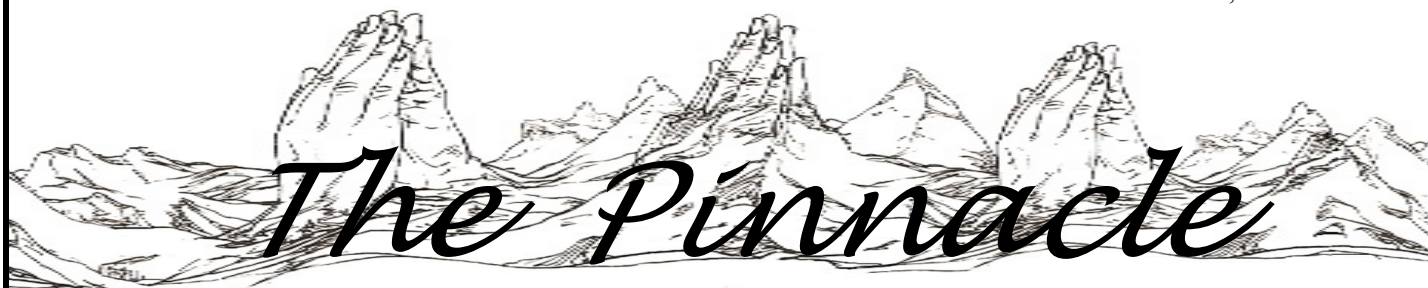

Recap of the Congregational Retreat

The Congregational Retreat on October 3-4 was a wonderful event that sparked some great reflection and discussion. There were about 50 people in attendance both days. Our retreat facilitator, Rev. Dr. Ken McFayden, did an exceptional job facilitating reflection and discussion about our past and our future as a church. Friday night's focus was on "Facing our Past." After a time of worship, Ken McFayden led a reflection about the defining points of PCJH's past and attendees had a chance to reflect on what first drew them to PCJH and what keeps them engaged. It was a time of celebrating our past and God's faithfulness to this congregation.

Saturday's focus was on "Finding our Future." McFayden preached during morning worship and led everyone through a reflection about vision for the future. Pastor Ben presented a report based on the PCJH long range planning committee's findings from 2013 and led us through a time of articulating various old and new priorities and initiatives that people would like to see PCJH focus on in the coming years. We broke up into small groups for the majority of the morning and early afternoon to discuss and develop a plan of action for these various priorities and initiatives. The Ruling Elders will be taking the long range plan findings from 2013 and the small group discussions from our retreat in order to develop an official long range plan to be presented to the congregation at our annual meeting in February 2015.

Thank you to those who participated and for those who were praying for the retreat. We hope to have more congregational retreats in the near future.

A WORD FROM ASSOCIATE PASTOR STEVE WEBER

Dear PCJH Friends,

There's a well-worn preacher story about a little old man who was seen every Sunday walking to church. He had some years before he lost most of his hearing, so he could not hear a word of the sermon, or the music of the choir, or the hymns sung by the congregation. A scoffer asked him, "Why do you spend your Sundays in that church when you can't hear a word?"

He replied, "I want my neighbors to know which side I'm on."

The past month has brought me once again back to the goodness of that conviction. Entering into the PCJH expression of the family of God has been like drinking from a cool stream or maybe better, coming home to discover you have walked in on a dinner party with all your favorite people gathered around a vast table. It's only been a few weeks since Cindy and I joined you in ministry here but already we are grateful to be on your side. There has been such warmth and promise of friendship at every turn we keep saying to each other, "Can you believe how all this has worked out?"

If I had a beard I might feel a bit like old Aaron, the trusty, mouthpiece sidekick to Moses. Psalm 133 says it all:

Then there was that near rundown on the street as Cindy and I walked along and a mystery car abruptly swerved to a stop with a radiant PCJH friend jumping out just to say hello and welcome. Ahhh, the precious oil of God's people living together in unity. How fun is that?

The Swiss physician and author, Paul Tournier, once wrote, "No one can develop freely in this world and find a full life without feeling understood by at least one person." If not already, we have caught a glimpse at least, that this gathering of Christ's followers is a community where we will feel understood by many and will find full life.

Perhaps what this time is all about is much what the sentimental, affectionate apostle John spoke of, "No one has ever seen God," he wrote; "but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us" (1 John 4:12). I like believing that how we are together has quite a bit to do with our sense of "completeness" as people. In my individual heartedness I can be stoic and self-determined, and it is often tempting to go it alone. Yet, John's words call out to me and remind me how much fuller and complete life is when I am on your side.

