The Art of the Sermon

Many of you have asked me about what it takes to prepare a sermon. When I was in seminary, my professors told me I should plan on it taking 20 hours a week. Now that I am six years into pastoral ministry, 20 hours would be a luxury. If I can get 10 hours a week of sermon preparation I consider it a good week!

I approach the sermon as a work of art. Here's my process:

**Long-Range Sermon Planning:** It was suggested to me by a mentor that I take time each year to plan out my sermons a year in advance. This has proved to be invaluable to me and the rest of the staff so that we have vision and direction for the year as it pertains to the sermon themes. I take a week (typically in the spring) to go away from the busyness of the church office and find a quiet place to pray, to read, and to reflect on what God might want us to focus on as a church. One year I spent a week in Seattle, another year it was at Ring Lake Ranch in Dubois, and last year it was on the coast of Oregon while visiting Paul and Terri Hayden. These times away to pray and plan are crucial to the sermon preparation. I will often come back from the week away with sermon themes and texts for the next 12 to 15 months. Kenny, Tammy and I probably appreciate this kind of planning the most as it gives us all a spiritual map for the year. Kenny uses it to plan for worship song selection and Tammy uses it as she and her team decide on Christian education classes and themes. I also share it with the rest of the staff and with Session.

**Weekly Sermon Rhythm:** I have developed a rhythm each week for sermon preparation. Good sermons take time and space to prepare. It requires prayer, reading, conversation, open space to think, moments for inspiration, time to write, and time to practice the delivery. It's not something you can just "crank out." A sermon needs time to brew.

**Nine days before** I deliver a sermon, I start to prepare the bulletin for that Sunday. Preparing the bulletin gets me engaged with the Scripture and theme for that particular Sunday. Kenny and I make the final music selections and we set things in motion.

The **Tuesday** before a sermon I spend time in prayer as I read the Scripture text for that Sunday. I make notes about my own thoughts and reflections, as well as questions that I have about the text. I will often read various translations of the text, as well as the original Greek or Hebrew, in order to engage with God's word. On Tuesdays I will have conversations with my staff and with our women's bible study about the Scripture. These conversations help me begin formulating my thoughts as we study the Scripture together.

The **Wednesday** before a sermon I spend time in the morning away from the busyness of the church office and I read at least three commentaries from other theologians. These commentaries often affirm things I have already discovered in the text, or they shed new light on the text that I hadn't thought of before.

The **Thursday** before a sermon I spend time in the morning away from the busyness of the church office and I spend time looking for good illustrations that will help us all better understand the text in practical ways. I then meet with men from our church at men's lunch and discuss the sermon text with them. By this point in the week I have a pretty good idea of where I am heading with the sermon and the guys help me flush it out as we study the Scriptures together.

The **Friday** before a sermon I spend time in the morning away from the busyness of the church office and I begin to write the sermon. Sometimes I simply make an outline, other times I write out the sermon word for word. The goal is to have a sermon that is ready to be preached by the time the day is over on Friday.

**On Saturday**, the day before the sermon, I often wake up early before my family and do some finishing touches on the sermon. I spend the rest of the day letting it brew. I allow the Holy Spirit to refine it and I also spend time resting in God's presence with my family. This time of rest is important so that I am refreshed and ready to preach on Sunday. On Saturday night I make some final adjustments and try to go to bed early so that I get a good night's sleep.

**The Day of the Sermon :** On Sunday morning I typically wake up at 5:00am so that I have plenty of time to prepare for the day and go over the sermon a few times before the 8:00am service. I pray with my team at 7:30am in the church lobby and it's go time! The sermon often changes in little ways between the 8am and 10:15am worship services as I allow the Holy Spirit to continue to work on it. Sometimes I preach from a manuscript (word for word); an outline; or without notes. Sometimes I prepare a manuscript but then intentionally leave it on my desk. It all depends on the topic, my preparation, how I feel that particular morning, and how the Spirit is moving.

People often ask at what day and time am I done with my sermon. The answer is 11:30am Sunday. It is constantly being worked on until I am finished preaching late Sunday morning.

