Transition

Over the next weeks PCJH will be experiencing a number of transitions about which you should be aware. These two suggestions were made by the team of leaders at the Interim Pastor's Training Event which Paul attended in March. There was wisdom born from experience in their recommendation and these suggestions were approved by the Elders. They are:

- 1) "Paul, you have made too large of a period during which you 'might' depart (May 15-August 31 you may recall). You need to set a specific date and then stick to it. As a result Paul selected June 1 to be his final day since it was the 20th Anniversary of the first Sunday of worship for PCJH.
- 2) They said, "If the succession model is approved (which it was by vote of the congregation on April 27 and the Presbytery of Wyoming on May 3), you need to establish at least a month between when Paul ends his ministry and when the new Senior Pastor will begin. This will allow the congregation to grieve and begin to anticipate the new leadership. As a result, Ben and Addie will be gone following worship on June 8 and not be back until Ben conducts worship on July 6.

During Ben's absence, the Church Council felt it important to have an experienced pastor available to assist in worship, provide direction for the staff, and be present in the life of the church, in the event of a crisis. Rev. Dr. Steve Shive, the General Presbyter for the Presbytery of Wyoming has graciously made himself available to fill that role for us during this period.

All transitions are a time to pull together, coordinate forces, refocus lives, to insure that what is important continues uninterrupted. As the congregation of PCJH, let's do that. Make prayer for PCJH a priority. Make attending worship a priority. Step up and step out in serving the Lord.

Foundations

Over these last few weeks of Terri and my time in Jackson, I will be preaching a series of sermons on the Foundations upon which PCJH has been built. What do I mean by foundations? I mean the operational values upon which our ministry and mission is built. Here is an example.

Last week (April 27) I shared the first foundation stone:

We view every person as valued in God's eyes and our own.

To me this sounds like such a simple truth upon which to build our 3G mission. Scripture teaches us that

Human beings are created in the image of God. Genesis 1:26. And that

God so loved the world that he gave his only son... John 3:16

Every person, young or older, Republican, Democrat or Independent, Christian, Buddhist or Atheist, American, Chinese, or Nicaraguan, and every other person is to be valued because God has already declared, "I love them. They are created in my image."

Valuing a person who looks like us, smells like us, values similar things like us is easy. Valuing people who don't fit our mold is difficult. How do we do that? When you are either given the opportunity or you make the opportunity

1. Introduce yourself and then find out their name.
2. Be curious about their life. Where are they from? What brought them to the place where you 'connected? How are they feeling about being there? Etc.

One of the exercises I was told to do when I did some training with the Institute for Reality Therapy was to write out three questions for each statement a person made when they were in counseling. Don't take the first statement as the whole story. Search. Explore. Get to know the person.

3. Value what they tell you.
4. As appropriate, share from your own life.
5. Pray for them when God brings them to your mind.
6. If you meet them at Church, introduce yourself, invite them to put on a name tag, introduce them to one or two other people, show them around the facility.

Traditionally people saw the church as "The House of God," one of God's places, so, how would Jesus 'welcome them in? "Go thou and do likewise!!"

Danger

We should not approach this value naively. It would be Heaven if every person saw themselves as a child of God and knew they were valued in God's eyes and our own. It would be Heaven if we "loved one another as God in Christ has loved us." But we/they don't. There is evil (living in opposition to God who loves us) in this world. Jesus told his disciples to be "wise as serpents yet gentle as doves" (Matt. 10:16). Jesus who lived this value perfectly was killed by evil people who were threatened by this type of powerful love of others. We saw this evil rear its ugly and violent head when an evil man killed our friend and member, Karen Colclough last month in Nicaragua. However,

if we withdraw from this foundation,
if we stop viewing others as valued in God's eyes and our own,
if we stop loving as Jesus loved,
if we stop being the salt of the earth and the light of the world,

then we are allowing fear to dominate us and we are abandoning a central element of our faith.

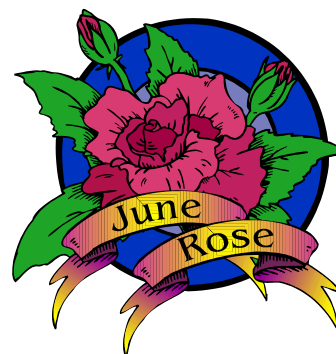
Triumph

What does Easter mean? Evil, real as it may be, is not the final word. Resurrection is!! And we are Easter people!! To value another person, to love like Jesus loved is risky. To "**Grow** to know and follow Jesus" means we must take risks.

