



Howdy Everyone.

WOW!!!! Sometimes I get overwhelmed with all the opportunities for all those who live in Jackson, and, my list doesn't include the many activities sponsored by worthwhile organizations in our larger community. We are a busy community.

This having been said, having raised my family here and now being on the empty-nest side of life, one of the harsh

realities I have had to face while living in Jackson is I (and we) can't do it all. Often it has nothing to do with the worthiness of the activity or organization. We only have 168 hours per week. That's it. We have to make decisions and we must set priorities or we will become immobilized by the opportunities on the one side and do nothing or burn out on the other side by doing too much.

So what's a Christian to do? (And yes, I believe we need to approach all of life through the eyes of our relationship with God through Jesus. We are to be stewards of God's gifts which include our opportunities.) Here are three things to think about:

1. Have a place in your life that keeps you centered on what is eternally important in the midst of temporal demands. Worship is designed to accomplish that priority.

2. Make a time to reinforce and deepen your core Christian values. Times of personal devotion or group study assist in your spiritual growth.

3. Find an avenue to give back. If we aren't giving in some form of service we become spiritually stagnant.

Remember the words of Jesus from the Sermon on the Mount:

Seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you. Matthew 6:33

We can't do it all for ourselves or our children. But, are we doing what is the most important for life now and for eternity?

A Report Card on the Stewardship of Treasure

As Christians we believe that everything belongs to God and that He has blessed us with incredible gifts from his bountiful riches. In return, He expects us to be good stewards of these gifts. Christian Stewardship, then, is the Spirit-inspired use of our time, talents and treasures.

Throughout the year, your Stewardship Team strives to educate us on the meaning of Christian Stewardship and how we can utilize our time, talents and financial resources to glorify God and show appreciation for the gifts He has showered upon us.

A question arises: How are we doing? Overall, we believe that PCJH and its congregants and staff are doing an extraordinary job in responding to God's generosity. Space does not allow room to report on every aspect of our Stewardship, but some summary comments are appropriate. Sharing of our time through volunteerism is excellent – freely giving of our time at the Church and throughout the community – all in Christian service. Utilizing our God-given talents is expressed in a variety of ways; the choir, teachers, service on committees, and so on. We are blessed with an abundance of service and talent – but there are always opportunities for more – no one needs to feel uncalled.

Now, let's focus on the Stewardship of Treasure – financial resources. How are we doing in this area? As you know, God has blessed our community with significant wealth and a wonderful spirit of generosity. How does this translate into Christian Stewardship at PCJH?

In this area of Stewardship, your Stewardship Team sees two areas of responsibility. Responsibility on the part of the congregation, through giving, and responsibility on the part of the Church organization (staff and volunteers) to best utilize the gifts that are received.

How has giving been? Your Church Finance Team prepares a budget each year derived from our mission to "Pass on the Faith." This budget includes an expectation as to the offerings to be received and the expenditures to be made to achieve our God-centered goals.

In 2009 and 2010, during difficult economic times, the actual offerings exceed budget by \$120,000 and \$102,000 respectively (based on offering budgets of \$729,000 and \$800,000). The congregation has indeed been generous. A grade of at least "A" on giving.

(Always the cautionary note for 2011. Because we receive over a third (33%) of our annual offerings in the months of November and December, we continue to pray that this year will be as fruitful as the past several years.)

Turning to the PCJH organization (staff and volunteers), during the 2009 and 2010 periods, the Church's expenses were below budget by \$55,000 and \$34,000 respectively. Also, an "A" grade on utilizing the gifts we received. And we are on track to come in under budget in 2011.

Now let's turn to the debt side of our responsibilities. When we quietly began the Debt Payoff Campaign in mid-2010, the total debt remaining from the construction of the Church expansion was \$1,656,000. We anticipate that this balance, through pledge payments and other gifts will be approximately \$1,200,000 at year end 2011 – a reduction of over \$450,000. This is an excellent start in removing the debt from our balance sheet.

We have also restructured our debt and significantly reduced our required interest payments. The June Pinnacle reports on these events. Interest on our Church Expansion Debt was \$53,000 in 2009, and will be only \$9,000 in 2011. Again, excellent progress.

In conclusion, we want to publicly acknowledge and give thanks to God and thank you, God's people, for your ongoing support of the ministry and mission of this church.

Agros Founder, Skip Li, to visit PCJH on October 16th

You won't want to miss worship on Sunday, October 16th! We have the incredible opportunity to hear from Skip Li, the founder of Agros International. Many of you know that we are in the final steps of discerning whether God is calling PCJH to partner with Agros in international mission work. We sent a team of seven people from PCJH last April to go on a "Vision Trip" with Agros to Guatemala in order for us to listen to God's call and see Agros in action "on the ground." All seven of us came away from our "Vision Trip" with a strong sense that God is calling PCJH to journey with one of Agros' villages in Guatemala. We feel so strongly about it, that we asked Skip Li, the founder of Agros, to come to PCJH to preach at both our 8:00am and 10:15am services on October 16th. He will also hold an Agros orientation at the 9:00am adult education hour where you can ask him questions. It is our hope that you all will be inspired and excited about the possibility of journeying with a village in Guatemala. It won't only change the lives of people in these villages, but we are confident it is also going to dramatically change our lives here at PCJH.

About Skip Li...

In 1982 Skip Li began pursuing a call he received from God to help the rural poor in developing countries. He helped them to buy their own farmland and to build economic self-sufficiency through farming that land. That dream has blossomed into a Christian non-profit organization known today as Agros International. Agros has helped create over 37 communities so far in rural areas of Guatemala, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Honduras, and Mexico. In a number of these communities, people who could never have dreamed of owning their own farm land have successfully repaid their land loans and received title to their land. Many have experienced the redeeming love of Christ through Agros.

Skip has lived in Asia, Australia, and Latin America, and speaks fluent Mandarin Chinese and Spanish. He obtained his undergraduate degree in political science from Seattle Pacific University (Pastor Paul's alma mater), and his law degree from the University of Washington (Pastor Ben's alma mater). He also did graduate studies in international politics at George Washington University. Early in his career Skip was deeply involved in politics, and from 1973 to 1976 served as legal counsel to Washington Governor Dan Evans. After that experience, Skip returned to Seattle and founded ELM law firm in 1977 where he continues to work today as an attorney.

In June 2000, Seattle Pacific University awarded him an honorary doctorate in Humane Letters. He was also awarded an honorary doctorate in Divinity from Bakke Graduate University in 2006. Skip and his wife are members of University Presbyterian Church in Seattle, WA where they minister to college students. Skip and his wife have four children and three beautiful granddaughters.

PEACEMAKING OFFERING World Communion Sunday




