## A WORD FROM PASTOR TAMMY MITCHELL

### Keep Paddling!



I recently went on a float trip down the Snake River with friends. It was the first time for most of us. Our fearless captain, Dylan Wade (our children's coordinator) had given all of us clear instructions at the outset on the importance of paddling when he tells us to. Then we hit Lunch Counter, class 3 rapid. Somewhere in the back of my brain I remember hearing Dylan encouraging us to paddle but all I could see was the wall of water and all I was thinking was "just stay on the raft!" Paddling was the furthest thing from my mind. Well, we survived the rapid (much to our enjoyment) but only because of Dylan's keen navigational skills.

Not to be trite, I believe that when we hit the rapids of our lives, we easily forget the bigger mission and purpose. We lose our orientation and somewhere in the back of our brains, we hear God's voice speaking but our current situation is presenting itself with such a force that it is ignored.

I believe that our Lord God has a wonderful purpose for our lives, yes, individually, but also as a community of faith. In scripture the church was frequently given her purpose by Jesus:

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." MT. 28:19-20

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." John 20:21

We are not a church for ourselves, but our mission is to continually be a people sent to serve others, to share the good news, and to join God in God's mission.

PCJH has a long history of keeping this at the forefront of our calling. The missions team reminds us we are not just on an individual journey of faith, rather we join together to intentionally respond by bringing hope and love to a hurting world. There are a wide variety of ways to live out our mission in this community:

- Volunteer one Saturday at the Habitat for Humanity build.
- Bring a dish to the Good Samaritan Mission once a month (2nd Thursday).
- Invite a non-church friend to worship some Sunday.
- Take a moment and pray for those who are at the women's shelter.
- Sign up for the trip to Nicaragua with the Agros mission this fall.
- Write a letter of encouragement to our missionaries, the Malloch's, who are serving in Central Asia.
- Contribute time or talent to the Upward Basketball program for kids this September.

These are just a few of the many ways we can help others paddle through the rough waters. A special word was given to a group of people, the Israelites, who were facing their own significant trials. It was an audacious word but one that reminded them (and us) that even when it gets tough, God will navigate us through. The book of Jeremiah states, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." So let's keep paddling.

## Eclipse

Preparing for the eclipse lead me to thinking about a lesson God taught me several years ago, about, "The Nature of Light". It was a crystal clear spring day in March and as I hiked on the crust, the warmth of the sun was breaking through the cold temperatures from the night before. God's diamonds were twinkling in the snow. You know what I mean, the sparkling snow crystals that cannot help but make you smile. It was then that I noticed, and was drawn to the deep shadows from the aspen trees. Each tree had sun on one side and shadow on the other. Isn't that what we are like? The light of God's loves on one side, and on the other our hidden, or not so hidden, shadows that stretch out beyond ourselves. Clearer revelation if the sun, or source of light is directly overhead no shadow is seen.

I remembered John 8:12- When Jesus spoke again to the people; He said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." Wow, think about that Jesus, the light of the world! As I marinated further on these thoughts, I knew on a bright clear day I could see clearly. I could see the contours of the land. I could see clearly every step; I can clearly see the shadows. But when the light is obscured, by clouds or fog, driving is more difficult, skiing is definitely harder, and I cannot prepare for the bumps and unexpected obstacles, and I cannot see the shadows.

The further away from God I was, or the more I allowed things into my life that blocked His light, the more darkness I experienced. John 15:4 "Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me." Abide in Christ. Yes, I thought, this is good stuff. Lord, give me a heart to abide. I want to bask in the Light of Christ, no shadows of darkness here!

Then the Eclipse comes, the shadow starts to drift over your life seemingly out of nowhere. For me it was the slow persistent creep of severe mental illness that was stealing the life of my oldest son. And just like the eclipse you cannot stop it. You see there is a ripple affect when an Eclipse happens. Look at the preparation our town is taking to prepare for the unknown ripple affect. We tried to prepare for all the scenarios, what ifs, but it is impossible. It is out of our control. We can only watch the shadows as they drift into darkness, without eye protection. Well Jesus is our eye protection, access, to God. If we do not have a relationship with Him, we will only be able to see the reflection of what is going on. As the shadows come and seemingly swallow up every bit of light, it is tempting to feel hopeless; feeling you are in complete darkness. The temperature will drop, and there can be a deafening silence, that can make you feel you are all alone. But, as the moon covers the sun, and as we strain to see the light in the darkness, we will be rewarded by seeing the corona. You see darkness cannot snuff out Light.

Did you know the moment before and after the full eclipse, clearly visible is the diamond ring effect. I cannot help but smile at the reference to a sparkling jewel in such darkness. As we searched for the light in the midst of our son's struggle with mental illness we were rewarded with much beauty. We learned to trust our God who is always faithful. He taught us to understand how much we had been forgiven; therefore we could not help but want to forgive others. He showed us how to love very broken people, because He has lavished such love on us. This is the place most often that the big lessons are learned, your priorities shift, and your perspectives change. This is the place of real growth.

The totality of the eclipse in Jackson will last 2 minutes 15 seconds, but the total event will last 2 hrs. and 44 minutes. As we are experiencing the most difficult of circumstances, we are tempted to think they will last forever. But the truth is, it does not last forever, eternity is a long time. And Jesus promises to never leave us or forsake us. We are not alone.

So what is your eclipse? An unexpected temptation that you did not resist, someone else's sin that takes you down, cancer, loss of a job, divorce, unexpected death of a loved one, mental illness, or a natural disaster, we will all experience at least one eclipse in our lifetime. So this month when you are viewing the eclipse and you watch the changing light and the earth being swallowed up by darkness, remember there is a true source of all light, God Almighty, creator of all things. Matt 7:7 says, "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." And John 14:27 says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." You can trust in that one true hope to be your light, as you walk through your darkest hour to the light on the other side.


