Dear PCJH Family,

I've heard it said that the only constant in life is change. Change can be exciting and difficult. The good news is that we serve a God who does not change. Jesus Christ was, is, and will always be our Rock and our Salvation amidst the changes in life. Amen!

As many of you already know, Sunday May 29th was Steve Weber's last Sunday with us as our temporary associate pastor. I remember the day Steve walked into the doors of PCJH and told me he had recently moved to the area. It was during a very difficult week for me when I was wondering whom God might be calling as our temporary associate pastor back in August 2014. I am forever grateful for how God orchestrated Steve and Cindy Weber's arrival to the Jackson Hole community and for calling Steve to serve alongside me these past 20 months.

I am so incredibly thankful for Steve's calm and collected presence; his wisdom and guidance; his confidence and encouragement; his love for God's creation; his wonderful sense of humor; his easy going personality; his love for Jesus and his faithfulness in ministry to PCJH and the Jackson Hole community. It was so wonderful to have a partner in ministry with Steve and to share a common theology and philosophy of ministry. I believe God brought Steve to us for such a time as this. Steve has helped us arrive at an exciting new chapter in our life as a congregation. Let's be sure to thank Steve for all he has done for us and for the Lord.

I am also grateful for Steve's wife Cindy, who has been such a kind and compassionate member of our church. It is wonderful to have someone like Cindy serving in our community in real tangible ways as a nursing professor. She has also taught classes at PCJH and has served in many other ways alongside Steve and others in our church. Thank you Cindy! Thank you Steve!

Many of you are aware of our denomination's policy in regards to departing pastors. The official policy of the Presbytery of Wyoming is that all pastors (whether temporary or installed; whether senior pastors or associate pastors) are asked to remove themselves from the life of the local congregation for one year. The reason for this is to allow the congregation to find its identity separate from the former pastor and to allow the new pastor to bond and attach to the congregation. I know this is difficult for all of us as Steve is such a wonderful person and we all love him so much. However, I have a strong feeling Steve will be an integral part of our congregation at some point in the future.

This brings me to my next point. By the time you read this, the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) will be close to announcing the nominee for our new associate pastor. This is an exciting time as we consider as a congregation who God is calling to serve our church and community.

Once the APNC announces the nominee, we will invite the candidate out to Jackson to meet the congregation and to preach during our Sunday morning worship service. We will have a congregational meeting after worship to officially vote on calling the nominee as our associate pastor and also vote on their terms of call (i.e. compensation package). This will most likely all take place in the month of June.

The associate pastor will then move to Jackson over the summer and start work by September 1st. In the fall we will have an installation service to formally install the candidate as our associate pastor.

I would like to thank our APNC for their extraordinary work as they sifted through 60 applicants and narrowed it down to two exceptional candidates. They did the hard work of discernment as they listened, discussed and prayed to God to help them decide whom God is calling to PCJH. Please be sure to thank the following people for the incredible amount of time, energy and prayer they put into selecting our new associate pastor.

Thank you to Sue Unruh (Chair), Melissa Snider, Tom Jordan, Irene Lund, Karen Brennan, Aaron Nydam, and Warren Myers.

I am looking forward to my new partner in ministry and continuing to fight the good fight with all of you as we GATHER to love God and one another; GROW to know and follow Jesus; and GO to make a difference in the world. I continue to be honored and humbled to serve as your Senior Pastor. Exciting years are ahead of us!

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.

Stewardship Update

Our target for PCJH's 2016 budget for tithes and offerings is \$930,735, or \$22,701 more than our target for 2015, which we met through your generosity and prayers.

<u>A Snowy Morning in May</u> Pastor Steve Weber

Yesterday, snow lay heavy on the tulip petals, my mown lawn hidden beneath a thin layer of January. In slippers and fuzzy warm pajama bottoms, I went out into it and framed a few photos just for proof that we really did have snow in May. Surely it won't last past the morning news, I considered, but by mid-morning when I drove to town a hard, slashing snow pattered against the hood. A weird day; something of a transitory day, a reminder of all the possibilities in the mountains, lest we ever forget.

I suspect we don't forget too often what is possible. Life is constantly shifting, orienting toward a new star or pattern. Just as the snow was dripping from the eaves, one of my daughters called to say the child growing within her is a girl, stemming the tide of little boys my kids have been bringing forth in recent days. Standing in the garage listening to her voice, it seemed there was an ever-so-slight shift in the universe, as I considered her future days replete with two little ones. So many possibilities to adjust to.

Emerson once observed, "People wish to be settled; only as far as they are unsettled is there any hope for them." It must have snowed on his tulips the day that thought came to him. If I understand his drift, I believe he was saying something about the shifting nature of life, and how common it is to desire the settled life while finding a source of hope in the unsettled. Weird people, too.

On the cover of the program, at my ordination service, all those years ago were these words from Psalm 16: "You have made known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence." It seemed appropriate on that day and still does. The path of life has never quite been a fully settled one but as it has been made known to me there has been a fullness to it. I have discovered and maybe you have too that there is, by faith in Christ, a "settled unsettledness."

All of this to say how much I have appreciated this part of the path with you all at PCJH. As my time with you comes to a close it is with that sense of settled unsettledness. People keep asking me if I am now retired and one fellow recently insisted I am retired regardless of my assurances I am not. Cindy and I treasure so much about PCJH and our brief time with you these past two years. You met us at a bit of a tender time following Cindy's recovery and welcomed us into this truly accepting and gracious family of Christ. We will continue to live in Teton Valley, Idaho, Cindy will continue to teach new nurses in Jackson and I am in conversation with other churches who have a "temporary" pastor role to fill. That part of the path is not quite clear yet, as I am open to something more as God leads, but I do know how good it has been to walk with you these past few years. From the beginning my title has been "Temporary" but it has never seemed temporary. I think we had a settled unsettledness.

Jesus often encountered the mortality and precarious fears of his disciples while on a stormy reach in a small boat. While it all seemed overwhelmingly unsettled to the disciples, Jesus was never bothered by the rocking and the splashing. As it has been said, He is the unmoved mover, the only true anchor in shifting times. It has been a joy to share in that hope with you. Thanks again for welcoming us into the heart of PCJH and showing us more of the depth of God's heart.
