PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION
15 MINUTES

MADE TO CONNECT

an activity that invites kids to share and collaborate with others while growing their understanding



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Before kids arrive, take a few moments to pray for them. Thank God for always being with us, especially when we're in phases of waiting. Ask Him to give your kids patience as they wait for "normal" life to return. (Ask Him to do the same for you, too!) For kids in situations where they're waiting for something big (a job for a parent, the healing of an ill family member), ask God to make His

presence known in those kids' hearts. Thank Him for being a God who always keeps His promises!

1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, hand sanitizer, (optional) phone

WHAT YOU DO:

- Welcome kids by name as they arrive.
- Invite kids to use one pump of hand sanitizer.
- If a kid brought an offering, direct them to the offering container.
- Tell the kids that you will ask a question, and they should think silently about their answer but not share it out loud.
- Ask, "When is it hard to wait?"
- Give each kid a chance to act-out when it's hard to wait.
- Instruct the other kids to guess what the kid is acting out.
- If the kids have a hard time coming up with ideas, pull an image on your phone of people waiting—like waiting for Christmas morning, a very pregnant woman waiting for a new baby, waiting for summer break.

TODAY'S BIBLE STORY

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Boxes, wrapping paper, scissors, tape, tissue paper, streamers, stickers, pipe cleaners, foam, construction paper, glue, (optional) additional supplies to make a "cake"

WHAT YOU DO:

- Make a pile of all the supplies within the reach of the kids.
- Instruct the kids to work together to build a cake.
- Let the kids know that they will compete to see which group can make the best cake.
 - If you have more than one small group in the room, hold a contest between all the cakes.
 - If you have one small group and one cake, "judge" the cake while using your best food critic voice. For example:
 - "Very great shape and colors, but it is a little lopsided."
 - "This is the best design I've seen in years."
 - "It is a very creative cake, but how does it taste?"

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Those are great cakes! Maybe you should all go into the baking business. What do you think? I bet it would take a LONG time for some of those cakes to bake! Some of them are huge! We'd wait forever! [Transition] Let's go to Large Group to hear about someone else who waited a long, long time for something."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

BASIC TRUTH

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*1. WAIT, WAIT, GO! [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: Bibles

WHAT YOU DO:

- Look up Luke 2:25-32.
- Invite a few kids to take turns reading the passage out

loud, switching readers every couple of sentences.

- Ask:
 - In our Bible story, who was waiting?
 - What was he waiting for?
 - How long did he have to wait?
 - What did he do when the wait was over?
 - How do you think he felt once he could finally stop waiting?
- Instruct the kids to spread out and sit in a circle on the floor.
- Explain that you will play a version of "Duck, Duck, Goose," but it's called "Wait, Wait, Go!"
- Direct all the kids to sit in a circle.
- Choose one kid to be the first tagger.
- Instruct that kid to walk around the circle, tapping each kid on the head and saying "wait" until they tap a kid and say, "Go!"
- The kid who is tagged on "go" runs after the tagger and tries to tag them before they can take their seat.
- Whoever is left standing is the new tagger.
- Play as long as you have time to let as many kids as possible be the tagger.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"I don't usually like waiting. Do you? (Pause for responses.) Was it hard to wait for your turn? (Pause for responses.) It can be really hard to wait, especially for something we really look forward to or when something is hard. No matter what it is you have to wait for, God is always with you. You can trust Him while you wait, just like Simeon did in our Bible story. When you have to wait, remember God is with you. Just like Simeon, we can have patience and wait, because we know God is in control and His plan for us is good."

