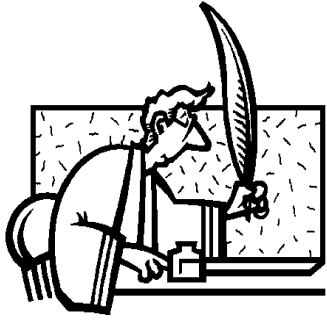

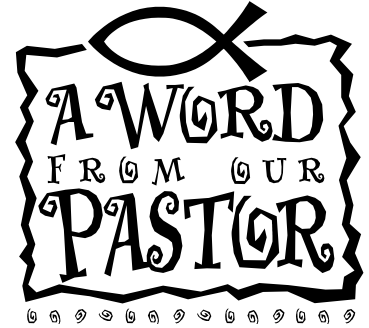
Every now and then I truly enjoy writing to some individual who has brought joy, pleasure and understanding into my life and in so doing has helped me become a better child of God's and that you have done.

Howdy Everyone.

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

Acts 2:1

The Day of Pentecost was the birthday of the Christian Church. On that day the One who moved across the chaos of creation (Genesis 1:3) moved across the chaos those early disciples had experienced after Jesus' death. On that day the breath of God was breathed into them afresh and they became living beings (Genesis 2:7). On that day the languages that had been confused because of selfish intent (Genesis 11) were unified afresh so each person could understand in their own language the amazing deeds of God's power. With the coming of the Holy Spirit a new day had begun.

The verse above makes an incredible statement concerning those early Christians: "...they were all together...in one place." I understand that the direct reference was their physical location which may have been the upper room where they had shared the Last Supper with Jesus. However, "being together...in one place" can mean so much more. Acts 1:14 tells us:

All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

The disciples were devoting themselves to prayer! It had only been a few weeks earlier that they couldn't stay awake with Jesus in the garden. Now, they were "being together...in one place" devoting themselves to prayer. Miracles happen.

The disciples were incorporating women! In a society where women were excluded from the core of religious life, the disciples, men and women alike were "being

together... in one place." Maybe they had learned something from their Lord and Savior about how to treat those who had been excluded from the family of faith. Miracles happen.

Jesus' brothers became a part of the team! His brothers had not been big followers. Early in his ministry they had heard and believed that he was "out of his mind" and had attempted to "restrain him" (Mark 3:21). The resurrection had changed their minds and their hearts and now they were part of the "being together...in one place." Miracles happen.

I don't believe it was easy for these transforming events to take place. I do believe Jesus knew there was work that had to be done as they waited "for the promise of the Father" (1:4) that came on Pentecost. They had to work so they might be together in the same place spiritually as well as spatially. When they 'arrived' the Spirit came, the disciples were empowered, and the world has never been the same. They shared their faith, they cared for those in need, the Fruit of the Spirit was developed in their character, and people of their day responded. May it be so for us this Pentecost.

Isn't being spiritually rich something that we all want and need? Can we honestly say this about our own lives? My prayer is that we can all strive to be spiritually rich, and as a result, experience the immense blessing of God.

James 2:5 says, "Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom he promised those who love him?" As we continue to walk with the villagers of Tierra Nueva, I am confident that many of us will have our eyes, ears and hearts opened to the wealth of the kingdom of God as we walk with those who are poor, but rich in faith.

If you would like to learn more about our first Agros service team trip to Tierra Nueva, Nicaragua, the team will make a small presentation with a slideshow at an upcoming worship service May 20th. The team will have a longer

presentation before and/or after the service for those who would like to learn more about what God is doing in the lives of the villagers of Tierra Nueva.

