Music Corner:
Singing from the Heart

Every October, the PCJH Choir begins preparations for the Christmas Cantata. At first, it seems odd to be singing Christmas carols while there are still leaves on the aspens. But then – within minutes – it doesn't feel odd at all. It feels wonderful.

These time-honored songs of joy and praise to our God simply don't get old. In fact, they get better with time. That's because the lyrics start happening on their own; the feeling of the melody in our throats becomes a well-worn path; the focus of the song shifts from how and what we are singing to that beautiful concoction of nostalgic memories and the pure joy of the Lord. Through repeated singing, what the song is really about – something beyond words – starts to sink in.

This same effect happens as we sing praise music together on Sunday morning. Simple, repetitive songs seek to jump-start the congregation to this same place, without requiring the centuries of tradition behind the music. A repeated lyric like "How great is our God" drives home a basic idea that is easy to think about but hard to know. And through singing, the idea makes that short but important voyage from our heads to our hearts.

Old songs as well as new ones can have this effect on us. And despite personal preferences for one musical style or another, it's important to remember that the song itself is not what is sacred. What's sacred is the act of worship that takes place when we sing from the heart.

The vision team did more than come up with strategic focus areas for ministry and mission. We took time to really think about who we are and developed a new vision, mission, and values statement in addition to strategic focus areas.

As we prayed about what our vision and mission is as a church, God gave us the image of a tree.



A tree begins as a small simple seed and as the seed grows it *transforms* into a big beautiful tree with strong *roots* that help it withstand the winds and changing seasons; a healthy trunk to provide support; and full branches that *reach out* to provide shade and bear fruit.

The image of a tree is used throughout Scripture. The Bible starts in Genesis and ends in Revelation with the image of a tree. The Old and New Testaments use trees as illustrations for a godly life.

“Blessed is the person who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him. He will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit.” - Jeremiah 17:7-8

Children's Ministry Corner November, 2017

Volunteerism Part 4: A Community of Teachers

To sum up the previous articles on volunteering, in children's ministry it is difficult (Part 1), it is necessary to grow and mentor our children (Part 2), and it needs to have the full level of commitment (Part 3). This week I would like to talk about another important aspect I believe will serve our children of PCJH and the Jackson Hole community so that they know and experience the love of Jesus. Any service we do, must not be in isolation, but done as a community. We cannot and should not try to teach and share our faith to our children all by ourselves as individuals. The children are too important and the message too important for that. My hope is that our work in Children's Ministry is done with volunteers who are in concert with each other so as to create a beautiful symphony. We all bring different and unique talents and abilities to the orchestra, but to just play by ourselves would lack the depth and harmony that could be achieved by the group.

So how do we do this? I do not think it is that difficult as the desire to work collaboratively comes naturally to most if not all of us. In her book with Adam Duckworth "Not Normal: 7 Quirks of Incredible Volunteers,"¹ Sue Miller breaks down the desire to work as a "we" and not a "me" into three parts. The first is "we like to be known." She goes on to state that we all feel more comfortable in a volunteering situation when we know the people with whom we are volunteering. It makes a difference when people know your name, laugh and joke around with you, ask you about your family, care about your week, and encourage you. To accomplish this, we must intentionally spend time getting to know each other. The second is "we like to do things together." When facing a huge challenge (like overseeing a group of super energized kids) it is always more fun to do so with others, rather than all by yourself. However, we can often narrow our focus too much when we volunteer so much that we are only looking at the task "I" have to accomplish rather than looking side to side and thinking of the tasks "WE" have to accomplish. If we are all trying to attain the same goals (See Purpose Statement) then we really need to step back and think how am I best helping our team? Finally, the third part is "we like to give our best." If we all know each other and have a common goal, then our team can strive towards excellence. We should not just show up and just get the task over with but as a team we can keep each other accountable and honor God by giving Him our best!

It is my hope that we can create a community of teachers here at PCJH, through which our children and their families will know and experience the love of Christ. To create this community, we may have to sacrifice some time to get to know each other. We may have to change our thinking from "I" to "we." And we may have to view our volunteering as something that deserves our best rather than a task to check off. As a result, not only will our children thank you, but you will thank you. **WE** can do this!

