A WORD FROM PASTOR BEN PASCAL

Every Member a Minister

Dear PCJH Family,

Do you remember the first time you came to PCJH? Do you remember who greeted you or how you felt when you entered and when you left that first Sunday you came to church? Did someone or something make a positive impression on you? Did someone stop to say "hello"? What made you come back?

I remember my first Sunday at PCJH. It was January 2001... 15 years ago! I was new to Jackson and didn't know anyone. I remember the warm smiles, the lively music, the coffee, and the couple who sat next to me and made me feel welcome. They engaged in conversation with me after church and invited me to return. The following week I came back they were there to welcome me again and invited me to their house for dinner. If it wasn't for that couple (who don't even live in Jackson anymore, and whose names I don't even recall) I may have never come back to PCJH. It is strange to think what might have happened to my life if that couple hadn't greeted me warmly that Sunday morning in January of 2001. Would I be where I am today?

May we never lose that welcoming feeling at PCJH. Sometimes I fear that we have lost it as we all settle into our comfortable groups of friends or as we sit down in the same seats week after week. May we never forget to look around the room as we sing "Let There Be Love Shared Among Us" in order to acknowledge our old and new friends around the sanctuary. May we never be in a hurry to leave and thus miss the opportunity to welcome someone who is new or who has been here for several weeks but hasn't yet met anyone.

Let's refocus our efforts in 2016 to get back to our roots and be a church that welcomes people well. I will do everything I can as your pastor to create a welcoming environment from up front and to greet people before and after the service, but that's my job. I think what really impacts people is when members or regular attendees voluntarily take the initiative to greet and welcome people.

Please remember to wear your nametags and to do whatever you can do to welcome people into the life of the church. It can be as simple as a smile, a handshake, and saying, "Good morning, my name is Ben, I'm glad you are here." It may be that the Spirit inspires you to invite them to lunch. May we never underestimate the power of a warm welcome.

The author of Hebrews wrote...

I have asked the Session (our Ruling Elders) to talk with all of their respective committees in order to generate ideas of how we can be a church that welcomes people well with the intent of capturing their hearts for Christ so that they will find a place in the exciting life of the PCJH family as a disciple of Jesus.

I realize that welcoming people is not the end goal... it is the first crucial step towards a life of discipleship. The end goal is to make disciples of Jesus... but first we must build a trusted relationship with people by welcoming them into the life of the church.

To aid in this initiative, we are planning a "Bring-a-Friend-to-Church Sunday" on February 21st. Kenny is getting together some special musicians on that Sunday and I am going to lead us in worship in such a way as to welcome our friends and guests in a refreshing and fun way. We will also have a potluck afterwards in the fellowship hall. My hope is that we will all invite at least one friend to join us that Sunday for worship.

I'm looking forward to seeing what God will do as we reach out in love to our friends and neighbors around Jackson Hole.

I am reminded of the amazing growth that took place in the early church as they focused on the core principles of their faith through fellowship with one another. This is what the Scripture says....

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." -Acts 2;42, 46-47

May we add to our numbers those who are being saved as we focus this year on welcoming the stranger and sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. It's not enough just to welcome people... let's connect them to the amazing and transforming love of Christ as they seek a life of discipleship. That's one of my many hopes and dreams for us in 2016 and beyond.

<u>The Meaning of Marriage - A Vision for Married and Unmarried</u> People - Modern culture would have you believe that everyone has a soul mate; that romance is the most important part of a successful marriage; that marriage does not mean 'til death do us part, but merely for as long as my needs are being met; and that when serious differences arise, divorce is the best solution.

All of these modern-day assumptions miss what marriage is all about. In The Meaning of Marriage—a sixsession video-based study—Timothy Keller, along with Kathy, his wife of forty years, draws a profound portrait of marriage that neither idealizes nor rejects the institution but points us back to the relationship between God and humanity. The result is a vision for marriage that is refreshingly frank and unsentimental, yet hopeful and beautiful.

This six-session video study is for anyone from singles to couples considering marriage to those who have been married recently or for a long time. The six sessions are: *Service: Marriage Isn't about You; *Covenant: Created to Make Promises; *Roles: Loving through Mutual Submission; * Singleness: Strengthening the Spiritual Family; *Sex: The Act of Covenant Renewal; *Hope: Seeing the Great Horizon.





All candidates will be screened by the committee until a final candidate is nominated for approval by the entire congregation. In order to protect the privacy of the candidates, as well as to protect the committee members from outside influences, the committee members will not discuss any specifics about the candidates until the end of the process.

How do we, the committee members, represent your voices? How can we know what you feel is important in the future life of the church? We are soliciting your comments so that we can keep everyone's ideas in mind as we work through the nominating process. The job description will be available on the church website under the employment tab and can help inform your understanding of the role the new pastor will play. Now is the time to submit your thoughts, as we will begin to receive applications as early as the beginning of February.

You are welcome to speak directly with any member of the committee, submit written comments to our mailbox in the church office, or to e-mail your feedback to: <u>pcjhnominating@icloud.com</u>. There will also be a chance to offer comments during the Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 31st. Anything you share with us will be kept confidential. In Full Pursuit Pastor Steve Weber

Not long ago I fielded an e-mail request from my alma mater to serve on the Bicentennial Reunion Steering Committee. It sure sounded important. I said, "Yes," complying with a previous decision to help out when people ask me. (Don't get any big ideas.) Soon I was involved in a conference call with other members of my class, one or two whose names I even recognized. The alumni director gave us our orders: invite people to the reunion and ask them to participate in a class gift. Ugh! I should have known this was about money.

My list of 16 former classmates to contact loomed before me most of that first month. I shouldn't have been concerned though for very few people answer their phone or respond to e-mail, especially when they hear it is from their former institution of higher learning. They know what it is about. I left voicemail messages, sent carefully composed e-mails, talked with secretaries, spouses and kids. Much of my volunteerism on this project turned out to be about sleuthing. I combed Facebook looking for contact information and discovered things about my classmates they probably don't know about themselves. I Googled them in hope of a phone number or e-mail address. I called former work sites. I got my Columbo on.

In short, I pursued them. I'm not sure if some of the people on my list were aware I was pursuing them but I was. Some of them eventually relented and contacted me. Some never did. The whole process has me thinking about the heart of God which Scripture says is in full pursuit of us.

Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; If I make my bed in the depths, you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, If I settle on the far side of the sea, Even there your hand will guide me, Your right hand will hold me fast. (Psalm 139)

One poet refers to God as the "hound of heaven" and the "long pursuit." It's a good poem. Accurate. Sometimes we are so focused on what we are running toward that we don't see who is running after us. The poem opens with these lines:

I fled Him down the nights and down the days I fled Him down the arches of the years I fled Him down the labyrinthine ways Of my own mind...I hid from him.

My pursuit of my classmates has concluded. I'm thankful to know God never stops pursuing me. Jesus promised to stay the course with us, "until the end of the age," and that, too, seems like the pursuit of God. I admire that about God. I grow weary of pursuing people. People are fickle. They run hot and cold. They are spotty at best about responding to the "call". It just makes sense to let the chase go. Chalk it up to the way we people function and move on to the next project.

Not our Lord. When we read in Scripture that God is "faithful," this is what it means: God is not and will not give up the pursuit of his beloved creation. "Draw near to God and God will draw near to you" (James 4:8). If ever we sense we are distant from God I have discovered if we only turn around (in our thinking, attitudes, praying), God is close, pursuing us, as the "hound of heaven."
