

Spiritual Rest

Well, it's officially winter. Christmas is just a beautiful memory, and now, aside from a few glorious moments of celebration on powdery bluebird days, we basically have to hunker down and wait until Lent and the spiritual season of rebirth that comes with spring. So, what is God's

purpose for midwinter? If Advent was the season of active waiting, it seems like midwinter is the season of spiritual rest.

Don't worry that your faith is destined to languish during this time! Spiritual rest is in fact a necessary and very healthy component of the faith journey. Consider normal sleep: far from being a mark of a lazy person, good sleep is a clear indicator of mental and physical vitality. Likewise, God requires that we rest spiritually. Rest is necessary on either side of periods of growth, for preparation and restoration. In other words, God designed this time of rest for a purpose. So take a load off, and stop feeling guilty about it!

Dr. Thomas Lickona, a developmental psychologist, writes in *Raising Good Children* that as children progress through the stages of moral development there is space in each stage for what he calls *lateral growth*. The idea is that although "forward progress" may slow down periodically, the child continues to develop in another way – by deepening their understanding and acceptance of where they are.

As children of God, we need to slow down as well, seeking a deeper understanding of where we are in our spiritual walk. What are you confident of, and where are your doubts and questions? As you consider those questions, are you charging after them or resting in them? Midwinter is a time to sit with those things and let them do their work on your soul – to grow laterally in your faith. So rest up! Some day soon, God will ask something great from you, and now is the time to prepare your soul for when that moment comes.

Children's Ministry Corner January, 2018

This month I wanted to highlight our curriculum that we use for Sunday School here at PCJH and give you some background on why and how we chose it.



When I was hired as the Children's Ministry Coordinator early last year, I was tasked with finding a quality curriculum that we would use as the backbone of our Sunday School program and perhaps other children's programs here at PCJH. I had several options to choose from initially, all of which were superb. So, the main factor in choosing, would be which curriculum met our needs and fit the mission of the Children's Ministry best As I researched, the Orange Curriculum stood out consistently, for several reasons. First of all, PCJH's Little Lambs Preschool has used and continually uses Orange's Preschool Curriculum for their chapel time and classrooms. The Middle School youth group chose to use the Orange Curriculum for their program as well. So some consistency from 3 year old's all the way to 14 year

old's would be important. However, this alone was not what sold me on Orange.

In April of last year, Pastor Tammy Mitchell and I flew to Atlanta to attend the Orange Conference put on annually each year by the Orange company. My expectations of this event being a chance for Orange to market their curriculum and make some money were blown out of the water after the first day. I learned that this company is not just around to sell curricula and make money, but are so much more. We left understanding that they are a partner to churches with a mission that will not only help build successful children and youth ministries, but also provide means to connect parents in on the process of changing the lives of children on a daily, weekly, and yearly basis. Their mission seemed to fit in perfectly with our mission and vision for the children of PCJH. Plus, I was blown away with all the resources they could offer us, beyond ideas for what we can do on Sunday mornings. I would like to highlight a couple.

First, they have a plethora of quality and practical resources for parents to reinforce the material learned in one hour on one day of the week here at PCJH. Orange realizes that in order to make an impact in the lives of children, parents need to be involved because they have more contact with their children through a week and thus much more influence, than any the Sunday School leader. It is my goal to get more of these resources and information in the hands of parents this year than in years past. One such

resource is the Parent Cues which come in several forms. The first is a paper copy which parents can pick up the Children's Welcome table on Sunday mornings. This print out gives an overview of what was covered in Sunday School as well as giving the parents prompts to engage their kids throughout the week at home, in the car, or while putting them to bed. Parent Cues can also be found as an app and have a devoted website to help parents, which are practical ways of reaching parents.

The second resource is a variety of quality videos and music options that are geared to help connect with our children and build their understanding of God. We have used them extensively the past few months at PCJH with the elementary aged students. Each Sunday School starts off with a music video that pertains to the theme of that month and is followed by a video of a story from the bible which helps focus the kids on the verse and message for that week. The students then break into their small groups based on grade and dive deeper into that verse and message through various activities. By the end of their 45-minute Sunday School class students have been given a well-rounded lesson in an engaging way and are primed to continue it throughout the week with their parents.

Finally, Orange has been instrumental in helping me organize and coordinate volunteers to use the curriculum, through the books and blogs they have published. The volunteers, I have learned, are what make a Sunday School program successful or not. Orange has given me and our volunteers the confidence, vision, and excitement to provide a top notch, quality Sunday School Program here at PCJH. In a nutshell, the quality, depth, and breadth of each students biblical and spiritual education has increased since implementing this curriculum and partnership with Orange this past September. Another reason to join us!

A WORD FROM PASTOR TAMMY MITCHELL

Question: How Goes It With Your Soul?

