

A WORD FROM PASTOR BEN PASCAL

Every Member a Minister

Dear PCJH Family,

Happy New Year! I pray that 2016 will be a year of harvest as we welcome new people into the life of the church and introduce them to Jesus. After all, it is Jesus who makes all things new. May 2016 be a year of new beginnings and new life!

Do you have friends, family members or coworkers who don't know Jesus? Have you ever wondered if there was something you could do to encourage that person to experience God's life transforming love in Christ? Well... there is definitely something you can do! You can share your own personal story of how God has impacted your life. Sharing our stories is probably the most effective way of sharing the good news of God's love in Christ.

A passage of Scripture that has helped me understand our responsibility as Christians in sharing the good news comes from 1 Peter 3:15...

"But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect."

The first and most important part of sharing the good news is making sure that you have good news to share in the first place... that comes from having a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as Lord of your life. When you have an authentic relationship with God, people notice and they start asking you questions. They become curious as to the hope that you have and your perspective on life and death and the world to come.

Peter says that we should always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. Are you prepared to answer people's questions about your faith and your relationship with Christ? If not, I have even more good news for you!

PCJH will be hosting a workshop on Friday evening, January 29th and Saturday, January 30th. We have a special guest, Rev. Dr. Ray Jones, from the PC(USA) Office of Evangelism coming out to lead the workshop. Ray is a phenomenal pastor who will help us to find new ways to engage our community and our church with the purpose of sharing God's good news in Jesus Christ.

The workshop is called **Engage** and it has been well received throughout the denomination and other Wyoming churches in our Presbytery. One of the things I love about *Engage* is that it fulfills that last part of 1 Peter 3:15... with gentleness and respect. We all have had experiences with Christians who have been rude and forceful in their sharing of the good news. The *Engage* curriculum is an effective evangelism training that will help you to be prepared to share God's great news with gentleness and respect.


As you probably already know, the Christian faith is declining in the United States. I think part of the reason for this is that we don't know how to share our faith. When was the last time you shared your faith with someone? When was the last time we had an adult baptism at PCJH? How will we continue to make disciples of Jesus Christ if we don't first share our stories of good news?

We are only one generation away from people not knowing Christ. In the Old Testament book of Judges, we see the negative impact when a generation of people don't know God...

"After that whole generation had been gathered to their fathers, another generation grew up, who knew neither the Lord nor what he had done for Israel. Then the Israelites did evil in the eyes of the Lord and served other gods." -Judges 2:10-11

I pray that you sense the importance of sharing our faith with others. In fact, it is part of our PCJH mission statement: Passing on the Faith! Let's get together on January 29th-30th to learn more and get equipped for sharing God's amazing love with others.

PCJH is excited to host the upcoming Engage Conference provided by Presbyterian Church (USA) which presents a new evangelism approach to help churches become relevant again. As congregations using Engage learn how to share their story and faith journey, they attract people to join them in following Jesus— in God's mission of transformation in neighborhoods and communities. The conference will cover topics to equip us to give our testimony of God's work in our lives and organically discuss our transformation through God's love.

<u>Who?</u> Members, Regular Attenders and Leaders of PCJH, Other Christian Churches from the Jackson Hole area and surrounding area. All are welcome!

<u>What?</u> We will gather to grow in knowledge about evangelism. We will brainstorm and come up with real solutions. We will learn tools to share our faith. We will have group discussions to share our experiences, perspectives and ideas.

<u>When?</u> Friday, January 29th 5:30pm - 8:30pm. Saturday, January 30th 8:30am - 4:30pm. Both days will have the first 30 minutes dedicated to snacks, fellowship and/or registration. Then we will move into worship and the message.

Where? The Engage Conference will be at PCJH, and in the main sanctuary.

<u>Why?</u> PCJH had a long-term planning discussion during our church retreat a little over a year ago and we related how hard it can be to talk about our faith. We believe the church is called to **Go into the world to make a difference** and therefore <u>evangelism is an important piece</u> of our Christian walk and our mission to Gather, Grow and GO! Also, Jesus tells us we are to go and make disciples. Some are called to travel around the world to do this as missionaries but all of us are called to speak to the immediate world around us about Christ's redeeming love.

ASCENT - Ascent is a tight-knit but welcoming group. Life as a younger adult in Jackson can often be hectic and fluid, with people moving in and out of multiple jobs, changing homes as demanded by roommates and housing prices, and otherwise shifting life situations. It's a simultaneously exciting and unsettled life, and Ascent seeks to be a place to connect with other people going through similar life stages.

Every Thursday night a group of 20-and-30-somethings gather in the Matthew Room to share in fellowship and study of God's Word. Jordan Shive leads them in worship through song and Grant Wright in Bible study. The group is following along with the Story curriculum.

Known as Koinonia in days of yore, this merry band also meets regularly outside of Ascent proper, providing a unique social environment for its members. After-Ascent hangouts, weekend potlucks, group movies and outings are all parts of the social life of Ascent. Ski trips as the winter continues are planned! Come and join us as we seek to find Christ as the stable center of our chaotic lives.



WEDNESDAY AFTER-SCHOOL - Wednesday Nights see the entire church in frantic action; Wednesday Night Dinners, classes, youth group, and, most energized of all, Wednesday After-School. Starting at school dismissal (as early as 1:00 pm) and running until Wednesday Night Dinner at 6:00 pm, the program is hours of learning as well as structured and unstructured play. 50 kids are currently registered, with more being added for the spring. The kids break up into classes to eat snacks, do walks, play games, work on homework, do crafts, and read Bible stories (following the Story curriculum), having new adventures every week.

The program relies upon both volunteers and church staff, all of whom exude enthusiasm and a sense of mission. They speak of it as a "highlight of the week" and of the how they love "working with the kids. Jordan Shive, the Coordinator of the Wednesday After-School program, speaks movingly about how grateful he is to have a chance to provide a service to families and be involved in the spiritual development and growth of children, in partnership with parents. He is excited about the prospects for the program's growth and development, as this popular and much needed ministry looks toward the future.




