PRELUDE SOCIAL STORY WORSHIP GROUPS HOME

PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION 15 MINUTES

MADE TO CONNECT

an activity that invites kids to share and collaborate with others while growing their understanding



Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them. Ask God to help guide today's conversations and activities as kids learn and talk about what it means to be a loving friend. Pray that kids would leave today with ideas and opportunities for big and small ways they can show love to their friends.

1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, a die

WHAT YOU DO:

- Welcome kids as they enter.
- Encourage those who've brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Explain that the group is going to play a game to help them get to know their friends!
- Instruct the kids to take turns rolling the die and answering a corresponding numbered question from the list below.
- If they roll a number and both questions have been asked, let them roll again.
- Continue until every kid has had a chance to roll and answer a question.
 - Questions are as follows:
 - Rolled #1
 - What's your favorite TV show?
 - Which do you like better, summer or winter and why?
 - Rolled #2
 - What's your favorite ice cream flavor?
 - Which do you like better, recess or lunch?
 - Rolled #3
 - Do you have a pet? (If not, what pet would you like if you had one?)
 - What is your favorite food to eat for breakfast?
 - Rolled #4
 - What is your favorite thing about school?
 - Tell us one thing about your family.
 - Rolled #5
 - Tell us one thing about your family.
 - If you had 15 extra minutes to do anything, what would you do?
 - Rolled #6
 - What is your favorite game to play (outside or inside)?
 - What is your favorite thing to do after school?

2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Name tags, markers, and a playground ball

WHAT YOU DO:

- Write each kid's name on a name tag in large block print.
- Let the kids place them on their shirts so other kids can read them.
- Stand in a circle.
- Instruct the kids to toss the ball back and forth saying, "I'm passing to my friend, [kid's name]."
- Remind them to be careful and intentional as they toss!
- Continue tossing the ball between the kids as they say each other's names.
- After several rounds, have the kids remove their nametags and see if they can all remember each other's names. Also, encourage them to toss to different friends each round!

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Great job, friends! All month long, we're learning about friends. It's important to know the names of our friends for sure. **[Transition]** In our Bible story today, we'll hear about two good friends. Pay close attention to see if you can remember their names."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

CREATING A SAFE PLACE TO CONNI 25 MINUTES

MADE TO PLAY

an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and/or working as a group

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1. HIDDEN PICTURES

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: "David and Jonathan Story Pictures" Activity Pages

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide your group into two teams.
- Select one kid from each team to stand next to you. Select kids you know are responsible and can handle a "special task."
- Assign a paper color to each team.
 - If one team is yellow and one team is blue, hand the yellow pictures to the blue team volunteer and the blue pictures to the yellow team volunteer so that they are hiding pictures for the opposing team around your Small Group area.
- Instruct the rest of the kids to put their heads down and close their eyes, or face the wall if that's an option.
- While your volunteers hide the pictures, lead the kids to say their ABC's, sing a favorite worship song, or repeat this month's memory verse.
- Once the pictures are hidden, instruct kids to open their eyes.
- Let the two "hiders" stand next to you, and instruct them not to give any clues or hints.
- When you say, "Go!" teams will race to find all eight pictures and put them in order according to the numbers on the page.
- Once the pictures are found, let the kids work together to put them in the correct order, according to the story.
- Hold up each picture as you use the text below to review the story:
 - Picture #1: King Saul was in charge, and his son's name was Jonathan.
 - Picture #2: God chose David as the next king.
 - Picture #3: Though David was chosen as king instead of Jonathan, the boys were still best friends.
 - Picture #4: Jonathan gave David his best things—his robe, belt, sword, and bow.
 - Picture #5: King Saul became so jealous that he tried to kill David.
 - Picture #6: Jonathan was worried for his friend. He had a secret plan to warn David.
 - Picture #7: When they realized David was in trouble, the two friends had to say goodbye.
 - Picture #8: Open your Bible to 1 Corinthians 13:4-8a and read it aloud.
- ASK:
 - How did Jonathan feel about David being the next king? Was he jealous? (Jonathan was David's best friend. He wasn't jealous of David. He protected David.)
 - What about David? Did he brag about being the next king or make Jonathan feel bad about it? (No, David didn't brag. He was Jonathan's friend.)



(1. HIDDEN PICTURES . . ., CONTINUED)

• What does it mean to be patient and kind with your friends? (You let them choose what game you play. You don't do something mean out of anger when they do something that frustrates you.)

WHAT YOU SAY:

"I love this story of two best friends! David was chosen as the next king, but Jonathan, King Saul's son, wasn't angry. He loved David, and even gave David his favorite things. And when King Saul became jealous and tried to kill David, Jonathan stepped up to protect him. Jonathan and David show us that **friends love one another**.

