Walking With The Psalms – Sermon Series



A WORD FROM ASSOCIATE PASTOR STEVE WEBER

INSTRUCTIONS FOR A NEW YEAR STARTUP

Whenever our family gets together we often watch a hilarious routine on DVD by our favorite stand-up comic, Brian Regan. His routine has made its way into our everyday conversations and has become the source material for all sorts of inside family jokes. Situations will crop up and we will look at one another, smile knowingly, and then re-tell the joke for one another. One of our favorites is his bit about toasting pop tarts. He is astounded that the pop tart box has instructions: "How do I get all that goodness inside me? Can there really be more than one step to toasting a pop tart? Step One: Toast it." Well, you will just have to watch it for yourself.

So we have a new year before us. Not quite as simple as toasting pop tarts, I suppose. Surely, if pop tarts come with instructions then the totality of 365 new, unblemished, mysterious days of promise and possibility ought to come with some type of easy to follow directions. I know what you are thinking: the revealed Word of God – the Bible – provides such help. I won't argue with you. Nothing wrong with the Bible (and I hope you will include a daily devotional time in your New Year plan), but for our purposes I thought it might be helpful to package some start-up instructions for 2015 in a simple format. So what follows are steps to be completed in order for this upcoming year to be one of meaning and joy:

- 1. Unwrap It By this I mean, treat the New Year as if it really is new and not more of the same. "The old has passed away, the new has come," the apostle Paul wrote of our life in Christ. Here's our opportunity to give that theology a test run. What can you honestly leave behind and what can you embrace with the hope of a new beginning?
- 2. Bless It You know how you talk at the outset of a vacation or a new job? "This is going to be a great trip!" "This is the best job I have ever had!" We need to give our blessing to the year to come. Bless it and it most likely will be.
- **3. Brave It** How's your courage for adventure? A New Year means new challenges. Psalm 27:1 shouts to us on January 1: "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?" We can step boldly into the unknown. God's presence is lighting the way.
- **4. Give It** All the experts in personal health and wholeness agree that one of the key attributes of happy, adjusted people is that they give themselves away to others and to worthy causes. Of course the experts are following the counsel of Jesus: "You're blessed when you care. At the moment of being care-full, you find yourselves cared for" (The Message, Matthew 5).
- 5. Love It Isn't life itself amazing? Get up with the sun. Walk through the woods. Stand on a mountain. Lay down in a field. Wade in the surf. Ski in the moonlight. This year presents some spectacular opportunities to simply be in awe of life itself. I can't wait to see it unfold.
- **6. Trust It** By the sovereign providence of God the New Year will be what it will be. To trust God's will is to relax into the provision of God no matter what. Here's the line I appreciate: "Don't try to make things happen in your own strength. Let God do it His way." (Joel Osteen)
- 7. Believe It There is no time like the present to renew your faith in the One who graciously gives us each dawn. "Choose you this day whom you will serve" (Joshua 24). Every day is a day to believe in the biggest idea ever presented God in Christ has come as the fullest expression of His desire to be united with us, to be our foremost Friend. You might want to start each day by looking in the mirror and simply saying, "Lord, I believe."

Ski Shuttle Outreach - PCJH sits near the base of one of the nation's finest backcountry ski locations. Every day skiers and boarders drive to the top of Teton Pass, leave their vehicles, hike to pristine slopes and slide to the bottom of the pass. You may have seen them there with their thumbs out in hopes someone will stop and give them a lift back to the top of the pass.

Why not us? This month we begin a new outreach ministry by simply using the vehicles God has given us to use in ministry. Our plan is be available to give rides to skiers and boarders back to the top of the pass several Saturday mornings each month during the winter. In this way we can serve others where they are and strike up new friendships with a large community in Jackson Hole.

Want to be a part of this new venture? Come to a brief informational meeting following the 10:15 a.m. worship service on Sunday, January 4, in Pastor Steve's office. We need people who would like to drive the church bus (training provided) up and down the pass. And people who like to do a bit of skiing themselves. Let's go meet our community where it gathers!

Daily Bible Reading Guide – 2015 Is 2015 the year for you to read through the Bible? It may not be as foreboding as we think. Pick up your daily reading guide in the church lobby. Each day of the year has been assigned approximately 3-4 chapters of the Bible (about 10 minutes reading time). You can do it! And you will be glad you did.

Thank you to all our contributors for sharing your faith, hearts and insightful thoughts each day leading up to Christmas. It was so meaningful to read each devotion and to come to know you all better in this way. Let's plan to write another booklet next Advent! Thank you all.

Sunday Morning Adult Classes

January sees the continuation of two classes at 9 a.m. each Sunday morning:

- Strength for His People: Kathy Robertson leads this study for individuals and families of the mentally ill. It meets in the Matthew classroom. Based on the book by Dr. Stephen Waterhouse the course seeks to provide a place of hope and encouragement while also providing help to equip families and the church who struggle with mental illness. January's classes will focus on four topics:
 - o Jan. 4: Mental Illness is not a Myth
 - o Jan. 11: Family and Society Responses
 - o Jan. 18: Mental Illness and the Bible
 - o Jan. 25: Where Do We Go From Here?
- The Gospel of Matthew: Pastor Steve Weber leads this walk through of the first book of the New Testament. It meets in the Genesis classroom. Matthew's gospel narrative focuses on two main themes: Who is Jesus? and "What is the Church?" Currently the group is looking at the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-7. Each class session stands all on its own so it is never too late to come and be a part of the class.

Wednesday Evening Adult Classes

We will offer three great class options at 6:45 p.m. each Wednesday after our Fellowship Dinner:

- <u>Financial Peace University</u>: Colter and Alli Lane will lead the next segment in this vital course based on the best-selling author Dave Ramsey's popular course. The course will meet in the Genesis classroom. FPU teaches God's ways of handling money. Through video teaching, class discussions and interactive small group activities, FPU presents biblical, practical steps to get from where you are to where you've dreamed you could be. This plan will show you how to get rid of debt, manage your money, spend and save wisely, and much more!
