Dear PCJH Family,

I recently met with someone who commented that at PCJH we seem to talk a lot about Jesus. While I don't want PCJH to have a reputation as crazy "Jesus Freaks, I was happy to hear that we were talking about Jesus to the point that people notice. We must never forget that Jesus is at the center of our faith. The word "Christian" includes the word "Christ." We are Christ-ones. Therefore, we will be focusing on Jesus during Lent as we journey to Easter.

Ash Wednesday is on February 18th and is the beginning of Lent. As we approach Ash Wednesday, we remember how Jesus was tempted in the desert by Satan. It was a time of preparation for Jesus before he began his ministry. Lent is the six week period leading up to Easter, which is on April 5th. Lent is a time when we reflect on Jesus' ministry and a time to prepare our hearts for Holy Week.

During Lent we will be doing an all-church study entitled "I Am Jesus". It will begin on Ash Wednesday and end on Easter Sunday.

In the Old Testament book of Exodus, Yahweh speaks to Moses and declares, "I am who I am." In the Gospel of John, Jesus makes seven "I am" statements. They are profound statements about Christ's identity. The seven "I am" statements of Jesus are...

- 1. I am the light of the world
- 2. I am the bread of life
- 3. I am the gate
- 4. I am the vine
- 5. I am the good shepherd
- 6. I am the way, the truth, and the life
- 7. I am the resurrection and the life

We will focus our sermons on these "I am" statements from February 18th to April 5th. We invite everyone in the congregation to participate in this all church study. Pastor Steve is creating a small group study guide to go along with the sermon series. If you are already in a small group, we invite you to take a break from whatever you are studying and do the all-church study with your existing small group. If you are not already in a small group, we will provide opportunities for new small groups to form for the duration of our all church study. Look for more information on signing up for a small group in the coming weeks.

I hope you take this time to join with others at PCJH to dig deep into God's word and focus on who Jesus claimed to be. It will be a great journey together as we prepare for Holy Week and ultimately, Easter Sunday!




Mark Morzov talking to the High School Youth Group

** Our February Bible memory verse is: "How wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ." Ephesians 3:18





A WORD FROM ASSOCIATE PASTOR STEVE WEBER

Working on a Family Resemblance

Years ago, during my college years, one of the strangest things happened while I was on a semester-long study tour in France. For six weeks of that semester, our group lived in a small, farming village in southern France learning the language, eating pastries, playing pickup basketball games against much shorter Frenchmen, eating baguettes and wearing dapper little chapeaus. No photos, fortunately, have survived the long march of time.

Now, the strange thing. First, you need to know that two years before, one of my brothers, Dave, also participated in a college study tour to France and spent time in the very same French village. Well, one evening some of us were invited by some local college age people we had met to a bonfire gathering on the edge of town in a farmer's barnyard. That night we told stories around the fire and worked on Franco-American relations. Late in the evening one of the Frenchmen came over and sat next to me. Using French and English I understood him to ask me, "Do you have a brother?" I thought he was simply asking ice-breaker type questions that I would understand in my limited French so I replied, "Trois! I have three frères." "Non, non, non," he said, "do you have a brother who was here?" I was shocked. How did the question even come to his mind? Either he assumed that all Americans are related to each other or there was something in my features that reminded him of a person he had seen two years earlier. I suppose we do look like brothers. Another time I was on the street in front of his house in San Diego and met his neighbor who immediately said, "You must be Dave's brother!" And Cindy often remarks, "O, you sound just like Dave!"

There comes with such moments a mix of thought: I come from somewhere ... Does he hear the same comments ... I'm part of a family ... Do I really look like him ... Sure hope he doesn't mind resembling his kid brother. Who do you resemble? Families often carry certain physical or personality traits between their members. It makes me wonder about the traits shared among us, in what the Bible refers to as the "family of believers." Peter's words to the young church were words of urgency and courage to strive intently to "love the family of believers" in a time of persecution and hardship. "You are God's own people ... once you were not a people, but now you are God's people" (1 Peter 2). Part of God's redeeming action in Jesus was to give us new birth into this new family. People who were strangers are now brothers and sisters in a way that can be just as meaningful as the ones we grew up with.

As a pastor, one of the best aspects of being around this "new" family, is observing family traits. Here at PCJH, Cindy and I have both commented in our first few months about how much hugging goes on around here. I'm working on my technique to be able to resemble the rest of you who have already perfected the warm, friendly greeting. Be patient with me. I come from a long-line of hand shakers. Seriously, we have noticed an engaging, joyful, sincere affinity for one another here. What a great resemblance you have going on! Someday I hope someone says to me, "Hey, are you from that church in Jackson Hole?"

This month we hope to build on our family ties as we come together around the "I Am" claims of Jesus from the Gospel of John and our core value as followers of Christ to "love the family of believers." During the 6-week Season of Lent, we encourage each small group and Bible study to focus its discussion on the "I Am" statements from the Sunday messages. New groups will be forming as well. I'm excited to see how God will continue to shape us, deepening our family traits and connections with one another. I hope you will take this season to fully enjoy being part of the PCJH family.