Again, thank you for welcoming us into your lives and hearts. How good it is when God's people live together in unity!

As you have already heard, it is with great excitement that I announce to you that the PCJH Council unanimously approved our search committee's recommendation to call Rev. Steve Weber as our next associate pastor!! As many of you know, we have been in the search process for a temporary associate pastor for over four months. During those four months we received 20 applications and Rev. Steve Weber rose to the top as the person we felt God calling to PCJH for such a time as this.

Over the course of his career, Steve has served as pastor at three different Presbyterian churches in the western United States. Most recently he served as senior pastor at Mt. Vernon Presbyterian Church in Washington. Steve has also served as a Navy Chaplain all over the world. Steve loves the mountains and is an avid outdoorsman.

Steve's role as associate pastor at PCJH is to provide leadership for adult ministries, mission, and congregational care. Steve is an excellent writer and Bible teacher; he and his wife, Cindy, have a love for mission; and his training and experience as a Navy Chaplain has given him great skills for caring effectively for a congregation. We are blessed to have Steve as one of our pastors.

Per the Presbyterian Book of Order, a temporary pastor is hired by the local church council for up to 12 months which can be renewed for an additional 12 months with approval from Presbytery. The Book of Order also allows for a temporary pastor to become an installed (permanent) pastor if the congregation so desires and with a $\frac{3}{4}$ vote from Presbytery.

We are delighted to have Steve join the team at PCJH. We are blessed to have such an incredible man as our associate pastor. Thank you for the prayers during this time of discernment. Following is a letter from Steve Weber. Blessings!!

Dear New Friends of PCJH,



When Cindy (she's my bride) was a girl in middle school her father served with the National Park Service and the family lived at Beaver Creek in Moose. Ask her about her first job cleaning the Chapel of the Transfiguration. Each morning she would catch the school bus into Jackson. The Tetons have been a part of the backdrop of our lives for many years, always with the hope that perhaps one day we would spend more than just vacations here. This summer Cindy applied for a nursing instructor position with Central Wyoming College's Jackson-based program. On September 1 we moved into our new home in the Teton Valley, just over the pass, from where Cindy now commutes via the START bus.

My favorite line these last few weeks has been, "Hey, Cindy, when you were a girl you rode the bus to school in Jackson. Now you are all grown up and you ride the bus to school in Jackson!"

We are thrilled to be here, of course. We meet new people and typically the first question we are asked is, "You have been here in the winter, right?" We have, and speaking for both of us, we say, "Bring it on!" We enjoy all the seasons and the mountain activities that come with them, but we especially love the white season. So, no worries, mate, as our Australian son-in-law would say.

Our decision when Cindy was offered her teaching position here was that I would follow her this time around. After 35 years of moving to follow my work, education, and ministry as a pastor and Navy chaplain we prayed for God's leading in this move more than ever. Now God is bringing us together with all of you at PCJH. We can hardly believe how this is all working out. That Romans 8 verse about "all things working for the good of those who love God" seems to have been written for times such as these. Of course as we read the rest of chapter 8 we come to understand the crucible of life in which God claims us as His own through Jesus own redeeming love on the cross, and we know that wherever we land in life, even in the beauty of the Tetons, our purpose and contentment is ultimately in Christ alone. We are anxious to share that adventure of faith and mission with you all.

Our lives have been graciously marked forever by four children, now mostly on their own. We hope you will meet Luke and his wife, Leah, who live in Pensacola, Florida. Some of you may have already seen Melissa and her husband, Mic (the Aussie), and their two little ones, Eliza and Gabriel, who had a great time in the nursery a few Sundays ago. They live in Mount Vernon, Washington where I served as pastor of the Presbyterian Church. Our other daughter, Laura, lives with her husband, Brandon, in Anchorage where they serve in the Air Force and are expecting a child in February. That would be three grandkids for those who are counting. Stand by for photos. Our other son, Jeff, is 20 and living, working, racing mountain bikes, skiing and going to college off and on in Bellingham, Washington. You will definitely see him.