BASIC TRUTH

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2. THE PATIENCE GRID [LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Patience Grid" Activity Page, game tokens

WHAT YOU DO:

- Lay the "Patience Grid" in the middle of the group.
- Give each kid a game token.
- Show the kids that the top row of ten spaces on the "Patience Grid" is the start line.
- Instruct each kid to put their token in a square on the start line.
- Explain that you will read a situation out loud.
- Anyone who thinks it would be hard to wait in that scenario moves their token forward one block toward the finish line.
- As you read each situation, kids should move forward one block if that would be a hard situation for them to wait.
- Example situations (add any that are relevant and applicable for your kids, such as waiting for a local sports team to win a championship or waiting for a particular bus or train):
 - waiting for Christmas morning
 - waiting for your birthday party to start
 - waiting for a movie to come out
 - waiting for a special gift to arrive in the mail
 - waiting for your sister to get out of the bathroom
 - waiting for your dad to get home from work
 - waiting for your grandparents to arrive for a visit
 - waiting for your turn on a video game
 - waiting for your friends to be ready to play
 - waiting for your mom to be done with her work call
 - waiting for your teacher to answer your question
 - waiting for the cookies to cool so you can eat them
 - waiting for your favorite dinner to be ready
 - waiting for your favorite shirt or blanket to get out of the laundry

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Let's see who won! All right, who is closest to the . . . START line? Because that's our winner! That's right, [kid's name] wins because they are practicing being patient. [Make it Personal] (Share a situation when you have a hard time waiting.)

"And in more serious situations, waiting can be hard and scary. When you have to wait, remember God is with you. When I remember that God is with me, it helps me wait. I know that I'm not alone, and I always have someone I can talk to!"

WHAT YOU NEED: Bibles, dictionary, paper strips, and markers

WHAT YOU DO:

• Ask everyone to open their Bibles to Psalm 27:14.

BASIC TRUTH

I can trust God no matter what.

Finding verses with 2nd and 3rd graders: Guide them to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like.) When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find Psalms in the list under "Old Testament." When the kids find Psalms, lead them to look at the page number beside the word. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find Psalms. Help the kids find the page. When they find Psalms, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find chapter 27. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find verse 14 in chapter 27.

- Read the verse together several times. First, read it out loud and direct the kids to repeat the words after you read them. Then ask the kids to recite it on their own.
- Give a sentence strip and a marker to one kid.
- Invite another kid to look up "wait" in the dictionary.
- Instruct the kid to read the definition of "wait" out loud, while the other kid writes it on a sentence strip.
- Repeat the process with "hope" and two other kids.
- Place the sentence strips where everyone can see them.
- Ask the group, "What is this month's memory verse telling us to do? Why?"
- Prompt the group to work together to make up hand motions to help them memorize the verse.
- If needed, here are some ideas to get started:
 - Wait—point to a pretend watch.
 - For—hold up four fingers.
 - The Lord—point to heaven.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"This verse tells us something very important—not to lose hope. It would have been easy for Simeon to lose hope since he waited for so long! But you know what? When we trust God with our future, like Simeon did, we can wait. When we trust that God always keeps His promises, and we KNOW that He is with us, it makes the wait more bearable. When you have to wait, remember God is with you."

4. PRAY AND DISMISS [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Prayer" Activity Page

WHAT YOU DO:

- Ask the kids to sit in a circle.
- Encourage the kids to think back to how they tried to remember things when they were "little."
- Remind them of how hard they worked to remember things like the ABCs, shapes, colors, and how to count to 20.
- Point out that now that they know all of those things, they can remember them easily because they practiced them over and over.
- Remembering that God is with us when we wait is something that we can practice—just like we practiced until we learned our ABCs.
- Pick a kid to go first and hand them the "Prayer" Activity Page.
- Ask them to read the statement out loud, filling in the blank with their own example. "Dear God, when I have to wait for ______, help me remember that You are with me."
- Direct the kid to pass it to the next kid. Continue until everyone in the group has had the opportunity to share.
- Close the activity out with your own prayer for the group.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"God, we know that You are always with us, but when things get tough and our patience is tested, we can forget that You're there. When we're waiting for (insert a few of the things the kids named), help us remember that You are with us and will help us have patience. Thank You, God, for being with us and never leaving us. We love You. In Jesus' name we pray, amen.

"Today was a great day. I really loved being with you and learning about God and His Word. You guys are so fun! This week, remember that when you have to wait, God is with you! Let's say it together one last time. When you have to wait, remember God is with you."

As adults arrive to pick up, ask the kids to tell them what we can do when we wait.
