There are four Special Offerings of the Presbyterian Church (USA); the Peacemaking Offering in one of those four. Received during World Communion Sunday on the first Sunday in October, it supports the peacemaking efforts of the Church at every level, and provides an opportunity to witness to God's Peacegiving in the world (Matthew 5:9; Isaiah 9:6). We are called to be agents of reconciliation for individuals, for families and for communities, as well as in the international arena (2 Corinthians 5:17-21). We are called to do what we individually and collectively can do to build a culture of peace in the world.

Each congregation is encouraged to keep 25% of this offering for its own peacemaking efforts ... 25% will be used to support Presbytery and Synod peacemaking, and 50% will be forwarded to the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program of the General Assembly (the national level of PC(USA)). You may visit www.pcusa.org to learn more.

We, who enjoy so much peace in our lives compared to most of the rest of the world, have an opportunity with this offering to share some of our good fortune with so many others in need. We hope you will wish to participate! You may use Peacemaking envelopes from the display or your Bulletin on Sunday, October 2.

October is Pastor Appreciation Month

Howdy Everyone.

Today I decided to bake some cookies. Normally Terri does the cookie baking, but for an out-of-the-normal surprise, I decided to try my luck. After all, the instructions are on the oatmeal box...what could go wrong?

I have just taken three dozen flat, oatmeal raisin, and chocolate chip cookies out of the oven. I don't know the exact reason they taste the way they do. I didn't measure the vanilla exactly like the recipe said. The amount of sugar was pretty close. Did the recipe mean a flat teaspoon or a heaping tea spoon of baking soda...or was it baking powder? I hope they will forgive me if they aren't "the best" after all the scriptures do teach that "love covers a multitude of sins" (1 Peter 4:8) and these cookies were sure made with love.

The doctor told her that she needed orthotics to help reduce the pain in her back. After measuring her foot, the correct orthotic was prescribed and she left the office with great hope for some relief. When she got to the orthotic store they were having a sale. Her particular prescription was not on sale and the one that was on sale was only $\frac{1}{4}$ thicker. She knew her doctor cared for her health and did his best to help relieve her pain but the \$5.95 she could save would buy her son a Happy Meal after school. After all, what's $\frac{1}{4}$ inch?

He was a "hog" for a masonry company. After spending a few weeks hauling cinder blocks and rocks he was allowed to move up the skill ladder. He began learning to cut some of the stone. He was allowed to place a few rocks on the wall. He was taught how to mix the sand and concrete to make mortar, "mud," so the rocks placed on the wall would adhere and make an attractive fireplace. One day the concrete ran out....still plenty of sand. Would it make any difference? What could it hurt if the batch of mud was just "different" this time?

He worked at a summer camp and was in charge of scouting trails for the young campers to hike. He like finding "doable" trails for them and then tried to find a faster way to the end and be waiting there for them when they arrived. One time he took a

shortcut...that wasn't. The scratches on his arms and legs as well as the fatigue in his body and the hunger in his tummy were reminders of the foolish decision he had made.

We all make decisions that impact our lives. My father would tell me, "There's a right way and a wrong way to get a job done." I had a boss who would tell me, "There's my way and the wrong way to get the job done." The Bible tells us, "There is a way that seems right to a man, but..." Proverbs 14:12. The decisions we make impact our lives. This is true for

what we eat,
our health,
the homes we build,
the paths we walk.

It is also true for the faith we live.

- † Where and how often do we get our nourishment?
- † Do we pursue "sale price" religion or do we follow the instruction as the physician of our soul directed?
- † When we are building our home of faith, upon what foundation are we building and what are we putting into that foundation?
- † Do we take short cuts as we move toward our eternal destination?

What decisions are you making that shape your faith? Are you consciously processing those decisions or are they being made by default? Do you have a goal as to where you want to be and where you want your children to be? Who supports you in those decisions? With whom do you share your journey toward God's eternal presence?

Take some time and think about a Christian's goal: Living with Jesus in the eternal presence of God. Prayerfully consider what you need to be doing now to move you toward your ultimate destination.

Whether you live in Jackson or far away, we hope to see you soon. I have a few happenings I would like to share with you for the month of October.

Does My Work Matter to God?

"For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

~Ephesians 2:10

Have you ever wondered if your work matters to God? Did you know the Bible says it does? Maybe you are a school teacher, a business person, a real estate agent, a medical professional, a social worker, a stay-at-home mom or dad, a legal professional, a construction worker, an artist, or a worker in the service industry. Some of you are self-employed or maybe you are looking for meaningful work. Many of you are retired and now work as volunteers. Whatever it is you do for work, God has something to say about it. I will be preaching a sermon series on this topic on Sunday mornings from October 21st to November 11th. Whether you work outside the home, inside the home, or volunteer, this sermon series is for you!

Sunday, Oct. 21st – The Purpose of Work

We will be exploring God's purpose in our work and how the Lord created work for a reason.