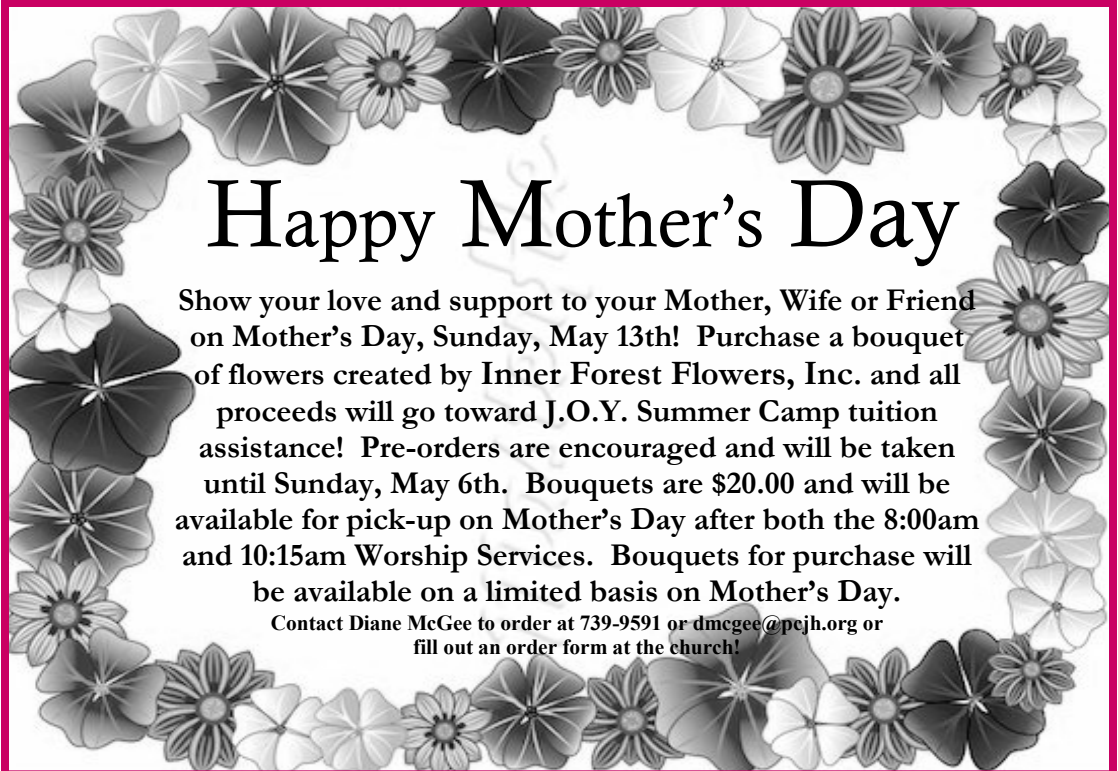

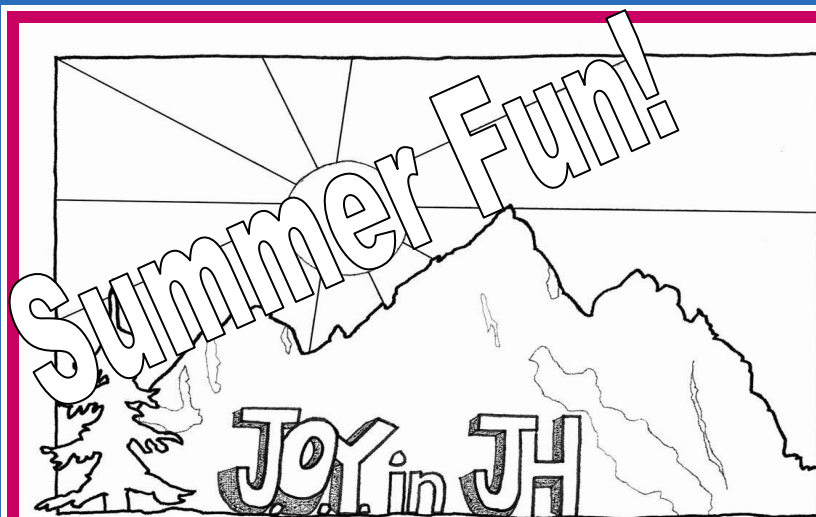

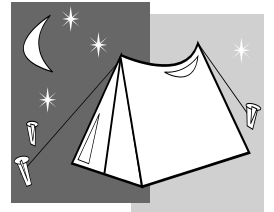

First Contact, The Power of Prayer and an Accomplished Mission

My reflections on the mission trip to the Agros Village of Tierra Nueva, Nicaragua, by: Jeff Hanson, April 23, 2012.

As I sit here with a fresh cup of coffee the first morning after returning from the Agros Mission trip to Tierra Nueva, Nicaragua, I am feeling overwhelmed once again by all of the emotions that are coming back to me as I am trying to write a summary for all of you to read. So that this doesn't turn into a 500 page book, I think I can relay the impact of the trip by breaking it down into the three categories I wrote in the title of this message - First Contact, The Power of Prayer, and An Accomplished Mission.