In our Wednesday evening class on Soul Keeping, I've been struck and challenged with the concept



that I, and no one else, am responsible for the condition of my soul. The soul is described as what integrates our will, (our intentions), our mind (thoughts, feelings, values, and conscience) and our body into a single life. Dr. John Ortberg writes, "A soul is healthy - well-ordered- when there is harmony between mind, body, and will, and God's intent for all creation."

I've been ruminating on this idea in light of the incessant demands and difficulties clamoring for our attention. Feelings of anxiety, fear, depression, or grief are symptoms of souls becoming disintegrated, neglected, and fractured. Ortberg compares

the state of our souls with Jesus' parable of the sower and the soils in Mark 4. The hardened soul may be like the seeds that fall on the path. These people may have been hurt, disappointed, or estranged. They form protective shells. They are often bitter, cynical and deep down, angry and afraid. The shallow soul is like the seed that falls on the rocky soul. It's a soul that is superficial and self-absorbed. According to the scripture, our souls pant for deep waters. "To speak of depth means that there is more going on than what we see on the surface. To love deeply or care deeply or value deeply means we have devoted time, and effort and thought. "Depth" is an expression of spiritual vastness." A soul can have depth when it's connected to God. The third type of soul is the cluttered soul. This soul is like the soil that falls among thorns which grow and choke the plants. Jesus referenced the condition that is fraught with worry, busyness, and preoccupation for things of this world. And then there's the seed that falls on the good soil. A soul that thrives and flourishes is one that seeks first after God.

Renowned author and professor, the late Dallas Willard writes, "The Lord God formed man from dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul. You're a soul made by God, made for God, and made to need God, which means you were not made to be self-sufficient (my emphasis)...what is running your life at any given moment is your soul. Not external circumstances, not your thoughts not your intentions, not even your feelings, but our soul. The soul is that aspect of your whole being that correlates, integrates, and enlivens everything going on in the various dimensions of the self. The soul is the life center of human beings."

So how goes it with your soul? Our Lord calls us to live rooted in Christ, drawing life from the Living Water, in order to "experience the deep contentment, joy, and confidence in our everyday life with God." Perhaps in this new year the best resolution we can make is to tend to the care of our souls. Our souls are waiting!





Coming This Summer.....Whitworth University Summer Fellowship!

PCJH is excited to be a new ministry partner with Whitworth University, a Presbyterian affiliated university in Spokane, WA, in their Summer Fellowship Program. This program is designed to prepare students practically, theologically, and vocationally for a summer of ministry. The university selects, trains and places students according to their interests and



calling. Through this partnership, various sites across the nation *strive to provide fellows with a framework in which* students can grow in leadership, be mentored, learn through practical ministry experience and ultimately grow in their love of Christ.

PCJH has a rich history of hosting interns that have provided leadership in various ministries. However, this is a different opportunity. The goals for a fellow are more comprehensive and encompassing. The goals and expectations for the site in which the fellow is placed are as follows:

- 1. **Leadership**. The fellowship is not designed to "fill a volunteer slot". It's designed to foster the development of a future spiritual leader. They will be given tangible leadership opportunities.
- 2. **Mentorship.** Each fellow will receive intentional mentoring and guidance from designated staff members in order to offer wisdom, advice and supervision.
- 3. **Practical Ministry Experience.** During the course of the time period (10-12 weeks), each fellow should get a concrete sense for what congregational ministry is in this context. They may shadow the pastors, take part of programs, assist in worship, attend staff meetings and so on.
- 4. **Embeddedness in Community.** The fellow is expected to really assimilate into homes or to hang out with other members and engage in the community at large.

Our Part! Our new vision for PCJH includes intentionally investing in young adults. This is one of many significant ways we can do exactly that. A critical aspect of this partnership is through the student's engagement with a host family. The host-family (term used generically) would provide a safe, home environment for the fellow. The goal with each homestay is for the student to see how Christian faith is embedded not only in the direct ministry setting, but in all of life. They discourage the student to stay with other staff members in order to provide a more holistic experience, and for them to get a "break" from the work environment.

Our commitment to this partnership is to provide housing for the fellow for 10-12 weeks. It would be preferable to have them stay in one location however, we are open to other options.

A Call to Prayer

- · Pray for the student who will be coming our way. Pray for the selection process that is taking place at Whitworth. Pray that the Lord will prepare their hearts to come to PCJH.
- Pray for our congregation, that we would welcome and receive this new student with open arms, be willing to encourage them in ministry, and support them with friendship and care. And pray that we would receive their leadership and partnership in ministry.
- Pray for a homestay. Perhaps you would be willing to open up a room in your home for this student. Perhaps you know someone else who might welcome a young adult. Our goal is to have a homestay in place by the middle of February.

This is a very exciting opportunity for us as a congregation!
We will keep you posted as to the development of the process.
