May we discover the power God wants to give for our serving as we spend time with Him.

I am writing the day after four Presbyterian youth groups convened at PCJH for an awesome night of worship, fellowship, games and prayer. It was energizing and encouraging to see so many youth seeking God in their lives. Continue to keep our youth in your prayers as they learn to walk in the way of Jesus.

Little Lambs Expanded Hours of Operation: Attention all parents and grandparents of preschoolers! I want you to know that our Little Lambs Preschool will be expanding its hours of operation for the 2012-2013 academic year. Our normal Little Lambs program hours have always been 9:00am to 3:00pm, and will continue to be. However, we would like to provide before-care (7:30am-9:00am) and after-care (3:00pm-5:30pm) for families who need extended childcare in order to work or for a variety of other reasons.

Registration for the 2012-2013 academic year will be open to PCJH and Little Lambs families on Monday, March 5th. We will then open registration up to the public the following day, Tuesday, March 6th. Please note: We must have a minimum of 4 to 5 kids enrolled in before and/or after care in order to make it viable. In addition, there is a maximum of 10 kids that we will be able to accommodate for before/after care. Please spread the word about our new hours of operation for the 2012-2013 academic year!

Therefore, this film fits perfectly with the mission and values of what the 30-Hour Famine is all about. We will also have a brief panel discussion following the film. Per Capita: An Overview

In essence, per capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, so every Presbyterian is asked to share the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system.

Why per capita? The Book of Order states that per capita exists as a way for all Presbyterians to share costs that belong to the whole church, to "give meaning to the interdependent nature of Presbyterian polity" (G-9.0404d).

Per capita is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. It exists to allow the whole church to share equitably in those things that make us Presbyterian:

- ¥ our theological identity
- ¥ our connectedness
- ¥ our system of governing bodies that allow elders and ministers together to discern the mind of Christ
- ¥ our ecumenical connections that make us part of the church universal
- ¥ our core structures that keep us together as a church
- ¥ our call to work for full participation in decision making

Per capita allows us to work with other churches to further the mission of Jesus Christ around the world.

Exodus 30:11-16 - "...the rich shall not give more, and the poor shall not give less, than the half shekel (for the sanctuary)..."

1 Corinthians 12:7 - "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."

Per capita is similar to:

- ¥ contributing one's dish to a potluck meal
- ¥ paying to be connected to the Internet
- ¥ paying for the benefit of utilities, such as electricity, water and telephone
- ¥ pitching in with other passengers to pay for gasoline for a road trip
- ¥ participating in community supported agriculture (CSA) or a similar co-op

A Brief History: The earliest history of something like a per capita apportionment dates back to the 1700s.

In the mid-1800s, a "plan of mileage" was adopted by the General Assembly to defray the expenses of commissioners attending General Assembly meetings so that everyone could be present to participate regardless of distance or financial resources. Over time, per capita has been used to fund "ecclesiastical and administrative" functions that are shared by the whole church. In 1995, the following definition was developed:

Per capita is an opportunity for all communicant members of the Presbyterian church through the governing bodies to participate equally, responsibly, and interdependently by sharing the cost of coordination and evaluation of mission; and of performing ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions that identify a Reformed Church, while at the same time strengthening the sense of community among all Presbyterians. (GA Minutes, Part 1, 1995).

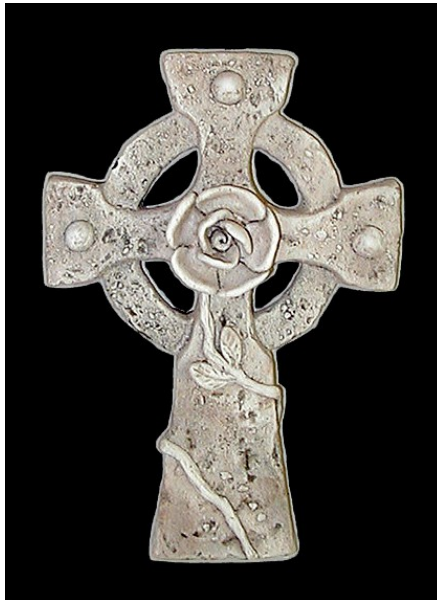

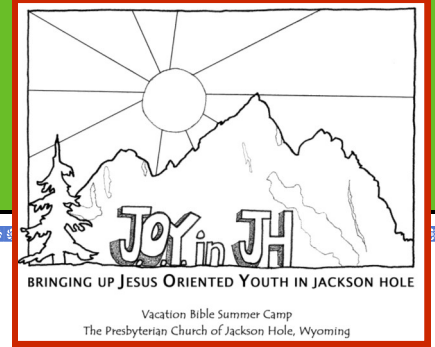
Safe Church

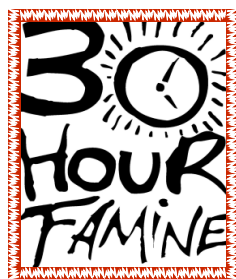

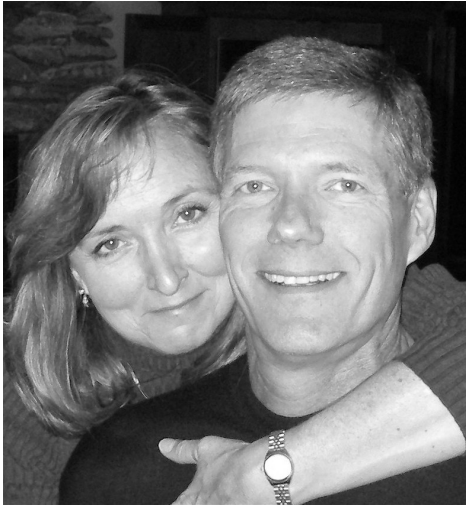
A Gnome Insurance Policy
