Dear PCJH Family,

When I was a little boy I loved the film, *Star Wars*. I wanted to be a Jedi Knight. In fact, my best friend, Todd, and I used to play a game of imagination; he was Han Solo and I was Luke Skywalker. We called the game "Luke and Han." We would play for hours in our backyards fighting evil and imagining ourselves as heroes. I'm pretty sure we both had crushes on Princess Leah too. One of the most famous lines from *Star Wars* is when Luke is flying his plane through the canyons of the Death Star in order to rid the universe of evil. Luke's late mentor and counselor, Obi-Wan Kenobi speaks to him in a supernatural way. Luke hears Obi-Wan's voice say, "Use the Force, Luke… Let Go, Luke… Trust me, Luke".

In *Star Wars* there was a supernatural Force one could tap into in order to do miraculous and powerful things. Throughout the Bible, God tells us of a similar Force that we all have access to in order to do things we never thought possible. It is the Holy Spirit. God's very own Spirit. The Spirit of Christ.

Some of you might be saying to yourself, "Yeah, right. That's a fairy tale, a figure of speech, it's just wishful thinking. Before you begin to say those things, I pray that we will all have open hearts and minds to the power and reality of the Holy Spirit. PCJH is excited to participate in Compassion Sunday on May 13, 2018 at both services. This is a national event that helps us grow in our understanding of God's very special love for the poor. It's also an opportunity for each of us to interrupt the cycle of poverty and make a difference in the life of at least one child. A special information table will be displayed in the lobby with people to answer all your questions.

Some facts about global poverty:

- *11 children under age 5 die every minute.
- *45 percent of deaths of children under age 5 occur in the first 28 days of life. That means about 7,000 newborn babies die each day due to conditions of poverty.
- *Nearly 1 child in 5 of all children under age 5 does not have enough to eat (is undernourished).
- *Chronically undernourished children who manage to survive their first 5 years often live with physically stunted bodies, high susceptibility to illness and underdeveloped brains.
- *While malnourishment (not getting essential nutrients) affects 1 person in 3 worldwide, preventing malnutrition delivers \$16 in returns on investment for every \$1 spent.
- *At least 10 percent of the world's population is thought to consume food irrigated by waste water.
- *By 2025, half of the world's population will be living in water-stressed areas, meaning water is scarce, inaccessible or of poor quality.
- *An estimated 61 million primary school-aged children worldwide don't attend school.
- *More than 21.3 million people roughly the population of Australia are refugees.
- *Some 880 million people live in slums, and nearly 40 percent of the world's future urban expansion is likely to occur in slums.

We have a chance to make a difference! Plan on coming that Sunday and prayerfully consider how you might want to engage.



Hello From St. Louis and Prayer Update



Greetings from Saint Louis, Missouri! Since leaving PCJH in June 2014, I moved home to Seattle area for two years and coordinated programs at Seattle's Union Gospel Mission focused on caring for, serving and sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with men and women struggling with homelessness. It was truly amazing to see how God worked in this time, and I am very thankful for all that he taught me while there. In those two years, an even more important event happened: I got engaged and married to my wonderful wife Jillian!

Shortly after getting married in Spring 2016, we moved two thirds of the way across the country to Saint Louis Missouri so I could pursue a Master of Divinity Degree at Covenant Theological Seminary. During this season, Jillian and I have grown much in being in a brand new place together, and also learning much through church, school, and involvement in our community. God has also used this time to grow our

identity in Christ and to discern where God is calling us after seminary. In this, I have felt an increased call toward pastoral ministry in the local church, and Jillian has grown in her giftings of hospitality and discipleship through relationship. These past two years have been incredibly formational for us, and we are so thankful for God's gracious and faithful provision in this time.

We have two years left in seminary, and are currently pursuing opportunities for vocational ministry in our home: the Pacific Northwest. We feel what we believe is a call from God to gospel ministry in this area, and are considering church planting there, as there is a great need for gospel-centered churches in the Pacific Northwest (a rapidly growing area). A WORD FROM PASTOR TAMMY

How's Your Devotional Life?

From Genesis to Revelation, we discover a God who longs to be "with us." From the garden of Eden, to Abraham, to Moses, to David, to the nation Israel, and culminating in the very incarnation of God, Jesus Christ, God's determination to be "with us" cannot be ignored. Even the prophet Isaiah referenced the name of God as "Immanuel" which means, "God with us." Recall the last words of Jesus on earth were, "I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Mt. 28:20)."

The question of the day is, are we willing to be with God?

According to many surveys and polls, many people profess a belief in God and would self identify as "Christian." However, the idea of having a dynamic, personal, and vibrant relationship "with God" may be...well...foreign. How does our faith in Christ move from our head to our heart? Don't we long to know God more? How do we answer the quest in our own souls to know Christ more? Will we ever move past our doubts and questions? Can we ever get over our past shame or grief? Don't we yearn to have a stronger love or know a stronger love? Don't we wish we could sense God's presence more in our lives? Are we feeling spiritually dry and distant from God?

If the answer to at least one of these questions is true, may I suggest one simple yet powerful step - accept the invitation to *spend time with Christ every day*?

Don't get me wrong. I am not promoting a religiosity that would somehow cure all spiritual ills. Nor am I setting us up for "failure" if we don't pray every day. Rather, I'm offering the opportunity for us to take seriously the call of God to be *with* God.

A beautiful resource to help us move forward is the daily use of a Christian devotional. A devotional is a simple resource compiled by people from all walks of the Christian faith who reflect on the scriptures and offer their insights.

I have found the benefits of reading a devotional are multiple. First, they help me pray. Sometimes praying is difficult. We don't know what to pray for or how to pray or what words to use. I have been so inspired to read or hear other people pray. Sometimes I'll read something in the devotional and I'll exclaim, "That's exactly how I

feel!" Devotionals articulate my own heart in ways I would not or could not do so otherwise. Second, they help me become better familiar with God's word. Many people long to better understand the Bible but feel it's a daunting endeavor. A devotional may reference only a few verses, but those verses may be life-changing. I will often look up the verses only to discover myself lost in reading even more. The more I read, the more I learn God's word. It's a win/win.

Third, devotionals spur me to think and reflect and meditate on my relationship with God. It's common for me to journal about the scripture or the given insight and how they impact my own life. I have been deeply enriched when I have taken time to really allow the passage take root. Fourth, daily devotional reading creates a wonderful discipline. Instead of being something I should do, it becomes something I cannot do without. I long to find out how God might speak to me today and anticipate hearing God's voice. Fifth, daily reading allows me to soak in God's presence. It becomes more than a reading...it becomes an encounter *with* the loving Lord.

Are we willing to be with God?

Do you have a devotional that you use?

PCJH wants to encourage all of us to read and embed the Bible in our lives. We have several devotionals available upon request. I would strongly recommend the following:

- *Jesus Calling, by Sarah Young
- *Streams in the Desert, by L.B. Cowman
- *A Diary of Private Prayer, by John Baillie *Bread for the Journey, by Henri Nouwen