First Contact: To often the first thing everyone wants to hear about is "what did you build" on the mission trip. Without responding with a description of some super human building project, say the construction of a school in three days, you would certainly lose their attention and probably lead them to disappointment. So I am happy to report that our team built a bridge in 3 days. Now that I have your attention, I will tell you that it is a metaphorical bridge that we built and it was actually a "connection" that we constructed. Our true mission was to make First Contact with the villagers of Tierra Nueva and to establish a working relationship with them so that they know we are there to support their efforts in the incredible struggle they have undertaken to build their village and clear their fields so they can begin their coffee & vegetable farms.

So over the three days we spent with them we did exactly this. Thru several activities we interacted with the villagers and broke down the walls separating us and built them back up on firm foundations so that now they know we are here supporting them. In fact, with near tears in their eyes, they relayed to us how we are the answer to their prayers, which of course led to near tears in our eyes.

The activities ranged from simple name games, singing songs, question and answer sessions to a puppet show, a campfire complete with marshmallows and s'mores and a terrifying game of baseball. It all culminated with a closing ceremony in which our team leaders, the Agros leaders and the Village leaders executed a formal contract establishing our church's seven year commitment to this village. It was during these activities that we were able to have close interaction and build their trust.

My closest interaction occurred with the campfire and marshmallow roasting. As Preston attempted to explain the goal was to put a marshmallow on the stick and hold it over the fire long enough to roast it but not so long as to burn it, he was met with some of the strangest looks you could imagine. As I bent over and began roasting my marshmallows, the looks turned to curiosity and several men started laughing at me. The women looked on equally as curious, but deferring to the men without taking action. After putting the browned marshmallow in my mouth and showed I was enjoying it, a mad rush ensued to give it a try. As each minute passed, the hesitation passed and hands began reaching out to me to pass them a marshmallow so they could try. As I walked among first the men then the women and children, I was able to look deeply into their eyes. It was at this moment I felt and saw God's will at work. It was as though all of their pain and suffering was lifted away if only for an instant or for several instances. What was replaced in their eyes was real joy and a sense that everything they are doing is worth it, that indeed God was answering their prayers. As the event ended with both groups sharing song and dance, we began walking out of the village side by side with the villagers no longer as strangers but as brothers and sisters.

The Power Of Prayer: As anyone can tell you, the basis for a good relationship is one in which both sides equally gain something from each other. Such is the case in our new relationship with the Tierra Nueva villagers. As we spread our message of hope and support to them, we received messages back as well. A very powerful moment occurred on the second day when one of the women stood up and broke into a long emotional prayer. As I sat listening to the translation I realized this prayer was not for the villagers, it was being directed towards our group.

She was asking God to watch over and protect us and thanking him for bringing us to them. As the prayer ended and a discussion ensued, we were told by several villagers how God is a major part of their lives and how they devote time every day to celebrating all that God has given them. What an incredible experience for our team. I mean here we are trying to bring hope and encouragement to them and they are praying for us and thanking God for what they have. Once again the will of God was showing itself to us thru these people and confirming to me that our work here is truly his will. As we left this event they told us that the primary thing they wanted was for us to continue to pray for them. I found this to be incredibly powerful and a realm testament to their faith as well as an incredible example of the power of prayer.

An Accomplished Mission: As I draw this message to a conclusion my thoughts focus on the importance of this trip in the life of PCJH. After so much advance preparation and study, this trip marked a major milestone in the growth of our church's mission. We have formed the bonds of friendship and support with the Agros Organization and with the Villagers of Tierra Nueva. We have answered God's calling to gather, grow and go and have set the stage for future trips to the village. So while we cannot relay stories of building physical structures and other "real" projects, I feel the building of our "bridge" and "connection" with Tierra Nueva has laid the foundation and will allow for the success of the trips which will be done in the future. To be clear, there is no shortage of "real" work projects to be worked on in this village - a primary potable water line covering 11 kilometers, the construction of 150 homes, continued clearing of land for the creation of fields for the coffee farms and other plantings, a community shelter area, a school and a church - but our trip accomplished what first needed to be done. We gave the villagers a message of hope and confirmed the opportunity to work for a real future. At the same time we formed a special bond thru the sharing of our Christian faith. So as I mentioned earlier, it was not Mission Accomplished, rather it was an Accomplished Mission.

As the villagers asked, keep them in your daily prayers and consider being a member on one the future trips to Tierra Nueva, it will change your life.

Many thanks to Addie Pascal and Bob Kopp for their incredible leadership in bringing this trip to fruition.
