Mission Team Update:

Did you know Mission accounts for 10% of PCJH's overall budget? With open hearts and a vision to reach those in need in our community and beyond, PCJH has been able to make such meaningful contributions. Many thanks to each and every one of you for supporting all of these outreach areas!

- **Syria Crisis** through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, PCJH recently gave \$3,500 to International Refugee Emergencies to assist our church response in Hungary for Syrians and other displaced persons.
- **Gift of the Heart Kits** over 150 school and hygiene kits sent to those most in need of these Resources.
- Kill the Chill- over 75 winter apparel items already donated through the Community Resource Center.
- Good Samaritan Mission- meals provided the second Thursday of each month by volunteer groups within PCJH.
- **Agros** next mission trip is November 7-15. PCJH makes yearly contributions as part of our seven-year commitment with Tierra Nueva.
- **Missionary support** with Brendan Bryant in China.
- The Table Church is a missional community of doubters + disciples journeying together in inclusive Christianity. PCJH supports this mission as a way to broaden the reach to those in Casper, WY, in non-traditional ways in an informal, inviting setting where everyone is welcome.
- **Turning Point-** we sponsored a table for their fundraising gala in July.
- **Peace Offering-** supporting peacemaking efforts of the Church at every level. 25% of this offering will go to a peacemaking effort that PCJH chooses.
- **Upward Basketball-** continued ministry with approximately 150 current participants.

- Jackson Hole Food Cupboard- collection before Thanksgiving to provide food baskets.
- **Scholarship fund** for those pursuing education for ministry- new opportunity to support those connected to PCJH with various financial needs as they go through Seminary.



Stewardship Update



By the first of November this year, as in years past, we'll have spent over 80% of our budget for the year (because we'll be that far through the year), but will only have received about 55% of our tithes and offerings for the year (because sometimes people wait until the end of the year to give their tithes and offerings).

We would ask that you give prayerful consideration to making further contributions to the our Church at this time in the year toward closing this gap.

There are many ways to give in addition to the moment of contemplation when baskets are passed in worship:

- *You may mail a check to the Church office (please don't send cash through the mail);
- *You may contribute by clicking on the yellow Donate button on the bottom right of the screen on our Church's website PCJH.org.;
- *You may arrange for periodic contributions to be made from your checking account by contacting your bank and asking about "recurring bill pay" or ACH; or
- *You may arrange for one-time or periodic contributions to be made from your credit or debit card accounts by contacting Kim Bogen through the Church office at KBogen@PCJH.org.

We're exploring other giving options.

Last year, as a congregation we were blessed to have exceeded our target for tithes and offerings by over \$10,268 thanks to your extraordinary generosity.

Our target for 2015 is \$908,034, an increase of 3.8% over last year's target and a modest increase of 2.6% from what we actually received last year.

As of the end of October, tithes and offerings to PCJH totalled \$484,999, which was \$43,947 ahead of where we were at the same time last year. Our target for 2015 is an increase of \$22,766 over what we achieved in 2014, so we're on track to achieve our 2015 target, although these next few months are critical to us each year.

Thank you to everyone for their generosity.

We have \$423,035 remaining to be raised this year to meet our target towards this year's budget.

Finance Update

PCJH has a budget of \$1,006,500, with expenses expected to be greater than revenues by \$27,175. As of the end of September, PCJH is nine months into the 2015 Budget. Expenses continue to be below expected levels for this time of year by \$75,129.

Each envelope contains guidelines for writing your devotion and the scripture for your day. All submissions need to be turned in by Sunday, November 15.

Wednesday Evening Classes in November

Join us after dinner on Wednesday evening for several adult class options:

The Story - It is never too late to come to any one of The Story study groups. On Wednesday a group meets in the Genesis room to discuss the week's reading, looking back on the previous Sunday's message in worship. Each study session includes a brief video presentation and guided discussion. Study guides are available.

How To Think Like Jesus - This is a discussion of Brennan Manning's insightful book on the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus' teaching may appear to sound foolish to much of the world but Manning holds that there is an importance to being foolish like Jesus. Let's reflect on this together. Books are available at the class sessions. Financial Peace University - A group interested in financial stability and responsibility meets every Wednesday to participate in this national course by Dave Ramsey. Our own Colter and Alli Lane lead the course.

Sunday Morning Classes

The Story - This Story group gathers to discuss the chapter of The Story which is being preached about on that particular Sunday. The group is always open to new people attending, even if they have not been a part of a group since the start of The Story. It is never too late to come.

The Gospel of Matthew - Our Sunday Bible class is also open to all and each week stands alone meaning one not need be part of the study from the very beginning of Matthew. Pastor Steve leads this class.

A WORD FROM ASSOCIATE PASTOR STEVE WEBER

Lincoln's Disappointment

On November 19, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln delivered those infamous words, "Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth, on this continent, a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal." The Gettysburg Address was delivered to about 15,000 people seated at a new national cemetery in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

It was a foggy, cold morning. Lincoln arrived about 10 a.m. and around noon the sun came out as the crowds gathered on a hill overlooking the battlefield. A military band played, a local preacher offered a long prayer, and the headlining speaker, Edward Everett, spoke for more than two hours. At that time, a two-hour speech was normal. Everett described the Battle of Gettysburg in great detail, and he brought the audience to tears several times.

When Everett finished, Lincoln got up and pulled his speech from his coat pocket. It consisted of 10 sentences, a total of 272 words. Lincoln did not mention any of the specifics of the war or any of the details of the battle of Gettysburg. He did not mention the North or the South. He did not mention slavery. Instead, he explained, in ordinary language, that our nation was founded on the idea that all people are created equal, and we must continue to fight for the principle, in honor of those who have died fighting for it.

Unfortunately for Lincoln, the audience was distracted by a photographer setting up his camera, and by the time Lincoln had finished his speech and sat down, the audience didn't even realize he had spoken. Lincoln was disappointed in his performance, but the next day Edward Everett told the president, "I wish that I could flatter myself that I had come as near to the central idea of the occasion in two hours as you did in two minutes." The speech was reprinted in newspapers around the country, and it went on to become one of the most important speeches in American history. (Information from *The Writer's Almanac*).

This bit of history is surprising to me. How could something that appeared like failure make such a lasting impact on the heart and soul of the nation? Everyday there are contributions we make to the workings of our community, our families, our world and to the lives of people we encounter. It is tempting to believe that what we do hardly makes an impact. Yet, history is on our side when we say, "Everything matters." It is amazing to me that a speech hardly anyone heard helped shape a nation. Just think how much our contact with children, youth, colleagues, family members and others affects their confidence and stability and direction. One little word can lift a life. One small vision can shape a nation.

We may not be delivering the Gettysburg Address as part of our duties but what we do has every possibility of lending hope and strength to someone. Let us never believe that our service and our work is not important or is not making a difference. If one of the most important speeches in history was barely heard and yet still shaped our nation just think how far-reaching our efforts in helping others can be. You never know ...

"All a person's ways seem pure to them, but motives are weighed by the Lord. Commit to the Lord whatever you do and he will establish your plans." Proverbs 16:2-3
