PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION
15 MINUTES

MADE TO CONNECT

an activity that invites kids to share and collaborate with others while growing their understanding



Before kids arrive, pray that your group would connect with the idea of joy despite what is going on in their lives that is really difficult. Lift up in prayer specific kids in your group that you know are having a hard time finding joy in this season. Pray that each one would see how God has a plan for each one of them—a good plan!

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1. JUST FOR FUN

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, paper, markers, (optional) Suggested Christmas treat: candy canes

WHAT YOU DO:

- All month long, we'll be having Christmas Chats!
- **Hand** out the optional Christmas snack and provide paper and markers for anyone who wants to draw while the group is chatting.
- Today's Christmas Chat:
 - What is joy?
 - What brings you joy at Christmas?
 - What makes a Christmas joyful?
 - Are you having a joyful Christmas season so far?

MADE TO MOVE

an activity that increases the oxygen in the brain and taps into the energy in the body

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Wide craft sticks, small jingle bells, timer or stopwatch

WHAT YOU DO:

- **Set** out a few bowls of small jingle bells and hand everyone a craft stick.
- **Ask** them to gather around a bowl—a couple kids per bowl—and put the craft stick in their mouth.
- **Tell** them that when you start the timer, they will have one minute to balance as many jingle bells on the craft stick as possible, while the craft stick remains in their mouth.
- If time allows, **repeat** the game another time or have the top three or four compete for the championship.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Last week we talked about an Old Testament promise from God that He would send a Savior. And today, the story picks up in the New Testament of the Bible, hundreds of years later. [Transition] I can't wait to hear what's next. Let's go to Large Group to see what's next."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.







CREATING A SAFE PLACE TO CONNECT
25 MINUTES

MADE TO EXPLORE

an activity that extends learning through hands-on experimentation and discovery

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1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Tissue paper, carrot, black buttons (or something to be snowman eyes), hat, gift box, wrapping paper, tape and scissors, paper, pens

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide your group into two teams.
- Assign one team the task of "building a snowman" and the other team "wrapping a present."
- Each group will prepare a how-to presentation for their assigned task and write down a list of instructions.
- When the instructions are finished, each team will try to complete the other team's task, using only their instructions.
- Hand out the paper and pens.
- Give teams a few minutes to write out a plan.
- As they work, remind kids to think about exactly how to complete the task; they won't be able to add any details or give any verbal instructions while the other team uses the written instructions.
- **Allow** them to touch and hold the supplies as they figure out what they think will work, but instruct kids not to "use" the supplies, as they'll be needed by the other team.
- When everyone is finished, let teams trade instructions.
- **Set** out the supplies (white tissue paper, carrot, black buttons, and hat for the snowman; gift box, wrapping paper, tape, and scissors for the gift wrapping) and **challenge** kids to follow the instructions exactly as they're written.
- At the end, ask:
 - Who was able to accomplish the task with the instructions exactly as they were written out?
 - Were there any crucial steps left out?
 - Was the plan important? Why or why not?

MADE TO CREATE

an activity that explores ideas through the process of drawing, building, designing, and problem-solving

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2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: Bibles, selected building supplies

WHAT YOU DO:

- Each week for the remainder of the month, you will read the Bible story together as a group and then build the scene based on only what you hear in the Bible.
- **Instruct** kids not to add details they've heard from movies or books. This project should only reflect the story as it's told in the Book of Luke.
- Today the main characters and details are the angel (Gabriel) talking to Mary, and then Mary going to visit cousin Elizabeth (also pregnant), inside Elizabeth's home for three months.
- Open the Bibles and take turns reading from the passage: Luke 1:26-56
- Briefly **discuss** the main points and people in the story and then let kids start building.
- **Guide** them to make sure everyone gets to participate and contribute.
- If you have a larger group, you may want to consider letting kids split into two groups and build two scenes.
- Ideally, you will leave this scene set up from week to week so kids can see the progress of the story throughout the rest of the month. If that's not possible, break it down gently so that it can be set back up and re-used next week.

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3. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

Ask:

- What are your family's plans for Christmas?
- Do you like having set plans, loose plans, or no plans? (Ask kids to elaborate on their responses.)
- How was Jesus a part of God's plan all along?
- What does it mean to you to know that God sent Jesus for you? How does it make you feel?

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4. VERSE TO TAKE WITH YOU [HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Joy Memory Verse Cards" Activity Page, hole punch, ornament hooks, Bibles, markers, butcher paper Christmas tree from week 1

WHAT YOU DO:

- Lay all the verse cards out in front of your group.
- Pass out Bibles and ask for volunteers to look up and read the verses.
- Ask: What's the reason for JOY according to this verse?
 - Guide kids to work together to condense their answer to one word or phrase
 - Let one person write it on the card. (They can decorate the card, too, if they would like.)
- Then **hand** the card to another person to punch a hole, **add** the hook, and **hang** the card on the paper Christmas tree on the wall from last week.

Note: Below are the potential answer to the question, but there really is no right or wrong answer. The goal is to let kids work together as a group to think critically about what the verse means to them.

Luke 2:10-11

What's the reason for JOY according to this verse? Our Savior

Psalm 33:21

What's the reason for JOY according to this verse? We can trust Him (Overflowing with hope, NIV)

Romans 15:13

What's the reason for JOY according to this verse? We're filled with hope

Matthew 1:21

What's the reason for JOY according to this verse? Jesus saved us (Jesus saved us from our sins, NIV)

John 3:16

What's the reason for JOY according to this verse? Eternal life

1 Samuel 2:1

What's the reason for JOY according to this verse? Strength (Deliverance, NIV)

MADE TO REFLECT

an activity that creates space for personal processing and application

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5. MAKE IT PERSONAL WITH PRAYER [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Prayer JOY Die" Activity Page

WHAT YOU DO:

- **Tell** your group that you're going to end your "JOY"-filled day by praying together with the J-O-Y acronym.
- **Show** them the die and **explain** that everyone will get a chance to roll, and they'll pray aloud (a one sentence prayer) based on what letter they land on. Note: If anyone is uncomfortable praying aloud, encourage them to be brave and do it anyway, but don't force kids to pray aloud.
 - J- Jesus- thank God for Jesus, our Savior
 - O- others- pray for someone else in need or thank God for someone special in your life
 - Y- yourself- thank God for His plan for your life or something specific you want to praise Him for
- **Give** everyone a chance to roll and pray, then **close** by praying aloud over the whole group:

Dear God, thank You so much for the joy we have in You this Christmas season and always! Thank You for sending Jesus for us—we needed a Savior, and You gave us Jesus! I thank You for each kid sitting here today—they are all special to me and even more so to You. Thank You for how You made them each special and beautiful and smart and funny! We praise You for the plan You have for us and that we can trust You no matter what. It's in Jesus' name we pray, Amen!
