In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. ~Philippians 1:2-6

Holy Week

Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week on March 29th, 2015. On Palm Sunday we remember Jesus' triumphal and humble entry into Jerusalem while riding on a donkey. People waved palm branches as a way to welcome him and as a sign of who he was... the Messiah.

The joyous celebration didn't last long. Four days later, one of Jesus' disciples, Judas, betrayed him and arranged for the authorities to arrest him. Maundy Thursday is the day we remember Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples and the night he was betrayed and taken away. This all happened late in the evening while Jesus was praying in the Garden of Gethsemane, and while his disciples dosed off.

Good Friday is the day we remember Jesus being crucified on the cross. It is a day of mourning and darkness as we remember the horrible suffering and death he endured on our behalf.

Saturday is a day in between death and resurrection. It reminds us of the reality of sin and death in our world as we await the hope of new life.

Easter Sunday is the day we remember Jesus rising from the dead. It is a day of celebration and joy as we proclaim the good news of the resurrection. Jesus said, "Behold, I am making all things new!" Amen!

I encourage you all to not let Holy Week slip by this year. We are often tempted to simply go from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, without taking time to consider the cost of the cross. Take some intentional time to engage in the story of Jesus Christ and what he did for humanity... what he did for you. Like every year, we will provide you with many opportunities to make Holy Week a transformational week in your life. Now it's up to you... here is the schedule for PCJH as we celebrate Holy Week in 2015...





Our new Bible verse for April is "Go and make disciples of all nations." Matthew 28:19











A WORD FROM ASSOCIATE PASTOR STEVE WEBER

Making Another Run at Life

This month comes Easter. It is the time for springing forth, beginning again. In our hearts and minds we travel again to the old rugged cross on the outskirts of Jerusalem and there reflect on the life that was given and then in three days' time taken up again in wondrous resurrection. The great Easter truth is, in the words of German theologian, Wolfgang Pannenberg, "The evidence for Jesus' resurrection is so strong that nobody would question it except for two things: First, it is a very unusual event, and second, if you believe it happened, you have to change the way you live."

I love that about Easter. It is such a bold announcement, and in it we are given license to make another run at life, to change the way we live. Have you ever considered why forgiveness is such a big deal in our faith? Of all the points in Christian theology, forgiveness may be the primary idea to wrap our hearts and mind around. First up is to receive forgiveness for ourselves as a result of Jesus standing in for us to absorb the penalty of our sin. Second, is to become forgivers ourselves. "Bear with each other, and forgive whatever grievances you many have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you," the apostle Paul wrote (Colossians 3:13). With this word comes the recognition that we have been hurt and we have caused hurt. It is part of being human. But we are also to take care of the hurt we experience and cause. In fact, forgiveness is apparently just what the doctor ordered. A recent Baltimore Sun article cites new research that forgiveness may be "medicine for the body."

Further, psychologist Loren Toussaint of Luther College in Iowa, has established a long-term link between health and the willingness to forgive. In a national survey he found forgiveness is rare. Only 52 percent of Americans said they had forgiven others for hurtful acts. But willingness of young respondents to forgive showed no link to health; that propensity began to make a difference as respondents approached middle age. The survey found that those 45 and older who forgive others were more likely to report having better overall mental and physical health than those who did not. So, those of us over 45 need to go for a run and begin a forgiveness routine to improve our health. Lewis Smedes, in his book <u>Forgive and Forget</u>, said the act of forgiving is simple, but it always happens "inside a storm of complex emotions. It is the hardest trick in the whole bag of personal relationships." Forgiveness, he wrote, happens in four stages:

- Hurt: When someone causes you pain so deep and unfair you cannot forget it
- **Hate:** When you cannot shake the memory of how much you were hurt and cannot wish your enemy well
- **Healing:** When you are able to see the person who hurt you in a new light
- The Coming Together: When you invite the person who hurt you back into your life and if he or she comes honestly, love can move you both toward a new and healed relationship