**Post-Sermon :** I then spend Sunday afternoon taking a nap and Monday to rest and get ready for the next week.

This is the art of the sermon. I take it very seriously because I believe preaching is the proclamation of the word of God and I want to be faithful to God's word and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is an honor and privilege to preach every week. I have grown immensely in my own faith as I step out and do something that I feel called by God to do.

I hope you find the sermons to be meaningful and impactful in your life as you walk with Jesus. Faithfully, Ben

## Music Corner: Opening A Window By Kenny Hadden, Worship Coordinator

I was recently working with a voice student, encouraging her to sing out for a climactic moment in a song. As the moment approached, she took a big breath, preparing to push herself a little, but then suddenly she stopped. She looked down. I asked what's wrong, and she replied, "I'm just a little shy singing in front of people." Who isn't? And yet I couldn't help but laugh. There we were, just the two of us, in a voice lesson where the whole point is to sing, and she clammed up. It was an illustration to me of just how intimate the act of singing is. People are usually willing to share other talents, like solving a puzzle or juggling a soccer ball. But singing – that's something most people do only in

private, or with people they really trust. Your voice is a window into your soul. That's exactly why singing together in church can be so moving. You are exposing your soul to the congregation and to God, opening that window so anyone around can look in. You are announcing to your church family, "I trust you." I do it every week (into a microphone, no less!) and I make mistakes all the time. But generally what I've found is people sing along anyway. Opening myself up to the church family doesn't bring on their judgment; it invites their acceptance of the real me. And it makes them feel comfortable opening themselves up as well. The reality is, God already sees through your window, whether you open it to the rest of us or not. I occasionally see inspirational quotes encouraging me to embrace my true, beautiful self: "Sing like nobody is listening," they say. It's a nice idea. But it's even nicer to know that I can sing my heart out with a whole room full of believers, all of us bringing our true selves – faults and all – before a God who loves us no matter what.

## A WORD FROM PASTOR TAMMY LETTS

Spring is definitely in the air. While there are those who naturally lament the ski season coming to a close, others are eager to enjoy the next season Jackson Hole offers.

If springtime teaches us anything it's that you can't hurry it up. It's the gradual process of new life coming forth. We live in a pretty hurried culture, with the constant pressure to "get 'er done". There's this nagging sense we might "miss out", so we better "hurry". Does it surprise us that the sense of urgency affects our spiritual walk as well? "Hurry up, God; make this right; or answer my prayer; or just do something!" Our frustration level rises when our longings or desires are slowed in being realized.

Yet, the great gift of Spring is the promise of new life. Likewise, the gift of following Christ is God bringing new life in us. Although we may want God to be on our timetable, we are obligated to slow down and pay attention to how the Spirit is shaping our lives... today. The former Chaplain of the Senate, Rev. Dr. Richard Halverson wrote, "Haste in the name of urgency may be deceptive, may indicate a lack of balance between awareness of the need and confidence in God's adequacy. One can examine with meticulous care the New Testament record of Jesus' life without finding any evidence of hurry on His part. And He knew He had but three years to fulfill His mission. His concern for the need of man was unequalled. His total conformity to the will of the heavenly Father was indisputable. He knew the world of His time better than any contemporary. He was aware more than any other of the desperate need for divine intervention, yet His life was characterized in the words of one devotional writer, by "exquisite leisure." Jesus never wasted time, but He never allowed Himself to be pressed into panic either."

As Holy Week approaches, many people eagerly make plans for Easter. Yet do we slow down enough to grasp the significance of Holy Week? Most go to church on Palm Sunday and then return on Easter Sunday, often ignoring Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. I wonder if we are missing something. What might happen in us and in our church if we slowed down Holy Week just long enough to sit before the significance of Jesus' last earthly days? Perhaps God might want to create something fresh in us, if we weren't in such a hurry. I know our schedules get really full, and often with many good things. Yet I also know that my life is often guided by the urgent rather than the important. So I ask if anyone else would like to join me in slowing down a bit and seeing how we might live as Christ, with "exquisite leisure." God bless us as we celebrate the life, death and resurrection of our Savior. Happy Easter!
