The Buses Are Coming! - The Buses Are Coming! - We Need Your Help!

No, the British are not coming
-- and no, this is not a Paul
Revere alarm. But we do need

The great news is that the two new 15 passenger activity buses manufactured by the Thomas Bus Company, which feature seat belts, headrests, and build-in car seats, will be arriving in May.

The new buses will be used for Little Lambs Preschool, J.O.Y. Summer Camp, and our Wednesday After-School program as we transport children safely around the Jackson Hole valley.





And the good news is that they are almost paid for – but not

quite. The total cost is \$110,000. The Church has received over \$80,000 so far. We still need donations for the remaining \$30,000. We ask you to prayerfully consider participating in this fund-raising effort. Please know that every dollar helps us meet our goal.

A WORD FROM PASTOR PAUL HAYDEN

Howdy Everyone.

Change.

As I write this article to you, I do not know what the vote of the congregation will be as we choose the Pastoral Transition Model for PCJH. All I know is that a model will be chosen we are going to be a healthy church. At the and regardless of the choice, there will be changes that will take place within this part of God's family.

What will some of those changes be? We can only speculate. What might those speculations be? Here are a few of my thoughts.

There will be some folks who will leave the church.

There will be some new folks who will begin attending the church.

There will be some who say "I have helped around here as much as I can. I have no more to give." They will still worship and participate but leading will not be an option.

There will be others who will say, "I like where PCJH is going. I want to contribute more of my time, talents, and treasures."

I am reminded of Jesus' words in John 15 where he talks about the pruning of the vines in the vineyard. The 'vinedresser', God, does this there is something in a church's life that is so there will be more growth. Pruning is always painful. We lose some of the branches we love, but we also open the doors to new branches (people) we will love. When God is directing the process it will be for the growth of God's kingdom of which PCJH is a part.

There will be new directions and new visions established. Hopefully these will not be done in contradiction to the core values that have been developed over the first 20 years of PCJH's life. In 1 Corinthians 3:6, St. Paul talks about having laid a foundation upon which someone else will build. That is what I pray will

happen here. We have laid a good foundation, a unique base of ministry, a loving environment for spiritual growth upon which new leadership may choose to build.

This new building, new direction, new emphasis is absolutely necessary for PCJH if recent Presbytery of Wyoming meeting a consultant from our denomination said research has revealed that a church's vision will only last 20-23 years. If it is not revitalized and reshaped, the church will begin to die. New direction/vision is essential for the ongoing health of our church.

As this new direction begins to unfold, one thing we need to understand is that the Long Range Planning report to the congregation will need to be put on hold.... but it will not be lost. The appropriate location to place the input received from the many, many interviews conducted by the LRP Team would be into the vision process with new leadership. To do otherwise could handcuff the new leadership's vision. To place the report with the new leadership will take a future action of the congregation since the LRPT was a committee of the congregation. As members, please prayer-fully consider if this is the direction you would like to go.

One final word. I have come to believe that more important than the role of the pastor, new or old. The support and involvement of the church family through prayer, support, and participation is what helps every church to succeed. I pray, as change happens, as new visions unfold and new direction is established. that you will increase your commitment and involvement in this part of God's family.

My biggest concern during this whole process was not whether or not I would be selected as your next Senior Pastor. My biggest concern was that the process was done well so that we could hear God's voice, remain united as a church, and come out on the other side ready to serve the Lord with enthusiasm. I believe this is happening to the best of our ability. Thanks be to God!

I would also like to publicly thank the Ruling Elders of PCJH for their leadership, commitment, and love for the Lord and his church. Thank you!

As we begin down the road of ministry together, I would like to share with you the vision I have for PCJH. Many of you were able to attend worship on February 23rd when I preached on this topic in more detail, but for those of you who were unable to be there, I would encourage you to listen to the sermon on our website at www.pcjh.org.

Before I explain my vision, I want to emphasize my commitment to expand upon the foundation that has already been laid here at PCJH. Let us affirm a few things:

God is already at work among us.

We are on good fertile soil for optimal growth, thanks to Paul Hayden's leadership and the congregation's

> When you hear the word, "minister," I hope you don't just think of a pastor or a priest. I hope you begin to see yourself, as well as your brothers and sisters in Christ, as ministers. We are all ministers called to do God's work based on our gifts.

Every Member a Minister

This is the focus of my vision for PCJH as we move into the future together.

Presbyterians are often known for creating visions that built a wonderful facility, and paid it off, thanks be to God! Now we need to focus on filling this place and building up our people as disciples and ministers of our Lord. The natural outcome of Every Member a Minister will be the expansion of our ministry. We will expand our gathering; we will expand our growing; and we will expand our going. It is the people of PCJH, not the pastors and staff, who will be the primary agents to expand PCJH's ministry into the future. You are the ministers!

"Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it." -1 Corinthians 12:27

There is no chUrch without U! Everybody is part of the Body. What part will you play in this church? Whether you are officially a member or not, you are still part of this church, and we need you. We all have gifts and a work to do. How is God calling you to serve in and through PCJH?

This is a defining moment for us as a congregation. As we move into the future, my hope is that when people think of the minister at PCJH, they won't just think of Ben Pascal. My hope is that they will think of you and every member of this church as the minister.








God's Little Lambs