My prayer for PCJH is that we will continue to have God's eyes and Jesus' heart for each person we meet. May this core value exude from every 'encounter within the walls of this church and 'wherever the Lord may lead us.

SEARCH PROCESS BEGINS FOR NEW ASSOCIATE PASTOR

With Pastor Ben set to be PCJH's new senior pastor, we need to begin the process of calling an associate pastor. The common process within PCUSA, for a church our size with an associate pastor vacancy, is for the Church Council (made up of the Elders; formerly called Session) to direct the Personnel Team to spend 2 to 3 months searching for a "Designated Associate Pastor" who could be hired for a designated period of time (one to five years). If the congregation later decided they would like to call this person to fill the permanent associate pastor position, they could do so by majority vote of the Council and the congregation, and then a $\frac{3}{4}$ vote of Presbytery.

If, on the other hand, the Designated Associate Pastor turned out not to be the right fit for the permanent position, the congregation could appoint an Associate Pastor Search Committee to conduct a search for other candidates. In other words, this option simplifies and expedites the process for a church to "try on" a candidate for the permanent position.

The Committee of Ministry (COM) of the Presbytery of Wyoming suggested we consider this option, which we did. At their May Council meeting, your Elders voted unanimously to go this route. They approved a job description and compensation package for a "Designated Associate Pastor of Adult Ministries, Mission, and Congregational Care" who would be hired for up to two years. Council then directed the Personnel Team, supplemented by other church members, to conduct a search for candidates. COM quickly voted to support both the position and the search. Since Pastor Ben is going to need help running the church sooner rather than later, the Council would like to bring on this individual by September. Once they are here, we will all have the chance to evaluate whether or not he or she might be the right person for PCJH to call as our permanent associate pastor.

This is an extremely important position in our church. Please pray that God will help guide and direct PCJH and its leaders as we work towards calling our next associate pastor.

SAYING GOOD-BYE



This last week we found out that PCJH Music and Facilities Director Bill Hungate has decided to end his time in Jackson. Bill's last day at PCJH will be June 30. Even though his plans have not totally solidified there are some exciting possibilities, including his acceptance with honors in a Masters music program at the University of Colorado in Denver. Please keep Bill, his wife Luna, daughter Zoya, and his mom in your prayers.

Bill brought his gifts to PCJH in the Fall of 2000 shortly after we had moved from Jackson Hole Middle School to our new facility. 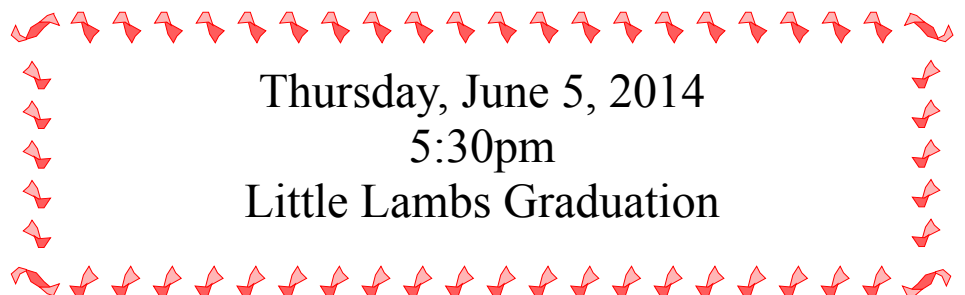

APRIL AGROS SERVICE TRIP – MOVING FORWARD



The tragic loss of Karen Colclough, on the April Agros service trip, has certainly had a profound impact on many people. As the people who were so very privileged to have spent the last week of Karen's life with her, we know that Karen would want us to share with you how God has blessed Tierra Nueva and PCJH's relationship with that village.

Our trip started on the afternoon of April 5th with a flight from Jack-

son to Houston and a very quick connection to Managua arriving around 9 PM. The next morning we gathered at the hotel for breakfast and devotional time and took a quick tour of Managua with our translator Adrian and driver Oscar while waiting for the arrival of Agros staff members Anne & Claire who were part of our team. Upon their arrival we were off to Matagalpa where we would be staying the next four nights. As is the custom, after settling in, we sorted out all of our arts & crafts supplies, planned our schedule of activities for the next four days and practiced some worship songs in English and Spanish.

