MADE TO CREATE

an activity that explores ideas through the process of drawing, building, designing, and problem-solving



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1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, hand sanitizer, Mad Libs[®], and pencil or pen

Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them.

Ask God to guide kids to have self-control when it comes to their words, and to use them wisely. Pray that kids would

see that the words they use can be stewarded for good or

they can be weapons to hurt others or to get our own way.

Pray that they would use their words to build others up and

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite kids to place their offerings in the container and guide them to apply hand sanitizer.
- Ask kids to provide words to fill in the blanks for your Mad Lib.

show them God's love.

- Be sure to explain noun, adjective, verb, and other words your kids may not be all that familiar with.
- Read the story aloud.

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

- Lead kids to sit in a circle.
- Begin a story with the line: Once upon a time there was (name something interesting to your group such as a happy horse, or a little dinescur)
- small snowman, a happy horse, or a little dinosaur).
- Going around the circle, lead kids to take turns adding a line to the story. If kids get stuck, ask guiding questions to spark ideas. You might ask: What did they do? Where did they go? How did they feel?

WHAT YOU SAY:

"You used words to make a great story! [Transition] Let's go to Large Group to learn how GOD wants us to use our words. Let's go learn more."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

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*1. BUILD UP!

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW] WHAT YOU NEED: "Build Up!" Activity Page, hand sanitizer, building items

WHAT YOU DO:

- Help kids apply hand sanitizer.
- Guide kids to get into groups of two or three.
- Give each team a set of building materials and a deck of "Build Up!" cards. Instruct kids to set the cards facedown.
- Lead kids to take turns drawing a card from the stack, reading the words, and either "building up" a tower or "tearing down" a tower depending on the card drawn.
 - If they draw a green speech bubble, kids gather the number of items shown and "build up" their tower.
 - If they draw a red speech bubble, they remove that number of items to "tear down" their tower.
- The game ends when kids use all their items to build their tower.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Our words have a lot of power. They can either build others up or tear them down. What does it mean to build others up? (to make them feel good; to say kind things) What does it mean to tear others down? (to say mean things, to not be nice) What kind of words does God want us to use? (words that build others up; words that are kind, nice, and helpful) Yes! Paul said, Say only what will help to build others up and meet their needs. Then what you say will help those who listen. (Ephesians 4:29, NIrV)

[Make It Personal] (Tell kids about a time when the words you used built someone up. It may have been a word of encouragement for someone who was sad, a card you sent to congratulate someone, or a time you chose to say something kind instead of something mean to a sibling.)

"So what are some words that YOU can say this week that will build others up? (I love you; you did a great job; thank you. Encourage responses by saying things like: Great answer! Good thinking! Ooh, I hadn't thought of that! What else?) So, this week, be responsible and choose words that will build up and help the people around you. You can **use your words wisely.**"

2. KIND WORDS

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Dry erase board and marker or butcher paper and marker, mugs or cups with shreds or crumpled scraps of brown paper, and marshmallows

WHAT YOU DO:

- Draw a large speech bubble on your white board or paper.
- Lead kids to brainstorm kind and helpful words they can say to others. Print their ideas on the board/paper.
- If kids are stuck for ideas, ask prompting questions like: What's something kind that you can say to your brother or sister? Your grandma or grandpa? Someone who's sad? Someone who needs help?
- Guide kids to get into groups of two or three.
- Give each group a set of six cups and each kid two or three marshmallows.
- Lead kids to arrange the cups in a triangular formation like bowling pins.
- Direct kids to stand a few feet from their cups and take turns attempting to toss a marshmallow into each cup.
- Give kids as many chances as they need to be successful.
- Before every toss, kids should say something kind or helpful.

NOTE: Adjust the game's difficulty by changing the distance kids stand from the cups.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Paul wanted to remind the Ephesians what God had done for them and how it should change the way they treated others—especially when it came to their words! He wanted to remind them that since God has been kind to them, they should be kind to others. Paul said, Say only what will help to build others up and meet their needs. Then what you say will help those who listen. (Ephesians 4:29, NIrV)

"God wants us to be responsible and say words that will build up and help the people around us. Because when our words are kind and helpful, they're like a warm mug of hot cocoa on a cold day. So this week, remember to **use your words wisely.**"

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3. USE YOUR WORDS WISELY

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Gameboard" and Wise Words" Activity Pages, Bible marked at Luke 16, dice, tokens

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite a volunteer to open the Bible where marked.
- Read the verse aloud, encouraging kids to say it with you.
- Help kids get into groups of two or three.
- Give each group a "Gameboard," a deck of "Wise Words" cards, a die, and one token for each kid.
- Direct kids to place their token at START and set the "Wise Words" cards face down.
- Lead kids to take turns rolling the die and moving the appropriate number of spaces. If kids land on a heart, they draw a card from the "Wise Words" stack, look at it, and tell something kind they could say to the person in the scenario. Provide help as needed.
- Play continues until every kid reaches FINISH.

NOTE: If a team uses all of its "Wise Words" cards before each player reaches FINISH, have them shuffle the cards and use them again.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Our verse tells us that when we can be trusted with something little, then we can also be trusted with something large. One small way that we can show responsibility is by using our words wisely. What are some words that are wise to use? (*Thank you*, *I love you*, *please*, *great job*, *are you okay*) Great ideas! Every day we can choose the words we say. God wants us to choose words that will build up and help the people around us. So remember to **use your words wisely.**"

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4. PRAY AND DISMISS

[PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Speech Bubbles" Activity Page and pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

• Invite kids to tell some kind and helpful things that they

can say.

- Give each kid a "Speech Bubble" and a pencil.
- Guide kids to choose one kind thing they can say this week and write it on the card.

NOTE: It's okay for kids to use "inventive" spelling. The fact that your emergent spellers are engaging in critical thinking and taking risks as they explore sound and letter relationships is a valuable part of their literacy journey and helps facilitate future reading success.

- Encourage kids to put their "Speech Bubble" cards where they'll see them often and be reminded to use their words wisely.
- Use the conversation below as a guide to lead kids in prayer.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Paul wanted to remind the Ephesians what God had done for them, and how it should change the way they treated each other—especially when it came to their words! Our words have a lot of power, and we have the responsibility to choose words that build up and help the people around us. So let's ask God to help us use our words wisely. Let's pray.

"Dear God, thank You so much that all of Your words are trustworthy and true. Help us show others what You're like by saying words that build up and help the people around us. Help us say words like (*restate what kids wrote on their speech bubbles*). And when we make mistakes with our words, please help us be quick to say, 'I'm sorry. Will you forgive me?' Thank You for loving us so much, God. We love You, too. Amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, encourage kids to show parents their speech bubbles and tell parents the kind words they can say this week.