"The verses I read from 1 Corinthians 13 show us what love looks like. When **friends love one another**, they are patient and kind. They aren't jealous or braggy, and they don't easily get angry. That's how David and Jonathan treated each other, and we can, too!"

[Make it Personal] (Tell the kids about your best friend. How does he or she have the qualities we read about in 1 Corinthians 13? Give a specific example of a time when that friend showed kindness or patience or chose to put you first.)

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*2. POM POM BUDDIES

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Pom poms, googly eyes, white school glue, foam heart stickers, small envelopes or paper, clear tape

WHAT YOU DO:

- Kids will make two pom pom buddies—one to keep and one to give away.
- Help kids apply two glue dots to the large pom pom then stick the googly eyes on the glue.
- For younger kids, you may want to do this step for them.
- Instruct kids to glue a mini pom pom as the nose underneath the two eyes.
- Then, they place a foam heart sticker on the bottom of the pom pom for the feet.
- Repeat for the second large pom pom.
- If kids finish quickly, encourage them to decorate an envelope with crayons and markers or fold the copy paper to make a little house for their pom pom buddy.
- They can secure everything with tape.
- As they're working, ask the kids to think of one friend to give a pom pom buddy to and how they could show love to that friend this week.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"These pom pom buddies are so cute! I want you to pick a friend and give one of your pom pom buddies away. What is one way you can show love to that friend this week? (*Pause for responses.*) Once you've followed through, give your pom pom buddy to your friend. You can keep the other as a reminder that **friends love one another.**"

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3. A FRIEND LOVES AT ALL TIMES

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Colored paper and markers

WHAT YOU DO:

- Write the words of the verse on the pieces of paper, broken down as follows for *NIrV*:
- A friend/ loves/ at all/ times./ They/ are/ there/ to help/ when/ trouble/ comes./ Proverbs 17:17

OR for NIV:

- A /friend/ loves/ at / all/ times/ and a/ brother/ is born/ for/ a time of/ adversity./ Proverbs 17:17
- Lay the pages on the floor of your group's area like the numbers of a clock, starting with the first page as one o'clock.
- Select one kid to stand in the center of the pages and hold out his arm like one arm of the clock.
- Encourage the kid in the center to start with one o'clock (A) and point to each word of the verse as they "click" around the clock face. The kids say the words of the verse together.
- Repeat with each kid in the center.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"These pages sort of look like a clock face! Why? Because a friend loves at ALL times. Does a friend love at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday when they just woke up? (*Pause.*) Does a friend love at 1:00 p.m. when they don't get their way? (*Pause.*) Yes! Because **friends love one another** at all times! I'm so thankful for examples of good friends like David and Jonathan. And of course, the best friend of all is JESUS! He loves us when we mess up, when we're happy, when we're frustrated, and even when we say something unkind. Because Jesus loves us at all times, we can love others, too!"

4. PRAY AND DISMISS [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Pom pom buddies

WHAT YOU DO:

- Encourage the kids to hold their pom pom buddies as they think about the friend they've chosen, then spend a
- moment praying that God would help them show love to that friend this week. Remind the kids to follow through, to show love, and to give one pom pom
- buddy away. Close the group in prayer.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Heavenly Father, thank You for reminding us that friends love at all times! Thank You for sending Jesus, the best friend ever. Help us be kind and patient and put others first because friends love one another. In Jesus' name we pray, amen."

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As adults arrive to pick up, encourage the kids to show off their pom pom buddies and give one away this week because friends love one another.

HERE'S EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW TO GET READY FOR THIS WEEK

SOCIAL: PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION (15 MINUTES)

Welcome kids and spend time engaging in conversation and catching up. Get ready to experience today's story. **(Choose one or both of these activities.)**

1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED:

- An offering container
- A die

2. OPENING ACTIVITY

Made to Move: an activity that increases the oxygen in the brain and taps into the energy in the body

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Sticker name tags; one for each kid Note: Your church may provide name tags with your checkin system, and you can certainly use those. But it would be ideal if the kids had name tags that are large enough for all the kids to read them from a few feet away.
- A marker
- A playground ball

*2. POM POM BUDDIES [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

Made to Create: an activity that explores ideas through the process of drawing, building, designing, and problem-solving WHAT YOU NEED:

- One-inch pom poms; two for each kid
- Mini pom poms (ideally a different color than the oneinch); two for each kid
- White school glue
- Googly eyes; four for each kid
- Heart foam stickers; two for each kid
- A small envelope or a piece of paper; one for each kid
- Clear tape
- Crayons or markers

3. A FRIEND LOVES AT ALL TIMES [HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

Made to Move: an activity that increases the oxygen in the brain and taps into the energy in the body

- WHAT YOU NEED:
- Colored Paper; 12 pieces for each group
- Markers

4. PRAY AND DISMISS

[PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

Made to Reflect: an activity that creates space for personal processing and application
