Teton County School District

For the week of Monday, March 16-Friday, March 20, 2020 the following plans are in place:

Food services will be available for free all week for any individual under the age of 19, enrolled student or not. Two meals at a time will be available for pick up that includes breakfast and lunch. Pick up will be made available at Jackson Hole High School at the following times: Monday from 11:00 am - 2:00 pm & Tuesday - Friday from 7:30 am - 2:00 pm

The Fund for Public Education has launched <u>a new fundraising campaign</u> to support the district during COVID-19. This is primarily focused on feeding hungry kids.

While schools are closed, TCSD#1, with support from the Fund for Public Education, is providing free breakfast and lunch to every child in our community under the age of 19. The child does not have to be enrolled in TCSD#1 schools; every child is welcome. Two meals (breakfast and lunch) are provided for each day that school would normally be in session. They are available for pick up Monday through Friday from 7:30 am to 2:00 pm at Jackson Hole High School, where drive-through stations have been set up. The child needs to be in the car to receive the meals. During Spring Break, March 23- April 5, Hole Food Rescue will be offering this service. They will be providing meals at the same Jackson Hole High School pick up location, Monday through Friday, 11:00 am to 1:00 pm.

Senior Center of Jackson Hole

The Senior Center is offering to pick up meals, groceries, and mail for those who feel unsafe or are ordered to stay home during "shelter in place". They are also serving lunches through their Meals on Wheels program, for curbside pickup or home delivery.