On Monday morning we settled into what would become our routine for the next four mornings – early morning devotional and breakfast, on the bus by around 7:45, a couple of stops along the way for supplies and a stop at the Agros office in Tuma, arriving at the village around 10 AM.

As we've come to expect, the villagers were out in full force to greet us on the first day. The three of us who were returning for the fourth time, Debbie, Michael & Bob, were welcomed back like the family we have all become. The rookies soon witnessed first hand that the love of the people of Tierra Nueva is very powerful and quickly realized why we traveled so far to be with these people. As is the custom the villagers had prepared a formal program to welcome us complete with scripture, prayers, singing and dance.

Each day was filled with many arts & crafts projects for the kids, some small work projects, ball games and most importantly conversations facilitated by Adrian and through frequent referrals to our pocket dictionaries. Each day we shared a lunch at the home of a different village family. These were very special times as we discussed the family's experience with Agros, their personal history and their aspirations for the future. It was great to see how their houses were organized and decorated and to witness the pride that they all had in their new homes. In another gathering for women only, the link between the PCJH women's bible study group and the Tierra Nueva women was established.

However, the true highlight of the trip was the dedication of the new elementary school. This was made possible through a combination of private funding and a collaboration with BuildOn.org, an organization that has built about 600 schools around the world. This school is a relatively simple concrete block structure with three classrooms that will serve up to 120 children. The morning of the dedication there was a formal ceremony honoring all of the work teams that had helped to build the school in just six weeks, comments from a BuildOn.org representative, the raising of the Nicaraguan flag, children in formation singing the national anthem and finally an actual ribbon cutting ceremony.

To put the opening of this school in perspective you have to go back to the start of the village and our first service team trip in April, 2012. The villagers were living in makeshift shelters, there was no potable water, the road to the village was virtually undriveable and crops were just being planted after major ground clearing efforts. Many families were living apart while the men worked in the village to make conditions liveable for their families. In our initial ceremony where PCJH and Tierra Nueva signed an agreement of support, one of the village leaders remarked that one of the biggest changes in their lives through Agros was that they now had to embrace the concept of HOPE for the future – a word they had no prior experience using.

Witnessing the dedication of this school showed us all how infectious the concept of HOPE is once the seeds have been planted. Talking with the villagers many expressed how they viewed their children's education as a top priority. In speaking with children at our lunches about their dreams several responded that they wanted to be a doctor, lawyer or translator like Adrian. At another time the village leaders and a representative from the Ministry of Education shared with us their plans for an entire school campus including a teacher's apartment, a preschool, a five room high school and a recreational field. Not many of these villagers would have ever thought this was possible before becoming part of Agros.

This is why we spend the time and money to support Agros and the village of Tierra Nueva. We will never understand why we lost Karen so tragically. But, as is expressed in the sticker that Karen's friends have created, if we are to move forward and LIVE LIKE KAREN, we need to continue this important ministry. All of this service team and many other alumni are planning a return visit. We hope that many more people will join us as we do so to support our brothers and sisters in Tierra Nueva and to honor the memory of Karen.

It is amazing! It’s BIG!

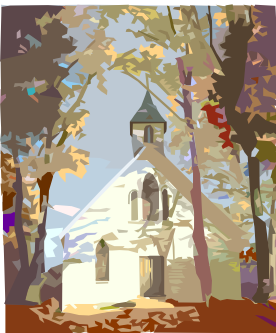

Centro de Vida Cristiana

As some of you know, the PCJH Church Council approved a local Hispanic church called *Centro de Vida Cristiana*, to meet at PCJH on Thursday and Saturday evenings in the Genesis room for worship and bible study. *Centro de Vida Cristiana* is a new congregation that was outgrowing their pastor’s apartment unit where they used to worship. 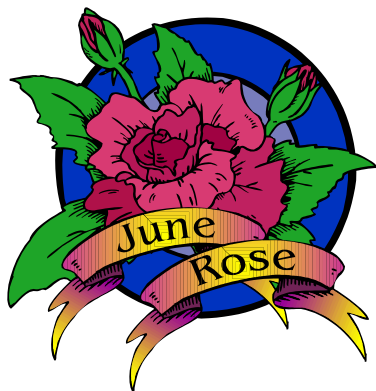
