Teton Explorers is a Christian summer day camp for middle schoolers (entering grades 6-9 in the fall) where campers will leave each day equipped with greater friendship and teamwork skills, increased confidence, and a deeper understanding of God's love.

Program

PCJH now offers 3 weeks of our inaugural Teton Explorers Summer Camp, a faith based, summer day program led by Dylan Wade (See Bio). Campers may sign up for one week or all three, however week three is reserved only for campers who have attended week one and/or two. Each week will be unique though the curriculum and activities will build off each other so a commitment to all three weeks would be encouraged and will include a discount (See Tuition).

Teton Explorers will experience a wide variety of safe and fulfilling games, activities, and good old-fashioned fun. Our experienced staff will lead campers on adventures throughout Jackson Hole, from downtown Jackson to our National Forests and Grand Teton National Park. Major activities may include biking, rock climbing/

bouldering, challenge courses, floats down the Snake, hiking, and horseback riding, among others. In addition, campers will participate in a variety of service projects around the valley to enrich their sense of community and outreach. Along those lines, campers will meet and interact with Christian leaders throughout the community to learn how Jacksonians live out their faith. On a daily basis, campers will take part in creative Bible devotions along with initiative game activities designed to build teamwork and



leadership skills. Each day will end with a time to debrief and treasure our experiences and participate in a closing ceremony back at PCJH.

Counselors in Training Program

Payments

A \$50 non-refundable enrollment fee per camper is required at the time of registration. Payment is required with registration. Two options are offered for payments:

- 1. Pay in full at the time of registration
- 2. Pay 50% at registration and the remaining balance by May 31. Remaining balances not paid by May 31 will be processed on the first business day in June with the credit card you have provided online. All other requests for scheduled payments must be made in writing and pre-approved by Diane McGee.

Besides going to various day and overnight camps as a kid, he has spend the last 14 years as a counselor, program staff, outdoor educator, middle school teacher, and is currently a paraprofessional at the Jackson Hole High School during

Dylan, his wife Catherine and two children, Robby (4) and Charlotte (2) moved to Jackson this past summer where Dylan became the J.O.Y. summer camp coordinator.