Children's Ministry Volunteer of the Month for October:

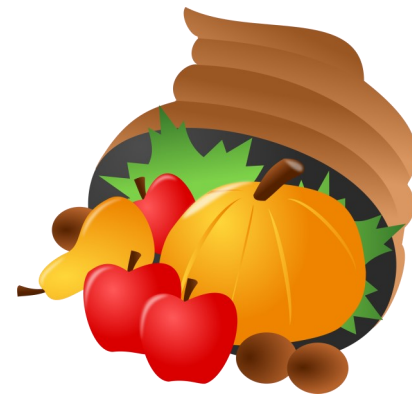

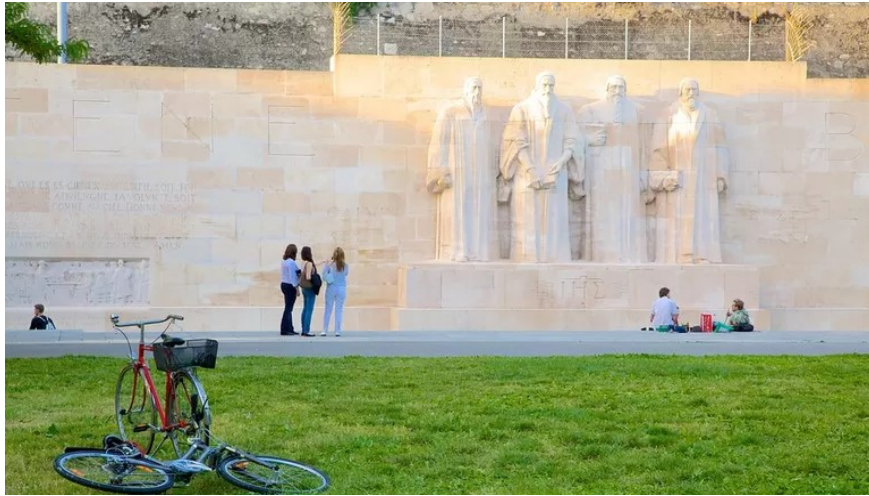

A WORD FROM PASTOR TAMMY MITCHELL



I recently had the honor and privilege to go on a study tour with our Presbyterian denomination to Germany and Switzerland visiting the various places significant to the Protestant Reformation. As many of you already know, this year celebrates the 500th anniversary of the historic event where Martin Luther posted his 95 theses lamenting particular grievances of the then Roman Catholic Church. Many believed that event marked the beginning of the Reformation which altered Christianity for all time.

Our particular tour began in Leipzig, then on to Wittenberg, Erfurt, Augsburg, Lake Constance, Zurich, Berne, and finally ending in Geneva, where John Calvin lived, preached and taught. It was a remarkable ten days with 22 other pastors and leaders of our church. Our tour not only consisted of visits to historical places, but also included thoughtful study and discussion led by Dr. Joseph Small. Dr. Small served as the Director of Theology, Worship and Educational Ministries for the PCUSA for over 25 years. Many consider him one of the leading modern theologians of our time. He currently works for the Presbyterian Foundation, one of the primary sponsors of the trip.

He challenged us to think not only about the past, or about what happened to the church and to people's faith understanding, or the impact of the reformations; but also, where do we need and seek reformation in our church today? If there was one takeaway from the trip it would be that the true reformer of the church was not Luther, or Zwingli, or even Calvin.

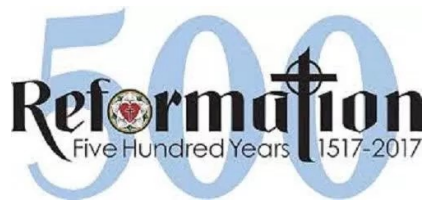
Our Lord God is the true Reformer of the Church. Luther, Zwingli and Calvin were devout, passionate followers of Jesus Christ who followed their call in a certain time and place to be God's voice. Their primary desire was never to divide the church, but to do everything they could to help the church be an authentic, loving witness to the person of Christ. If that meant speaking publicly about injustices, or education, or caring for the poor, or how the sacraments are understood, then they did so with gusto. The walls that prevented the people from experiencing God's grace, knowing God's word, and hearing God's truth needed to be torn down.

Looking to the past is important for us as a church. Yet on this trip I was challenged to not look at what Luther did, or what Calvin did, but what God did. Celebrating the Reformation is not about celebrating past history. It's celebrating the movement of God's Spirit in and through God's beloved people. It's celebrating the Good News that the scripture brings us. It's celebrating the reality of God's liberating grace. It's celebrating the importance of the Church being an authentic witness to the love of God in Christ Jesus.

We Presbyterians hold up a saying: *ecclesia reformata semper reformanda secundum verbum Dei*. [The Church reformed always being reformed in accordance with the word of God]. The great Reformer God continues to reform us according to God's Word. God is on the move to bring all peoples to God's self. On the "Reformation Wall" in Geneva (seen in the picture) the words written are,

"Out of darkness...light". That's what it means to be the Church Reformed. We are to be Christ's light in a hurting world. Now that's grounds for a celebration!

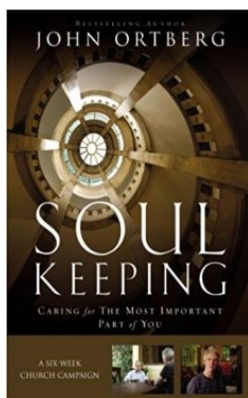
