PRELUDE SOCIAL STORY WORSHIP GROUPS

PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION
15 MINUTES

MADE TO PLAY

an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and/or working as a group

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Before kids arrive, take some time to pray that your kids would be able to grasp the forgiveness that God offers all of us and how forgiveness is a really big part of being a good friend. Pray that you would have an amazing time together with your kids today.

1. JUST FOR FUN

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, gift boxes, wrapping paper, tape, scissors, and ribbon

WHAT YOU DO:

- It's our last day prepping for the block party . . . everyone's invited! And we're down to the last thing on our list: the gift.
- Have a contest to see who can wrap the gift the quickest AND the prettiest.
- **Divide** the group in half (or groups of three) and give each group a gift box and supplies.
- Say "Go!" and let them start wrapping!
- Declare the first group finished the winner of the "time" challenge.
- **Decide,** as a group, which gift looks the best!

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Limbo stick or limbo rope, music (try Orange Kids Music on Spotify or Apple Music)

WHAT YOU DO:

- Play limbo!
- **Pick** two people to hold the stick/rope (one of them can be you!) and ask everyone else to get in line.
- When the music starts, they attempt to pass under the bar.
- After everyone in the line has had a turn, the bar is lowered an inch or two and the process repeats.
- When passing under the bar, players must bend backwards. No part of their bodies may touch the bar, and no part other than their feet may touch the ground.
- The last person left is the winner!
- Play a few more rounds, as time allows.
- Ask:
 - When does limbo get hard? (when the bar gets low)
 - When that happens, does the game get more exciting? (yes!) Why?

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Speaking of hard, we've been talking all month about friendship and sometimes friendship gets hard too, don't you think? [Transition] Today in large group, we're going to hear about a friendship that got really tough—and then the thing that helped it grow stronger! Let's go check it out."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

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1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Chairs or placeholders (like cardstock taped to the floor)

WHAT YOU DO:

• Talk about apologizing. How does it lead to forgiveness?

Why is apologizing hard?

- Introduce the four easy steps for an apology. Keep these steps nearby so kids can see it and refer back to it if necessary.
 - 1) I'm sorry for . . .
 - 2) It was wrong because . . .
 - 3) Next time I will . . .
 - 4) Will you forgive me?
- Give each kid a number, one through four, and then tell them to get in a group with their number. (All the ones together, all the twos together, all the threes together, and all the fours together.)
- **Explain** that their group number corresponds with a step for apologizing.
 - As a group, they need to come up with a simple hand signal for their
 - For instance, the ones might make a sad face and put their hand over their heart.
 - The twos might give a double thumbs down, the threes might point to their watch, and the fours might put their hands out and shrug their shoulders like they're asking a question.
 - Each group can pick their own sign, but it needs to be quick a simple.
- Give kids a couple minutes to confer with each other and figure out their hand signal.
- Let them then take turns teaching their sign to the rest of the groups.
- Set chairs in a circle or hand everyone a sheet of cardstock to mark their place in the circle. (Instruct kids to sit down.)
- **Pick** one person to go first and stand in the center of the circle.
- **Remove** that person's chair or placeholder and instruct the rest of the kids scoot around to fill in the space.
- Play a game similar to Fruit Basket Turnover.
 - The kid in the middle makes any of the four hand signals and says the corresponding phrase. (They can refer to the list if needed.)
 - Anyone who has that same signal/phrase shouts out their phrase and races to find another spot in the circle.
 - BUT the person in the center will be racing to find a spot as well, so someone will be left in the center.
 - Now it's their turn to make a hand signal, which will be the cue for that group to shout their phrase and race to change spots.
 - Play a few rounds.

2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: Two sets of 21 clear cups, two rolls of tape, "Jesus Forgives Peter Cards" Activity Page, and Bibles

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WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide your group into two teams.
- **Give** each team a set of 21 cups, a roll of tape, "Jesus Forgives Peter" cards, and a Bible.
- **Explain** that they need to race to be the first team to tape a card to each cup, and then stack them in order of the Bible story.
 - Let them refer to their Bibles to make sure they get the order of the verses right.
 - Note: The very top cup will actually be what happened first, the second row will be cards 2-3, the third row will be cards 4-6, the fourth row, 7-10, etc. There will be 6 total rows when stacked correctly.
 - The first team to finish with the cups in the correct order wins!
- Pick a few volunteers to read the stacked cups aloud to the group.
- **Ask** if anyone wants to share their favorite part of today's Bible story.
 - What does it say about their friendship that Jesus forgave Peter for something so huge?

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3. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO: Ask:

• Have you ever had to forgive a friend? What happened? (Make sure kids know not to mention any names or identifying details!)

- Have you ever had to ask for forgiveness from a friend? How did it feel?
- How can you show forgiveness to a friend beyond just accepting their apology?
- What do you do when you forgive a friend but they keep hurting you in the same way? (You can forgive, while also remembering week one: choose your friends carefully. If someone keeps showing you that they're not a good friend, or are bad for you, you can choose wisely about the time you spend with them and ask an adult you trust for advice and help. BUT we should always offer forgiveness.)

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4. VERSE TO TAKE WITH YOU [HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Envelope of puzzle pieces, pens or pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

• **Explain** that you have the pieces to a treasure map, but they are going to have to work to earn each piece!

- **Invite** kids to complete a task (listed below) and then hand them a piece of the puzzle.
- Let them use their Bibles and work together to fill in the blanks.
- **Instruct** kids to make sure everyone gets a chance to participate and fill in a blank and look up a verse.
 - Keep letting kids complete a task (together) and receive a puzzle piece until they have all six pieces complete, and then they can put the puzzle together.
 - NOTE: You can give them the pieces in any order, EXCEPT for the 8th piece (the one that starts with "Just like Jesus ..."). Save that piece for last!
- Tasks to earn a puzzle piece:
 - Make a human pyramid (just three people per pyramid)
 - Everyone says the alphabet backwards together
 - Sing a song
 - Say three nursery rhymes
 - Crab walk to the far side of the room and back
 - Everyone stands on one foot and pats their head for 30 seconds
 - Do 15 jumping jacks
- Answer for piece 8: Just like Jesus FORGAVE Peter, we should FORGIVE our friends too. Just like God sent Jesus to FORGIVE us, we should FORGIVE others.
- Wrap up discussion questions:
 - What makes it hard to forgive your friends sometimes?
 - Why do you think forgiveness is such a big deal in our friendships?

TODAY'S BIBLE STORY

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5. MAKE IT PERSONAL WITH PRAYER [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Verse Puzzle" activity page, pens or pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid an intact Verse Puzzle.
- **Allow** a few minutes for kids to fill in the blanks on their own puzzle, using the puzzle pieces from the Verse activity (above) if needed.
- **Tell** the kids that you COMPLETELY understand that forgiveness can be so hard and we definitely shouldn't let friends continue to hurt us. But friends forgive one another, even when it's hard.
- Pray over your group, asking God for help forgiving:
 - "Dear God, thank you so much for your gift of forgiveness. Thank you for preserving the story of how Jesus forgave Peter so we could learn from it. And we thank You so much for forgiving us. Thank you for loving us no matter what. Please give us the courage to ask for forgiveness when we hurt others or upset them, and give us the courage and love to forgive others, too, when they hurt us. We praise you for the freedom that comes with forgiveness. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen!"
- **Encourage** kids to find a place to display their puzzle at home for the next couple of weeks.
- **Suggest** that they look at one verse each day and think about that verse as they interact with friends.