Sunday, Oct. 28th – Relationships at Work

We will reflect on the importance of our work relationships between our supervisors, employees and co-workers.

Sunday, Nov. 4th – Rest from Work

During the third week we will be challenged by God's fourth commandment to observe the Sabbath and how that impacts our work and our health.

Sunday, Nov 11th – God's Retirement Plan

The final week we will take a look at God's retirement plan for us and how that matches up with *our* retirement plan.

I look forward to exploring this topic with you and being challenged by God's word as we work together hand in hand as servants of the Lord.

Fellowship for Families with Young Children

At a recent PCJH Session meeting, one of our ruling elders made a comment that struck me as significant. She said, "There is a tsunami of families with young children flooding into PCJH. What are we going to do to connect them to the church and to one another?" I thought it was a great observation and an important question. Praise God for drawing all these families to us!

Since then, we have put our efforts together and we are inviting all families with young children to consider being a part of a **Monthly Fellowship Group** that meets in homes once a month with three other families. Here are the details...

- Each family rotates host duties at their home or other location.
- Potluck style dinner, picnic or brunch.
- Individual groups can decide on the date, time, and place of meeting.
- The goal is to build relationships and get to know other families of young children who attend PCJH.
- Fun and relaxation are mandatory for participation.
- A commitment to meet monthly with the same families from Oct. through May.

Sometimes you might want kids to be there and sometimes it might be nice to get a babysitter and have some adult time.

WHAT WE ARE GRATEFUL FOR?

In April, your Stewardship Team announced that our 2012 Stewardship Theme is "With a Grateful Heart." We chose this theme because we believe that all we have, our time, our talents, our treasures, our relationships, our faith, creation, and everything else is a gift from God.

God has given us the responsibility to be stewards of those divine gifts. It is wonderful that within the responsibility of taking care of those things, God has also given us the pleasure of using those things for our enjoyment and to advance God's Kingdom. Stewardship is a joyful responsibility!

This year, your Stewardship Team (a group of folks dedicated to assisting PCJH in our understanding the stewards we are) has witnessed a significant number of things we are grateful for. Among them are the following:

- ¥ Over 5,000 meals served over the past year during Wednesday Night dinners - most to deserving members of our community (40 weeks @ 125+ average number of attendees)
- ¥ Well over 6,000 hours of volunteer service during the past year (over 160 volunteers contributing 40+ hours of service)
- ¥ Five consecutive years of significant total offerings to the Church (\$1,000,000+ each year)
- ¥ Continuing reduction in the Church's debt (down \$175,000 this year)

Stewardship Sunday (when we present our Pledge Cards) is scheduled for November 18th. The Sunday before - November 11th - has been designated "With a Grateful Heart Sunday." We will ask you to write down what you are grateful for and then post them around the Sanctuary or Chapel walls.

We all have so much to be grateful for.

A.C.A. - Adult Children of Alcoholics

Adult Children of Alcoholics has been meeting at PCJH every Monday night at 6:45pm since May 2012. What exactly is ACA? "Adult Children of Alcoholics (ACA) is a Twelve Step, Twelve Tradition program of men and women who grew up in alcoholic or otherwise dysfunctional homes. The ACA program was founded on the belief that family dysfunction is a disease that effected us as children and effects us as adults. Our membership also includes adults from homes where alcohol or drugs were not present; however, abuse, neglect or unhealthy behavior was." Since the local group's inception, the group has grown from an average of 3 people in attendance each week up to 8 people. Almost every week, someone new attends. We have not advertised and have grown our attendance through attraction rather than promotion. The group is very thankful to PCJH for allowing us to use your space. All donations collected at the meetings will be given directly to PCJH. ACA meets at PCJH every Monday night at 6:45pm in the Genesis Room. PJCH implemented our formal *Safe Church Policy* in January 2012 to continue to ensure that the children and youth who participate in programs and activities within our church community have a safe and secure environment. Child sexual abuse is a real problem in communities and in ministries today. The good news is that the risk of this occurring can be reduced with the implementation of such a policy and the heightened awareness of our staff, leadership, volunteers, and congregation. It is the prayer of our leadership that this policy informs us, but that it does not keep us from connecting with the youth in our programs. Our goal continues to be that all of God's children feel the welcome and love of Jesus Christ and to develop a lifelong relationship with Christ as we gather, grow, and go in passing on the faith.

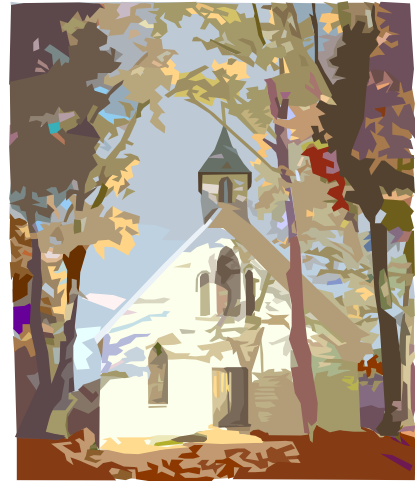
