Questions for God Questions God Asks Us

As the Israelites journeyed through the desert of Sinai for 40 years, they were sustained by manna that fell from heaven. The manna was like bread that provided sustenance for the Israelites during their long journey through the wilderness. The word "manna" in Hebrew literally means, "What is it?" The very thing that provided nourishment and sustenance came in the form of a question... "What is it?"

Questions are important. We all have them. I personally believe our questions can provide spiritual nourishment as we wrestle with challenging questions about life and faith. I don't know about you, but I am not satisfied with easy answers. I enjoy a relationship with God where I am free to ask questions and in doing so, I grow in my faith. I am saddened when I meet people who no longer ask questions.

Might our questions be an example of our child-like faith that Jesus wants from us? My 5-year-old daughter asks a lot of questions. I delight in her questions as long as she doesn't begin repeating, "why?... why?... why?... why?... why?..." When she has a thoughtful question, I am always happy to discuss her question with her. I believe God welcomes our questions because the Lord knows they will ultimately lead us to God.

What questions do you have for God? Please take time between now and June 14th to write out your questions for God. You can email them to me at bpascal@pcjh.org or you can write your questions on a note and put it in the box in the church lobby. I will compile the questions and pick five to address during the sermon series this summer. However, I'd like to point out that Jesus was asked 183 questions in the Gospels, but he only directly answered three of them!

Have you ever considered that God might also have questions for us? We are always so quick to question God, but maybe we should consider the questions God asks us. In the Bible there are several questions that God asks the people. Here are a few... Where are you? Where is your brother? What is that in your hand? What is your name? What are you doing here? What are you looking for? Who do you say I am? Do you want to get well? Why are you crying? Do you understand what I have done for you?

How would you answer these questions?

Trevor Hudson, in his book *Questions God Asks Us,* writes the following about why God would want to entertain our questions and ask us questions...

- 1. God wants to enter into a conversational relationship with each of us.
- God gives greater dignity to us by allowing us to wrestle with the questions rather than simply giving us the answers.
- 3. A question has greater power to transform us than a straightforward answer.

We will explore questions of faith during our summer sermon series in June, July and August. This summer will be a great time to invite friends to church as we explore some great questions!

Let's continue striving for the vision of **every member a minister** as we work towards our mission to **gather** to love God and others, **grow** to know and follow Jesus, and **go** to make a difference in the world.

Stewardship Update: Last year, as a congregation we were blessed to have exceeded our target for tithes and offerings by over \$10,268 thanks to your extraordinary generosity.

Our target for 2015 is \$908,034, an increase of 3.8% over last year's target and a modest increase of 2.6% from what we actually received last year.

As of the end of April, tithes and offerings to PCJH totaled \$203,025, which was \$4,300 behind where we were at the same time last year. Because our target for 2015 is an increase over 2014, this comparison understates our current shortfall. Factoring that in, we're approximately \$11,000 behind where we should be at this point in the year – not a worrisome amount, but a shortfall.

We have \$705,009 remaining to be raised this year to meet our target towards this year's budget.

Budget Update: As you may recall, PCJH has a budget for 2015 of approximately \$1,000,000, with expenses expected to be greater than revenues by \$27,175.

As of the end of April, PCJH is four months into the 2015 Budget. Expenses are below expected levels for the this time of year by \$22,369.

<u>ABOUT THIS COURSE:</u> This is one of the Great Courses. It is taught via video by a renowned scholar in the area of world religions, Dr. Charles Kimball, a professor in Religious Studies at the University of Oklahoma. He is an ordained Baptist pastor with a Doctor of Theology in Comparative Religions from Harvard University who is a frequent lecturer and expert analyst on issues related to the Middle East, Islam, Jewish-Christian-Muslim relations and the intersection of religion and politics in the United States. He is the author of several books including *Striving Together: A Way Forward in Christian-Muslim Relations*.

What, exactly, is religion? And why does one religious tradition often differ so markedly from another, even when you might not expect it to? Why, for example, are the Abrahamic faiths of Judaism, Christianity, and Islam—despite their common source—often so different? And what kinds of factors separate the beliefs of a Hindu or Buddhist not only from those held by Jews, Christians, or Muslims, or by each other, but also from many who identify themselves as fellow Hindus or Buddhists?



Membership at PCJH is a way for people to publicly proclaim their faith in Jesus Christ and their commitment to the ministry and mission of the local church. Once someone becomes a member of PCJH, they are assigned a deacon who prays and cares for them. Members are also allowed to vote on important matters in the life of the church, serve as deacons, elders, and committee chairs. There are other perks and discounts related to our children, youth, and family fee-based ministries.



"Right now, there are more animals than people," so said our waitress at Wild Bill Cody's old hunting lodge just outside Yellowstone's east gate. Really? I had some sort of loose count going in my head and bipeds were definitely far in the lead compared to the moose, elk, deer, bison, big horn sheep, antelope, marmots, chipmunks we had seen. Actually it was a close race until the big pink bus from Las Vegas pulled in with what sounded like scores of Germans disembarking who were also keeping score.



As tourist season explodes on western Wyoming my first reaction is "Wow! Where did they all come from?" One nuance of developing technology this year is the popularity of the selfie pole and it appears to have made its way to Jackson Hole. Visitors with cell phone Extended on the end of a four foot pole are taking their own photos at the antler arch on town square, before the moose statue at the park visitor center or just before the Teton Range itself. That's a disappointment. Last summer, before coming to serve here at PCJH, I would drop Cindy off at her Center for the Arts office and then head for the Town Square where I served as an unofficial town photographer.