I have never been an associate pastor but I have sure wanted one. I have served congregations in northern Idaho, California and Washington as well as Navy chapel communities. I continue on for a few more years as a Reserve Chaplain, serving as the Deputy Command Chaplain for I Marine Expeditionary Force at Camp Pendleton. In each setting I have valued the team of people I have served with and look forward to teaming with Ben and the PCJH staff in a way that honors God and encourages us all to strengthen our hope in Christ.

Thank you for this opportunity to serve the Jackson community with you. Can you believe it? I guess we can as we are in the believing business. Our God, the Psalms remind us, "never slumbers nor sleeps." God, I know, is wide awake and seemingly delights in setting up something new in our midst. I can't wait to meet you all and discover many new things about our life in Christ together.

Beginning November 5 after Dinner (6:45 p.m.)

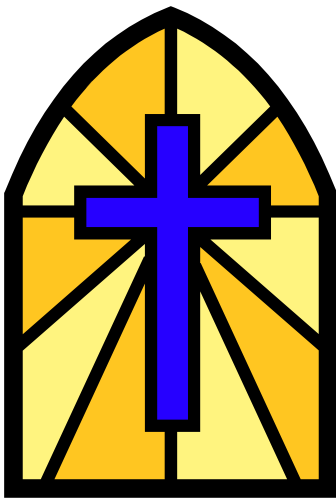


Courageous: A Guy's Study: Pastor Ben Pascal will lead this course for men of all ages. We will look at the important issues and themes which spring from the 2011 movie *Courageous*. The film is about four law officers who discover leading a family takes even more bravery than fighting crime!

Courageous captures the heart of the father, calling him to Christ as he seeks to be a better dad. This is a great class for new dads; dads sort of in the middle; dads who might even be grand-dads; and men who hope to be dads someday. Inclusive! We will study scripture related to this helpful topic and have lots of time for discussion. Dinner and a movie. What could be better?

C.S. Lewis and The Screwtape Letters: Pastor Steve Weber will lead this course in which we will read and reflect on this revealing, important book for our times, and for our journey of faith. By means of an imaginary correspondence between a senior tempter, Screwtape, and a junior devil, Wormwood, C.S. Lewis gives us penetrating insights into how the unseen powers of evil work to ensnare and destroy those who seek to follow Christ. For Lewis, it is not so much that we must be delivered from demons that possess and control us; it is that we are constantly and quietly influenced by them. The demons are eager to corrupt and pollute, dissuading godly choices which cultivate faith and virtue. And Christians are not immune; indeed they are the primary target. In his famous sermon, "The Weight of Glory," Lewis noted that there are no ordinary people; we are all becoming either eternal wonders or eternal horrors. Similarly, the Letters show that there are no ordinary actions. It is a battle all the way from here to heaven. Along with discussing the book, we will have the opportunity to hear from Dr. Jerry Root, a C.S. Lewis scholar and adjunct professor of Christian Formation & Ministry at Wheaton College in Illinois via streaming video. Books will be provided on the first evening of the class. Join us!

Sundays at 9:00am Class



The Gospel of Matthew in the Genesis Room: Among the Gospels, Matthew is unique in containing the substance of all Christ's teachings. Here we find Jesus' radical claims to what it means to follow as a disciple, to obey the will of God, and Jesus' ethical call to the church community to live out the faith with conviction. Matthew is the bridge gospel between the Old and New Testaments and is a straight-forward, orderly approach to revealing how our salvation history culminates in the Christ events told here. Most scholars believe Matthew's Gospel was first a systematic theology textbook for early believers to understand how Jesus fits into our faith history. So it covers all the bases. Pastor Steve will lead a long, figurative walk (Matthew is 28 chapters long) through this gospel, but do it a bit at a time each Sunday. Come and join us each Sunday morning.

Do-It-Ourselves Advent Devotional Book: We can do this! Let's write our own book as we prepare for the coming of Christmas. *The Coming of Christ* will help us keep pace each day of the Advent season with individually written reflections from people throughout the PCJH community. Here's how it will all come together: On Sundays, November 2 and 9, remember to stop by the display in the lobby and sign up for one day; turn in your advent reflection on the scripture text assigned to your day no later than the next Sunday, November 16. That's it! Your brief (no more than 250 words) devotion will be included in the booklet to be distributed on Sunday, November 23. Look for the display and take a moment to select your day! The best part is then being ushered through the season of Advent by people we know and enjoy so much. The hardest part is to not read ahead. Let's share our hearts and minds with one another this Advent!
